RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO ENACT SB 7016, HB 1073, OR SIMILAR LEGISLATION CREATING THE STATEWIDE SEA-LEVEL RISE TASK CODIFYING STATE LAW FORCE AND IN**ESTABLISHMENT** OF THE STATEWIDE OFFICE OF RESILIENCY

WHEREAS, given South Florida's low elevation, vast coastline, and proximity to the ocean, the region is considered particularly vulnerable to the effects of sea-level rise; and

WHEREAS, according to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), sea levels are projected to rise between 0.89 ft. and 2.89 ft. in coastal areas of Miami-Dade County by the year 2050; and

WHEREAS, the County has demonstrated leadership in addressing sea-level rise issues through the creation of the County Office of Resilience and County Sea-Level Rise Task Force; and

WHEREAS, this Board has adopted multiple resolutions to implement the County Sea-Level Rise Task Force's recommendations; and

WHEREAS, additionally, the County is a member of the Southeast Florida Climate Change Compact and a participant in the Rockefeller Foundation's 100 Resilient Cities Program; and

WHEREAS, SB 7016 and HB 1073 have been filed for consideration during the 2020 session of the Florida Legislature by the Senate Committee on Infrastructure and Security and Representative Cyndi Stevenson (R – Saint Augustine), respectively; and

WHEREAS, this legislation would codify in state law the establishment of the Statewide

Office of Resiliency within the Executive Office of the Governor; and

WHEREAS, this legislation also would create the Statewide Sea-Level Rise Task Force (the "Task Force") adjunct to the Statewide Office of Resiliency for the purpose of recommending the consensus projections of the anticipated sea-level rise and flooding impacts along this state's coastline; and

WHEREAS, the Task Force's duties would include developing official scientific information necessary to make recommendations on consensus baseline projections of the expected sea-level rise along Florida's coastline for planning horizons designated by the Task Force; and

WHEREAS, SB 7016 and HB 1073 would further require the Task Force to submit its recommended consensus baseline projections to the Environmental Regulation Commission, which is required to adopt or reject these projections; and

WHEREAS, if adopted, the Task Force's projections would serve as the state's official estimate of sea-level rise and flooding impacts along the state's coastline and would be used to develop future state projects, plans, and programs; and

WHEREAS, the Statewide Office of Resiliency and the Task Force to be established by SB 7016 and HB 1073 would serve a valuable purpose and fulfill an important function to Miami-Dade County and its residents; and

WHEREAS, accordingly, this Board wishes to urge the Florida Legislature to enact such legislation,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Supports SB 7016, HB 1073, or similar legislation that would create the Statewide Sea-Level Rise Task Force for the purpose of recommending consensus projections of the anticipated sea-level rise and flooding impacts along this state's coastline and codify in state law the establishment of the Statewide Office of Resiliency.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of this resolution to the Governor, the Senate President, the House Speaker, the Chair of the Senate Committee on Infrastructure and Security, Representative Cyndi Stevenson, and the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the legislation described in section 1 and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2020 State Legislative Package to include this item.
