RESOLUTION CONDEMNING AND DENOUNCING ANTI-ASIAN BIGOTRY, ANTI-SEMITISM, AND ALL HATE SPEECH, VIOLENT ACTION, AND THE SPREAD OF MISINFORMATION RELATED TO CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19); URGING RESIDENTS TO DENOUNCE AND CALL ATTENTION TO HATE SPEECH, HATE CRIMES, AND OTHER DISCRIMINATORY ACTS RELATED TO COVID-19; AND URGES COMMUNITIES WITHIN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY AND BEYOND TO UNITE TO COMBAT HATE SPEECH, HATE CRIMES, AND OTHER DISCRIMINATORY ACTS RELATED TO COVID-19

**WHEREAS**, in December 2019, a new coronavirus, known as SARS-CoV-2, that causes an infectious disease named coronavirus disease 2019 ("COVID-19") was first identified in Wuhan, Hubei Province, China; and

WHEREAS, on January 30, 2020, the International Health Regulations Emergency Committee of the World Health Organization ("WHO") declared the outbreak a "public health emergency of international concern"; and

**WHEREAS**, thereafter, on March 11, 2020, due to the rapid spread and severity of the virus, the WHO declared COVID-19 a pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, according to the Johns Hopkins University Coronavirus Resource Center, since its initial identification, nearly 6 million positive cases and more than 362,000 COVID-19 related deaths have been confirmed worldwide as of May 29, 2020; and

WHEREAS, similarly, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports almost 2 million positive cases and over 104,000 COVID-19 related deaths in the United States during the same time frame; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 has infected people from all racial, national, and ethnic backgrounds; and

**WHEREAS**, COVID-19 is a public health emergency that was not created or caused by any race, nationality, religion, or ethnicity; and

**WHEREAS**, nevertheless, extremists are using COVID-19 to spread their hateful ideologies, including anti-Asian bigotry, anti-Semitism, racism, and Islamophobia; and

**WHEREAS**, amid the growing spread of COVID-19, there are increasing reports of biasmotivated incidents targeting members of the Asian and Pacific Islander community in the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, additionally, increased numbers of hate crimes, discrimination, and aggression against Asian and Pacific Islander and Jewish communities have been observed across the country because these groups are being blamed, by some, for the pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, history shows that times of great fear, uncertainty, and unrest can lead to the demonization, blaming, and scapegoating of groups as the "other;" and

WHEREAS, in an effort to combat such biases and to avoid fueling ethnic and racial discrimination, the WHO has cautioned against using geographic descriptors for COVID-19; and

**WHEREAS**, specifically, the deliberate use of terms such as "Chinese virus" or "Kung Fu virus" to describe COVID-19 not only encourages hate crimes and incidents against individuals who are Asian and Pacific Islander, but also spreads misinformation about the virus; and

**WHEREAS**, likewise, the Jewish community has been targeted with blame, hate, anti-Semitic tropes, and conspiracy theories about the Jewish community creating, spreading and profiting from COVID-19; and **WHEREAS**, to target and stigmatize specific communities for the COVID-19 pandemic and worldwide spread creates an inexcusable risk to all community members; and

**WHEREAS**, it is critical that the entire Miami-Dade County community stand in solidarity with its Asian and Pacific Islander, Jewish, and other communities that are targeted for acts of hate related to COVID-19 and send a message that discriminatory and hate-motivated behavior or violence will not be tolerated; and

WHEREAS, every individual has the ability to promote inclusiveness, celebrate diversity, support all fellow community members, prevent the spread of misinformation, and reject hate and bias in all forms; and

**WHEREAS**, the COVID-19 pandemic will not come to an end because of divisive and hateful actions, but instead requires communities across the nation to work together; and

**WHEREAS**, during this unprecedented pandemic and beyond, this Board is fully committed to the safety, security, and equal treatment of its residents as it confronts and addresses the hardships caused by the COVID-19 pandemic,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Condemns and denounces anti-Asian bigotry, anti-Semitism, and all hate speech, violent action, and the spread of misinformation related to coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) that casts blame, promotes racism or discrimination, or harms any community, including the Asian and Pacific Islander, Jewish, and immigrant communities.

<u>Section 2.</u> Urges residents to denounce and call attention to hate speech, hate crimes, and other discriminatory acts related to COVID-19.

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Section 3. Urges communities within Miami-Dade County and beyond to unite to combat hate speech, hate crimes, and other discriminatory acts related to COVID-19.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Jean Monestime. It was offered by Commissioner , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
