

**SUBJECT:** Resolution Retroactively Authorizing Extension of Interlocal Agreement between Miami-Dade County and the Village of Palmetto Bay for Local Police Patrol Services

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## Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board approve a 90-day extension to Interlocal Agreement between Miami-Dade County, by and through its police department, the Miami-Dade Police Department (MDPD), and the Village of Palmetto Bay, for the purpose of the provision of local police patrol services to the Village of Palmetto Bay, and authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute the extension.

## Scope

The extension will grant the (MDPD) and the Village of Palmetto Bay an additional 90 days in which a final contract for police services can be negotiated.

## Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Regular quarterly installments will continue to be made to Miami-Dade County in accordance with the proposed agreement.

## Track Record/Monitor

The extension for police services will be administered by Chief George A. Perez, of the MDPD's South Operations Division. Also, the extension will be monitored for fiscal compliance by Assistant Director Gustavo Knoepfler, of the MDPD's Departmental Services.

## Background

The MDPD provides local police patrol services upon request from various municipalities. These are comprehensive police patrol services which include enforcing the law, preventing and deterring crime, arresting criminal offenders, preventive and directive patrolling, maintaining public order, and providing services to the community. Activities may include directing and enforcing traffic laws, directing, controlling, and preventing traffic crashes, responding to emergency and non-emergency calls for service, conducting field interviews, arresting criminal offenders, issuing traffic citations, and reporting quality of life issues. Uniform staff will wear their MDPD uniforms with the addition of a distinctive patch identifying them as members of the municipal police force.

The existing Interlocal Agreement for police services between the MDPD and the Village of Palmetto Bay expired at midnight on July 1, 2019. Over the past few months, the MDPD and the Village of Palmetto Bay have participated in productive negotiation, but were unable to reach an agreement prior to the existing contract expiring. An additional 90 days would allow MDPD and the Village of Palmetto Bay ample time to reach an agreement on all outstanding contract provisions.

RESOLUTION RETROACTIVELY APPROVING A 90 DAY EXTENSION FROM JULY 1, 2019, THROUGH AND INCLUDING SEPTEMBER 29, 2019, FOR THE EXISTING INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, THROUGH THE MIAMI-DADE POLICE DEPARTMENT, AND THE VILLAGE OF PALMETTO BAY, FOR LOCAL POLICE PATROL SERVICES AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR THE COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE THE EXTENSION

**WHEREAS**, this Board, through Resolution No. R-513-14, authorized the execution of an Interlocal Agreement between Miami-Dade County (the County), through the Miami-Dade Police Department, and the Village of Palmetto Bay (the Village), for the provision of local police patrol services to the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, the Interlocal Agreement between the Village and the County provided for a five-year term, which expired on July 1, 2019; and

**WHEREAS**, the implementation of the Interlocal Agreement has been of mutual benefit to both the Village and the County; and

**WHEREAS**, both the Village and the County desire to renew the Agreement; and

**WHEREAS**, renewal discussions have been productive but certain details remain outstanding and additional time is needed to finalize those provisions,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that this Board retroactively approves a 90 day extension of the existing Interlocal Agreement between Miami-Dade County

and the Village of Palmetto Bay for 90 days, through and including September 29, 2019, and authorizes the County Mayor or the Mayor's designee to execute the 90 day extension to the Interlocal Agreement as provided herein.
