RESOLUTION URGING GOVERNOR RON DESANTIS AND SECRETARY OF STATE LAUREL M. LEE TO REQUEST FLORIDA'S FEDERAL SHARE OF HELP AMERICA VOTE ACT (HAVA) EMERGENCY FUNDS FROM THE CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF, AND ECONOMIC SECURITY ACT (CARES ACT), MADE AVAILABLE TO STATES TO PREVENT, PREPARE FOR, AND RESPOND TO THE CORONAVIRUS FOR THE 2020 FEDERAL ELECTION CYCLE IN LIGHT OF CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19)

WHEREAS, a new coronavirus, known as SARS-CoV-2, causes an infectious disease named coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) that has spread rapidly since its initial identification in Wuhan, Hubei province, China; and

WHEREAS, on January 30, 2020, the International Health Regulations Emergency Committee of the World Health Organization ("WHO") declared the outbreak a "public health emergency of international concern"; and

WHEREAS, in response to the public health emergency and the economic impacts caused by COVID-19, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act ("CARES ACT") has been passed by Congress and signed into law; and

WHEREAS, the CARES Act includes \$400 million in new Help America Vote Act (HAVA) emergency funds; and

WHEREAS, these HAVA funds are made available to states to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus, domestically or internationally, for the 2020 federal election cycle; and

WHEREAS, the match requirement for states for these funds is 20 percent; and

WHEREAS, allowable uses for these HAVA funds include printing of additional ballots and envelopes for potential higher levels of absentee or vote by mail processes; and

WHEREAS, the HAVA funds made available through the CARES Act can also be used for cleaning supplies and protective masks and equipment for staff and poll workers in early voting, vote center, or election day polling places; and

WHEREAS, according to the website for the Election Assistance Commission, Florida is one of only six states that has not yet submitted a disbursement request letter for its federal share of HAVA funds; and

WHEREAS, according to the website for the Election Assistance Commission, Florida's federal share of HAVA funds is \$20,152,160; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to ensure that Florida benefits from any and all available federal funding for preventing, preparing for, and responding to coronavirus in connection with the 2020 federal election cycle,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges Governor Ron DeSantis and Secretary of State Laurel M. Lee to request Florida's federal share of Help America Vote Act (HAVA) emergency funds from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), made available to states to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus for the 2020 federal election cycle in light of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, the Secretary of State, and the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the actions set forth in section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the

2020 State Legislative Package to include this item and to include this item in the 2021 State Legislative Package when it is presented to the Board.
