RESOLUTION NO.

RESOLUTION OPPOSING, PARTICULARLY RELATING TO THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) PANDEMIC, THE RECENT DECISION BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, BUREAU OF THE CENSUS, TO END ALL CENSUS COUNTING EFFORTS A MONTH EARLY ON SEPTEMBER 30, 2020, RATHER THAN OCTOBER 31, 2020

WHEREAS, an accurate and complete 2020 United States Census count is vital to Miami-Dade County because census data is used to determine how federal resources will be distributed annually for the next decade to state and local governments; and

WHEREAS, this data is critical to ensuring that all residents are equally represented in all levels of government and is used to adjust or redraw electoral districts; and

WHEREAS, in April 2020, the United States Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census ("Census Bureau") announced the deadline to follow up with households that do not self-respond, also known as the Nonresponse Follow-up ("NRFU"), would be extended to October 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, this action was taken to ensure the completeness and accuracy of the 2020 Census by allowing the Census Bureau's workers additional time to conduct in-person interviews due to delays and setbacks caused by coronavirus disease 2019 ("COVID-19") pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on August 3, 2020, the Census Bureau Director posted a written statement on the Census Bureau's website announcing that the Census Bureau is ending all 2020 Census counting efforts including, but not limited to, all field data collection gathered by critical door knocking efforts and collection of responses online, by phone or by mail on September 30, 2020, a month earlier than previously scheduled; and WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County and the State of Florida are still facing significant challenges related to COVID-19, as are many other areas of the country; and

WHEREAS, with roughly four out of 10 households nationwide yet to be counted and already delayed by COVID-19, the Census Bureau now has less than two months left to try to reach traditionally hard to count populations under the revised deadline; and

WHEREAS, these last-minute changes to the constitutionally mandated count of every person living in the U.S. threaten the accuracy of population data used to determine the distribution of political representation and federal funding for the next decade; and

WHEREAS, on August 4, 2020, four former Census Bureau Directors issued a joint statement advising that failing to extend the NFRU deadlines to April 30, 2021, will result in seriously incomplete enumerations in many areas of our country; and

WHEREAS, the joint statement from the former Census Bureau Directors also advised that without extended deadlines, the Census Bureau would be forced to take steps such as fewer in-person visits for households that did not self-respond and would rely instead on the use of administrative records or statistical techniques on a much larger scale than in previous census counts; and

WHEREAS, by suddenly and unexpectedly shortening the deadline by an entire month, the Census Bureau has created great uncertainty, negatively impacting counties and cities that rely on this information to plan their educational efforts to maximize Census participation; and

WHEREAS, counties and cities are often the governments that directly deliver essential services to people; and

WHEREAS, excluding any person from the apportionment base for the 2020 Census undermines the complete and accurate count of all city and county residents; and

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WHEREAS, less time will create a substantial risk that critical public funds and elected representation will be improperly apportioned; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to take immediate action to ensure that Miami-Dade County can raise its concerns regarding a fair and accurate count of all its residents for the 2020 Census,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

<u>Section 1.</u> Opposes, particularly relating to the COVID-19 pandemic, the recent decision by the United States Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census, to end all census counting efforts a month earlier on September 30, 2020, rather than October 31, 2020.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the members of the Miami-Dade County Congressional Delegation, the United States Secretary of Commerce, the Director of the United States Census Bureau, and the Presidents and Executive Directors of the National Association of Counties, the Florida Association of Counties, the Florida League of Cities and the Miami-Dade County League of Cities.

Section 3. Directs the County's federal lobbyist to advocate for the action set forth in section 1 above and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2020 Federal Legislative Package to include this item and to include this item in the 2021 federal legislative packages when it is presented to the Board.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Sally A. Heyman and the Co-Sponsor is Commissioner Daniella Levine Cava. It was offered by
