Response to Resolution No. R-431-20 Directing the County Mayor to Report on the Race,

Ethnicity and Other Demographics Pertaining to Individuals Positive for COVID-19

At the May 5, 2020 meeting of the Board of County Commissioners (Board), the Board adopted Resolution No. R-431-20 which directed the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to prepare a report that analyzes the race, ethnicity and other demographic information pertaining to the number of individuals in Miami-Dade County who have tested positive for COVID-19. The Resolution also directed the administration to prepare a plan to provide additional support and services to aid the affected populations. As this information changes daily, the information provided in this report is as of May 31, 2020, unless otherwise noted.

Since the first COVID-19 case was identified in Miami-Dade County on March 11, 2020, my administration has relied on a multitude of federal, state and local partners to track and respond to the spread of this disease. Through various Emergency Orders and with the cooperation of local hospitals and long-term care facilities, we have been able to gather daily information on available capacity and the prevalence of COVID-19 in our County. The Florida Department of Health (FDOH), the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) and the Agency for Healthcare Administration (AHCA) report daily statistics and these efforts are used to supplement the reports provided to the public and, most recently, the 'Moving to a New Normal Dashboard' that is being published daily.

Positive Individuals

According to data made available by the FDOH and the FDEM, as of May 31, 2020, there have been 180,503 persons tested for COVID-19 in Miami-Dade County, of which 18,000 tested positive. County specific figures are adjusted by the State to reflect information for Florida residents and are included as Attachment A.

Hospitalizations

Also included on Attachment A is the State snapshot of hospitalizations due to COVID-19 as of May 31, 2020. As of that date, 16 percent of the individuals that tested positive for COVID-19 had been hospitalized. This was lower than the statewide hospitalization rate of 19 percent reported statewide.

In addition to the State's hospitalization reporting, Miami-Dade County, through Emergency Order 18-20, collects daily information from the County's 34 public and private hospitals. On that date, local hospitals reported 586 hospitalized patients of which 501 patients were in general care beds and 85 were in intensive care unit beds. Local hospital figures are included in the EOC Situation Report published daily by the Miami-Dade Office of Emergency Management and in the 'Moving to a New Normal Dashboard.'

Deaths

According to the information published by the State, as of May 31, 2020, there were 700 deaths in Miami-Dade County related or caused by COVID-19. As of that date, the Miami-Dade Medical Examiner (ME) had reported 632 COVID-19 deaths. There has been some discussion with the State on this discrepancy but, generally, FDOH counts a death as a COVID-19 death if, in the preceding 30 days, the person had tested positive for COVID-19. The ME carefully reviews the history and hospital course of every COVID-19 positive person, to examine if COVID-19 played a role in the death. A person may pass away with COVID-19 but if the virus did not contribute to their death, then the ME will not classify the death as a

COVID-19 death. The State's methodology of counting all COVID-19 positive deaths artefactually elevates the number of deaths due to COVID-19. The demographic data below has been compiled using the ME's data as of May 31, 2020.

Additional Support and Services

As part of the County's response to COVID-19, initiatives were created and implemented to make sure residents, specifically vulnerable populations such as the elderly, did have their basic needs met. The first of which was the senior meals program to feed seniors that, pursuant to Emergency Orders and general health guidelines, had been encouraged to stay at home. As of June 1, 2020, 5,125,407 meals had been delivered to ensure seniors were fed as they heeded health advisories and stayed home.

As we enter the New Normal and in order to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, my administration is developing an initiative to expand testing capacity with a specific focus on testing vulnerable populations. These initiatives may include mobile testing in specific neighborhoods or expanded and continuous testing for specific populations. Additionally, Miami-Dade County intends to partner and support FDOH to expand their contact tracing efforts in our County.




Laboratory testing for Florida residents and non-Florida residents over the past 2 weeks




