Recommendation for Approval to Establish a Prequalification Pool for Well Drilling

Services

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the establishment of a prequalification pool, *RTQ-01055*, *Well Drilling Services*, for multiple County departments. The current pool, 6969-0/14, was approved by the Mayor on April 23, 2012 for a two-year term. The pool was subsequently modified by the Board through Resolution No. R-944-13 for additional allocation and through Resolution No. R-327-14 for an additional five-year term and additional allocation. The pool has 12 vendors, of which five have local addresses and one is a certified Small Business Enterprise.

The replacement pool will provide for the purchase of well drilling services along the Biscayne Aquifer and within jurisdictional wetlands for multiple County departments. The original solicitation included two groups: 1) Well Drilling Services, and 2) Geophysical Studies. The County will not utilize Group 2, which will be handled in accordance with the Consultants Competitive Negotiations Act and Section 2-10.4 of the County Code.

Services will include the installation of monitoring wells, refurbishment and development of wells, well abandonment tasks, and other related needs. Monitoring wells are used for groundwater quality testing, saltwater intrusion monitoring, measuring water levels, and as a mechanism to abate and close abandoned wells. Groundwater monitoring is an important component in the protection of our drinking water supply as it establishes baseline water quality of the aquifer system, identifies trends in groundwater quality, and detects anti-predicts changes in groundwater quality resulting from the effects of various land use activities or contamination.

Eight vendors responded to the solicitation, including one "No Bid." Three vendors are being recommended for inclusion in the pool for Group 1, of which two have local addresses. Upon advertisement, 8,367 vendors were notified. The pool will remain open to allow additional vendors that meet the pregualification criteria to be added.

The requested allocation will be utilized as enumerated below.

- 1) The Internal Services Department is requesting \$100,000 to purchase well drilling services in order to repair existing wells or to open new wells for the irrigation systems at County facilities.
- 2) The Parks, Recreation, and Open Spaces Department is requesting \$16,000 to purchase well drilling services for emergency or unforeseen instances. Several parks use well water for their domestic water supply with geothermal pool heaters at West Perrine, Tamiami, and South Dade Pools.
- 3) The Regulatory and Economic Resources Department is requesting \$125,000 to purchase well drilling, maintenance, repair, installation, and/or abandonment of monitoring wells used for the ambient monitoring program, wellfield protection monitoring program, and saltwater intrusion monitoring program.

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- 4) The Department of Solid Waste Management is requesting \$8,000 to purchase well drilling and monitoring services on an as needed basis.
- 5) The Department of Transportation and Public Works is requesting \$150,000 to purchase cleaning of drainage wells throughout Miami-Dade County when their performance is impacted. The drainage wells are underground structures that dispose unwanted water from parking lots, roads, buildings, roofs and bridges.
- 6) The Water and Sewer Department is requesting \$2,344,000 to purchase well drilling services to develop new wells, maintain or retrofit existing wells, and/or close abandoned wells along the Biscayne Aquifer and in jurisdictional wetlands.

Scope .

The scope of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the five-year term is \$2,743,000. The current pool, 6969-0/14, is valued at \$4,518,821 for a seven-year and three-month term, and expires on August 31, 2019. The allocation under this replacement pool is lower than the previous pool and is based on estimated usage and projections for future capital projects anticipated during the term.

Jessica Tyrrell of the Internal Services Department is the Procurement Contracting Manager.

Delegated Authority

Upon approval of this item, a pool of prequalified vendors will be established to participate in spot market competitions. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will have the authority to solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate amount of the allocation authorized by the Board. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will also have the authority to (a) exercise all provisions of the solicitation documents and any resulting contracts pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38 and (b) add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis.

Vendors Prequalified for Pool

A solicitation was advertised under full and open competition. Eight vendors responded to the solicitation, including one "No Bid." Three vendors are being recommended for inclusion in the pool as set forth in the table below.

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Pursuant to disclosure requirements in Resolution No. R-477-18, fewer than 75 percent of vendors recommended are local due to a diminished market. Additional outreach is being conducted to obtain outstanding pregualification documents from the remaining four vendors.

<u>Due Diligence</u>

Pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12, due diligence was conducted in accordance with the Internal Services Department's Procurement Guidelines to determine vendor responsibility, including verifying corporate status and that there are no performance or compliance issues through various vendor responsibility lists and a keyword internet search. The lists that were referenced included convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to vendor responsibility.

Pursuant to Resolution No. R-140-14, prior to the re-procurement of the replacement pool, a full review of the scope of services was conducted to ensure the replacement pool reflects the County's current needs. The review included conducting market research, posting a draft solicitation for industry comment, and holding meetings and drafting sessions with the user departments.

Applicable Ordinances and Contract Measures

- The two percent User Access Program provision applies where permitted by the funding source.
- The Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Bid Preference and Local Preference will be applied at the time of spot market competition where permitted by the funding source. An SBE set-aside applies for spot market competition up to \$100,000 where permitted by the funding source when there are three or more SBE-certified firms available.
- The Living Wage does not apply.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING **ESTABLISHMENT** OF PREQUALIFICATION POOL RTQ-01055 IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$2,743,000.00 FOR THE PURCHASE OF WELL DRILLING SERVICES FOR MULTIPLE COUNTY DEPARTMENTS FOR Α FIVE-YEAR TERM: AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO SOLICIT PRICING, AWARD CONTRACTS, EXERCISE ALL PROVISIONS OF THE SOLICITATION DOCUMENTS AND ANY RESULTING CONTRACTS PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-8.1 OF THE CODE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA IMPLEMENTING ORDER 3-38, AND ADD VENDORS TO THE POOL AT ANY TIME, SUBJECT TO RATIFICATION BY THE **BOARD ON A BI-ANNUAL BASIS**

WHEREAS, WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board authorizes the establishment of prequalification pool RTQ-01055 for the purchase of well drilling services for multiple County departments in a total amount up to \$2,743,000.00 for a five-year term; and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to (a) solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate amount of the allocation authorized by the Board, (b) exercise all provisions of the solicitation documents and any resulting contracts pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida and Implementing Order 3-38, and (c) add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis. A copy of the solicitation document and resulting contracts are on file and available upon request from the Internal Services Department, Strategic Procurement Division.
