Housing Initiatives Partnership (SHIP) Program Funding for Homebuyer Education

and Counseling

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the proposed funding recommendations in an amount up to \$400,000.00 for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2018 Supplemental Request for Applications (RFA) for the SHIP Program in the Homebuyer Education and Counseling category. Additionally, it is recommended that the Board authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute all letters of commitment, contracts, agreements, and amendments pursuant to the proposed SHIP funding recommendations.

#### Scope

This item has a countywide impact.

Fiscal Impact

The award of SHIP funds will not have a negative fiscal impact on the County's General Fund.

Track Record/Monitor

Michael Liu, Director of the Public Housing and Community Development Department (PHCD), will monitor all SHIP activities. PHCD will continue to monitor the projects to ensure compliance with State and County guidelines and policies.

Background

The RFA was made available on December 10, 2018, and applications were due by January 10, 2019. The public was advised of the application process through notice postings on PHCD's website, email distribution to all currently funded agencies and PHCD's Developer Contact email distribution list. All applications were reviewed and scored by an Evaluation/Selection Committee appointed by the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee. All applicants had the opportunity to discuss their scores with PHCD staff.

The RFA was issued with \$400,000.00 in available funding and required the application to have a minimum threshold score of 70 points to be recommended for funding. Four applications were submitted, with requests for funding totaling \$800,000.00 and the applications received scores ranging from 5 points to 97.6 points (Exhibit 1). Two applications, Real Estate Education and Community Housing, Inc. (REACH) and Centro Campesino-Farmworker Center, Inc., received the highest scores, and are recommended for full funding. The application submitted by the Cuban American National Council, Inc.,

received the third highest score, however, funding was exhausted by the first two highest ranking applications. As a result of not meeting the minimum score requirement, Foreclosure Forensics, LLC is not recommended for funding.

#### Funding Source

The Table below summarizes the proposed use of FY 2018 SHIP funding in this item:

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

- <u>Section 1</u>. This Board ratifies and adopts the matters set forth in the accompanying justification memorandum as if fully set forth herein.
- Section 2. This Board approves the proposed funding recommendations in the amount of \$400,000.00 in supplemental Fiscal Year 2018 State Housing Initiatives Partnership (SHIP) funds in the Request for Applications for Homebuyer Education and Counseling Services, as more fully described in the County Mayor's memorandum and incorporated by reference.
- Section 3. The County Mayor or County Mayor's designee is authorized to execute all standard shell contracts, amendments, standard shell documents and other agreements necessary to accomplish the purposes of this resolution and to exercise the cancellation and other provisions contained therein. All funding awards set forth herein are contingent upon availability of funding

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and

from the funding source or program and the recipient agency complying with the conditions set forth in this resolution and the justification memorandum. The Board further authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, upon a determination that such actions are in the best interest of the County, to modify the terms of contracts, agreements, amendments and documents so long as such modifications are approved by the County Attorney's Office and are not substantially inconsistent with this resolution and to exercise the termination, waiver, acceleration, or other provisions set forth therein.
