	RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORII	DA LEGISLATURE TO

TO HURRICANES

WHEREAS, illegal dumping of materials like tires, construction debris, furniture, appliances, and hazardous materials is a serious issue that creates a wide range of problems; and

IMPLEMENT STRONGER PENALTIES FOR ILLEGAL DUMPING UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES RELATING

WHEREAS, illegal dumping is a problem in Miami-Dade County's rural and agricultural areas, as well as residential areas; and

WHEREAS, illegal dumping may pose serious environmental challenges and contribute to slum and blight; and

WHEREAS, illegal dumping also harms the environment, lowers property values, and results in large amounts of funds and staffing resources being spent on enforcement and cleanup costs; and

WHEREAS, during hurricane conditions, illegal dumping creates an even greater danger to the community, particularly in the more densely populated areas of the County, because wind gusts can cause trash and solid waste to become dangerous airborne projectiles that can cause bodily harm to persons and tremendous destruction to property; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Litter Law, codified in section 403.413, Florida Statutes, prohibits the unauthorized dumping of litter on any public property, private property, and in any bodies of water; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Florida Litter Law, any person who dumps:

• 15 pounds or less of litter is guilty of a noncriminal infraction;

- more than 15 pounds but not more than 500 pounds of litter is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree; and
- more than 500 pounds of litter or hazardous waste is guilty of a felony of the third degree; and

WHEREAS, on June 20, 2017, this Board adopted Resolution No. R-647-17, urging the Florida Legislature to implement stronger penalties for dumping litter; and

WHEREAS, there are no enhanced penalties for illegal dumping occurring during the period of a hurricane warning under Florida law; and

WHEREAS, according to the National Weather Service, a hurricane warning is issued when sustained winds of 74 mph or higher associated with a tropical cyclone are expected in 36 hours or less from the time of the issuance of the warning, and where these winds may be accompanied by storm surge, coastal flooding, as well as river flooding; and

WHEREAS, because of the dangers associated with illegal dumping as a hurricane approaches, this Board would like the Florida Legislature to implement stronger statutory penalties for violations of the Florida Litter Law that occur during the period of a hurricane warning for the jurisdiction where the dumping occurs,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature to implement stronger penalties for violations of the Florida Litter Law that occur during a hurricane warning for the jurisdiction where the illegal dumping occurs.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of this resolution to the Governor, the Senate President, the House Speaker, and the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the legislation described in section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item to the 2021 State Legislative Package when it is presented to the Board.
