RESOLUTION NO.

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR TO SUSPEND FOR 30 DAYS THE DISCONNECTION OF WATER SERVICE BY THE MIAMI-DADE WATER AND SEWER DEPARTMENT TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC'S HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE RELATING TO CORONAVIRUS 2019 (COVID-19)

WHEREAS, the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) has approximately

444,000 retail customers for which it provides clean, safe and potable water; and

WHEREAS, WASD's Rules and Regulations provides WASD with the right to disconnect

water service to customers who fail to pay in full the total amount due on their bills; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, the Governor of Florida declared a State of Emergency

for the State of Florida related to the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the County Mayor declared a Local State of Emergency

in order to protect the public's health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, all health officials including the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention have emphasized the importance of washing your hands frequently and refraining from shaking hands and other forms of contact to protect human health and minimize the chances of either being exposed to or spreading COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the County Mayor ordered WASD to suspend the disconnection of water service during the Local State of Emergency; and

WHEREAS, this Board finds that the access to potable water during this health threat is of paramount importance and should stay in place for 30 days after the Local State of Emergency has terminated to further protect the public's health, safety and welfare,

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board directs the County Mayor to order the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department to suspend for 30 days any disconnection of water service for nonpayment from the effective date of the termination of the Local State of Emergency in order to protect the public's health, safety and welfare relating to coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19). This temporary stay shall not act as a waiver, release or amnesty from payment for water services that are due or any liability for tampering with the water meter during the thirty-day period. This temporary stay shall also not affect the Department's other procedures for collection such as entering into payment arrangements and placement of liens.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Joe A. Martinez. It was offered by Commissioner , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

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The Chairperson thereupon declared the resolution duly passed and adopted this 7th day of April, 2020. This resolution shall become effective upon the earlier of (1) 10 days after the date of its adoption unless vetoed by the County Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board, or (2) approval by the County Mayor of this Resolution and the filing of this approval with the Clerk of the Board.
