Resolution Authorizing the County Mayor to Execute a Grant Application with the Federal Transit Administration for Up to \$106,771,000.00 in Fiscal Year 2020

Sections 5307, 5337, 5339 Formula Programs and Federal Highway Administration

Flex Funding

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the terms of and authorize the Miami-Dade County (County) Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute a grant application on behalf of the County with the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT), Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for up to \$106,771,000.00 in Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 Formula Grant Programs. The total estimated amount includes appropriated FTA funds allocated up to \$55,000,000.00 for Section 5307 Urbanized Area Formula; up to \$30,000,000.00 for Section 5337 State of Good Repair Formula; up to \$6,000,000.00 for Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities Formula grant programs; and \$15,771,000.00 transferred from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to the FTA Section 5307 Program. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the receipt and expenditure of funds, as specified in the Agreement.

A public hearing is required in accordance with federal regulations.

Scope

These funds will provide support for multiple bus and rail projects, vanpool and paratransit services and a security project. Therefore, the impact of these grants is countywide.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

This item represents a positive fiscal impact to the County as it provides up to \$106,771,000.00 in funding to the Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW), which has been anticipated in the DTPW budget. The required local match of up to \$26,692,750.00 will be provided in full by the Florida Department of Transportation through the use of State Transportation Development Credits as a "soft match" for this grant.

The Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act) authorizes state transportation departments to make available to public transit agencies the use of transportation development credits on selected federally assisted public transit capital projects. By using the credits to substitute the required non-federal share on a new federal aid project, the federal share can effectively be increased to 100 percent.

Track Record/Monitor

The Grant Manager for this Agreement is Ed Carson, Manager, Grants Administration, DTPW.

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Background

On December 4, 2015, President Obama signed into law the FAST Act, which provides long-term funding for the 21st Century transportation system. There were no major changes to the current FTA formula grant programs, which include the Section 5307 Urbanized Area Formula, Section 5337 State of Good Repair and Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities.

The FTA annually publishes the apportioning funds appropriated by law for these formula grant programs. The Miami Urbanized Metropolitan Area anticipates receiving up to \$185,400,000.00 in FY 2020 federal formula funds to be divided among the Miami Urbanized Metropolitan Area (Miami-Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach counties and the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority). The amount of funding each agency receives is based upon the apportioned funds, information from the National Transit Database and the appropriate formula established by the FTA. The agency directors within the Urbanized Metropolitan Area mutually agree on the final apportionment to each agency.

The Section 5307 Formula program makes federal funding available to urbanized areas for public transportation capital, planning, job access and reverse commute projects and use of certain expenditures by vanpool operators and operating assistance in areas with populations greater than 200,000 that operate a maximum of 100 buses in fixed-route service during peak hours (rail fixed guideway excluded). For urbanized areas with populations of 200,000 and more, the formula is based on a combination of bus revenue vehicle miles, bus passenger miles, fixed guideway revenue miles and fixed guideway route miles, as well as population, population density and number of low-income individuals.

DTPW anticipates receiving up to \$55,000,000.00 based upon the funds appropriated by law for the Section 5307 Urbanized Area Formula program. DTPW will also include as part of this grant application \$15,771,000.00 transferred from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to the FTA Section 5307 Program for a total of up to \$70,771,000.00. The proposed projects expected to be funded up to \$70,771,000.00 under the FY 2020 Section 5307 program for DTPW include:

- Upgrade to LED lighting Metrorail/Metromover Stations and Metrorail Parking Facilities (part of required 1% program allocation for security projects)
- Replacement of security doors at Metrorail Stations (part of required 1% program allocation for security projects)
- Security Consultant Services (part of the 1%)
- Preventive Maintenance (Pus)
- Preventive Maintenance (Rail)
- Special Transportation Services (STS)
- Metromover Train Control Equipment Wayside Overhaul Engineering/Design
- Lease/Purchase Financing for Transit Buses

Projects funded under the Section 5337 State of Good Repair Formula program are limited to replacement and rehabilitation of existing fixed guideway systems or capital projects required to maintain public transportation systems in a state of good repair. Funds are apportioned to

urbanized areas with fixed guideway systems in operation for at least seven years and a new modified formula.

DTPW expects to fund rail preventive maintenance in an amount up to \$30,000,000.00 under the FY 2020 Section 5337 program.

The Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities Formula program provides funding to replace, rehabilitate and purchase buses and related equipment and construct bus-related facilities and use of certain expenditures by vanpool operators. The formula is based upon population, vehicle revenue miles and passenger miles. The proposed DTPW projects expected to be funded up to \$6,000,000.00 under the FY 2020 Section 5339 program include:

- Compressed Natural Gas Buses
- Special Transportation Services Capital Cost of Contracting
- Vanpool Program Capital Cost of Contracting

Upon approval by the Board, DTPW as an eligible designated recipient of federal funding will submit a single grant application to the FTA, which will include the funding and projects for each formula grant program.

RESOLUTION APPROVING TERMS OF AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO FILE A GRANT APPLICATION AND EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION **FEDERAL** ADMINISTRATION FOR UP TO \$106,771,000.00 IN FISCAL YEAR 2020 SECTION 5307 URBANIZED AREA FORMULA. SECTION 5337 STATE OF GOOD REPAIR FORMULA AND SECTION 5339 BUS AND BUS FACILITIES FORMULA PROGRAM FUNDING; AND AUTHORIZING RECEIPT AND EXPENDITURE OF **FUNDS** PURSUANT TO APPLICATION AND **AGREEMENT** AND OF ANY ADDITIONAL FUNDS AS SPECIFIED IN THE AGREEMENT SHOULD SUCH FUNDS BECOME AVAILABLE
