PASSING OF GEORGE FLOYD

WHEREAS, George Perry Floyd was born in Fayetteville, North Carolina and raised in Houston Texas; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Floyd attended Yates High School in Houston, Texas where he played and excelled on the football and basketball teams; and

WHEREAS, in fact, Mr. Floyd was a star tight end and helped the Yates High School football team reach the 1992 state championship game; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Floyd also played basketball at South Florida Community College; and WHEREAS, Mr. Floyd's love for sports continued after his playing days were over, as he was a youth football and basketball volunteer coach; and

WHEREAS, in addition to sports, Mr. Floyd's interests included music; and

WHEREAS, he was a hip-hop artist who rapped under the stage name "Big Floyd;" and

WHEREAS, as such, Mr. Floyd was a member of Presidential Playas and worked with the Screwed Up Click, led by the legendary DJ Screw; and

WHEREAS, additionally, in the 1990s, Mr. Floyd rapped on several mixtapes, released Block Party as a member of Presidential Playas in 2000, and participated in community outreach events held by Christian hip-hop artists; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Floyd was also a man of faith and a member of a Christian men's ministry that did community outreach in his Houston hometown; and

WHEREAS, according to family and friends, Mr. Floyd moved to Minnesota several years ago for better employment prospects; and

WHEREAS, the move to Minnesota provided Mr. Floyd with a fresh start and gave him opportunities to improve his life and be a better father; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Floyd leaves behind two daughters, siblings, and a host of other relatives and friends, all of whom are left to mourn his loss and question the decisions that led to his tragic death, which has been declared a homicide; and

WHEREAS, in addition, Minnesotans and other individuals throughout the United States and around the world are outraged at the callous and grievous behavior of the police officers that led to his death; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Floyd's family and friends describe him as tender-hearted, God-fearing, peaceful, giving, and a "gentle giant" who was always laughing and had a smile on his face; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Floyd's murder has left an indelible mark on his family, friends, and many people across the world; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Floyd's legacy will inevitably be tied to the police officer that took his life and the others that watched it happen; and

WHEREAS, however and more importantly, his legacy will be linked to the countless number of individuals who are outraged by his murder and demanding justice and reforms to the criminal justice system as well as an honest examination of racial bias and interactions between law enforcement and people of color; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Floyd will be remembered as a kind and loving man who was a friend to all and attempted to change his life and the lives of those around him for the better, his legacy is one of love, peace, and understanding; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to honor the memory of George Floyd through this expression of sympathy and condolences to his family,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Expresses its sympathy and condolences to the Floyd family on the passing of George Floyd.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the family of George Floyd.
