RESOLUTION URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO ALLOCATE ADDITIONAL FUNDING TO AIR CARRIERS AND CONTRACTORS FOR ECONOMIC RELIEF AS A RESULT OF CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) TO STAVE OFF MASSIVE LAYOFFS OF EMPLOYEES IN THE AIRLINE INDUSTRY

WHEREAS, the airline industry continues to suffer as a result of the coronavirus disease 2019 ("COVID-19"), an infectious disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2, a novel coronavirus that was first identified in December 2019; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 has spread rapidly throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, because one of the ways to contain the virus and reduce its spread is to keep

a physical distance, passenger traffic has dropped drastically and is only now slowly increasing; and

WHEREAS, to address the major financial implications associated with the decrease in passenger traffic, the United States Congress enacted the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (the "CARES Act"), a \$2 trillion stimulus package; and

WHEREAS, among other things, the CARES Act provided \$25 billion for passenger air carriers, \$4 billion for air-cargo carriers and \$3 billion for certain contractors; and

WHEREAS, the CARES Act implemented the Payroll Support Program which provides that to be eligible for financial assistance, an air carrier or contractor shall refrain from conducting involuntary furloughs or reducing pay rates and benefits until September 30, 2020; and WHEREAS, the United States Congress is currently considering another stimulus bill, the Health and Economic Recovery Omnibus Emergency Solutions Act (the "HEROES Act"), a \$3 trillion emergency relief package that would provide additional funding to state and local governments and provide individuals with financial assistance, increased food benefits, additional unemployment funds, and rental and mortgage assistance to stabilize the economy; and

WHEREAS, the HEROES Act, however, would not provide additional stimulus relief to air carriers and contractors; and

WHEREAS, although helpful, the HEROES Act, if passed, would only partially extend the Payroll Support Program to September 30, 2020, or the date on which such financial assistance is fully exhausted by the air carrier or contractor, whichever date occurs later; and

WHEREAS, it is essential that the United States Congress allocate additional dollars to stave off massive layoffs of employees in the airline industry,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the United States Congress to allocate additional funding to air carriers and contractors for economic relief as a result of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) to stave off massive layoffs of employees in the airline industry.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of this resolution to the President of the United States and Members of the Miami-Dade County Congressional Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's federal lobbyists to advocate for the action set forth in section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2020 Federal Legislative Package to include this item.
