Recommendation for Approval to Establish a Pre-Qualification Pool for Hauling and

Disposal of Solid Waste

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the establishment of prequalification pool, *RTQ-01137*, *Hauling and Disposal of Solid Waste*, for the Department of Solid Waste Management (DSWM). DSWM requires the capability of hauling waste to other permitted disposal facilities in order to help preserve its landfill capacity. This prequalification pool will be utilized to obtain hauling and disposal services on an as needed basis.

It will be the responsibility of the vendor(s) to furnish all equipment, materials, labor, fuel, maintenance, repairs, insurance, license tags, current inspection stickers, permits, toll fees, licenses and incidentals necessary for the legal operation of tractor trailers that will haul solid waste from a County facility to a permitted disposal facility.

Scope

The scope of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the five-year term is \$37,400,000. It is estimated that 374,000 tons of solid waste will be hauled and disposed of on an annual basis. There is no current contract in place for these services.

Delegated Authority

Upon approval of this item, a pool of pre-qualified vendors will be established to participate in spot market competitions. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will have the authority to solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate amount of the allocation authorized by the Board. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will also have the authority to (a) exercise all provisions of the solicitation documents and any resulting contracts pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38 and (b) add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis.

Vendors Pre-Qualified for Pool

A Request to Qualify was advertised under full and open competition. Six vendors responded to the solicitation. One was a "No Bid" and three are being recommended for inclusion in the pool as set forth in the table below. Internal Services staff will continue to conduct outreach to encourage vendor

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participation, which will increase competition throughout the term of this pool. The pool will remain open to allow additional vendors that meet the prequalification criteria to be added throughout the term of the pool.

Due Diligence

Pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12, due diligence was conducted in accordance with the Internal Services Department's Procurement Guidelines to determine vendor responsibility, including verifying corporate status and confirming that there are no performance and compliance issues through various vendor responsibility lists and a keyword internet search. The lists that were referenced included convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to vendor responsibility.

Applicable Ordinances and Contract Measures

- The two (2) percent User Access Program provision applies where permitted by the funding source.
- The Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Bid Preference and Local Preference will be applied at the time of spot market competition where permitted by the funding source. An SBE set-aside applies for spot market competition up to \$100,000 where permitted by the funding source when there are three or more SBE-certified firms available.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING **ESTABLISHMENT** PREQUALIFICATION POOL RTQ-01137 IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$37,400,000.00 FOR THE PURCHASE OF HAULING AND DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTE FOR THE SOLID WASTE DEPARTMENT FOR A FIVE-YEAR TERM; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO SOLICIT PRICING, AWARD CONTRACTS, EXERCISE ALL PROVISIONS OF SOLICITATION DOCUMENTS AND ANY RESULTING CONTRACTS PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-8.1 OF THE CODE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY. **FLORIDA** IMPLEMENTING ORDER 3-38, AND ADD VENDORS TO THE POOL AT ANY TIME, SUBJECT TO RATIFICATION BY THE **BOARD ON A BI-ANNUAL BASIS**

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board authorizes the establishment of prequalification pool RTQ-01137 for the purchase of hauling and disposal of solid waste for the Solid Waste Department in a total amount up to \$37,400,000.00 for a five-year term; and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to (a) solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate amount of the allocation authorized by the Board, (b) exercise all provisions of the solicitation documents and any resulting contracts pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida and Implementing Order 3-38, and (c) add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis. A copy of the solicitation document and resulting contracts are on file and available upon request from the Internal Services Department, Strategic Procurement Division.
