RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO STUDY AND RECOMMEND NECESSARY STEPS TO IMPLEMENT AN URBAN LIGHTING PROGRAM TO ALLOW BUILDINGS TO BE ILLUMINATED WITH INTERACTIVE DIGITAL ART DISPLAYS; AND TO REPORT TO THE BOARD REGARDING SAME WITHIN 120 DAYS

WHEREAS, major metropolitan areas around the world, such as Beijing and Chicago, have developed unique lighting systems to illuminate urban buildings with artwork and interactive digital art displays; and

WHEREAS, as a major metropolitan area and the gateway to Latin America and other international destinations, Miami-Dade County should also have a unique urban aesthetic; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to explore allowing more creative illumination of buildings in the County's densely populated and intensely developed urban centers, especially in the downtown Miami urban core, while protecting the aesthetics of the County's less intense bedroom communities >> and protecting residential buildings and adjacent streets in urban centers from any impacts of such illumination; and

WHEREAS, this Board also wishes to obtain recommendations on how to fund such programs on public buildings<<1,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board hereby directs

the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee to study and >>recommend << [[take all]] necessary steps to implement an urban lighting program to allow for illumination of buildings with artwork, interactive digital art displays, or other creative forms of illumination in the County's densely populated and intensely developed urban areas, including expediting the use of County facilities such as the Stephen P. Clark Center for this purpose, coordinating with the City of Miami and Florida Power and Light, and seeking sponsorship for any necessary amendments to the CDMP or the zoning code, to report to this Board within 120 days of the effective date of this resolution, and to place the completed report on an agenda of the Board pursuant to Ordinance No. 14-65.
