Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) appoint Mr. Marc Ellenby as the South Dade Soil and Water Conservation District Representative to the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board as recommended by the South Dade Soil and Water Conservation District. Mr. Marc Ellenby meets the requirements under Section 2-11-38 of the Miami-Dade County Code regarding membership on boards. The term for this appointment begins upon the Board's approval and expires on December 31, 2022.

The recommendations and actions of the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board have a countywide impact.

The Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources, Planning Division, monitors the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board.

Background

The Agricultural Practices Advisory Board (APAB) consists of thirteen members representing a variety of agricultural industries. Section 2-935, of the Miami-Dade County Code, requires that the Board fill vacancies occurring on the APAB. Pursuant to Section 2-933 of the Code, each designated organization shall submit, for Board review, at least one nominee for their vacant position(s), including the nominee's resume and the minutes of the organization's meeting at which the nominee was selected. The required documentation for Mr. Ellenby is attached.

South Dade Soil and Water Conservation District Representative

Mr. Marc Ellenby was nominated by the South Dade Soil and Water Conservation District as its nominee due to the death of Mr. John DeMott. Mr. Ellenby is the owner and production manager of LNB Groves, Inc. of Homestead which has been in business since 1988. LNB Groves has extensive experience in tropical fruit tree production, bamboo cultivation and the marketing of fruits and live specimen bamboo plants. LNB Groves' home farm is USDA organic certified; the company has cultivated 50 acres of tropical clumping bamboo and 25 acres of fruit trees and perennial tropical crop production areas alongside a second growth forest in Belize, and has established ±1,900 acres of wildlife habitat in Belize. Mr. Ellenby received a Bachelor of Arts from the University of Illinois in 1974, later studied at Clemson University, and received a Master's Degree in Agriculture from the University of Florida in 1978.
