Subject: Miami International Airport (MIA) Retroactive Financial Relief Report –

September 2020

At the April 7, 2020 Board of County Commissioners (Board) meeting, Board members adopted Resolution No. R-332-20 as amended, approving a Retroactive Financial Relief Plan (Relief Plan) for airlines, concessionaires, car rental companies, cargo handlers, general aeronautical service permittees, fixed-base operators and any other tenant providing services at Miami International Airport (MIA), and for the aeronautical business operators at the General Aviation Airports (GAA) due to the steep decline in business revenues because of the "coronavirus disease 2019" (COVID-19) pandemic. This Relief Plan, which went into effect on April 18, 2020 complies with the guidelines published by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) in early April.

The Relief Plan, which was set to expire on August 31, 2020, was approved by Board members with an initial term of three months and a one-time three-month extension subject to monthly reviews. Because business revenue levels continue to remain low throughout MIA and are forecasted to stay low through year-end, the Relief Plan was extended at the July 21, 2020 Board meeting via Resolution No. R-749-20 exclusively for MIA's concessionaires and the only fixed-based operator at MIA required to pay a Minimum Annual Guarantee (MAG), Signature Flight Support. The extension waives the MAG and/or rent for 62 MIA concessionaires and Signature Flight Support on a month-to-month basis for four additional consecutive months (subject to monthly reviews) from September 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020. By way of this extension, the County will provide MIA's concessionaires and Signature Flight Support with the additional assistance needed to help sustain their businesses in light of the continued decrease in passenger traffic resulting from the ongoing pandemic.

The Miami-Dade Aviation Department (MDAD) has prepared its first monthly report for the first month of the extension period, September 2020. The report provides data related to the financial relief offers made by the County to MIA's concessionaires and Signature Flight Support as well as updates on the changed financial circumstances due to the COVID-19 crisis.

Four Month Extension of the Relief Plan

Per Resolution No. R-749-20, the Relief Plan for MIA's concessionaires and Signature Flight Support was extended for four continuous months beginning on September 1, 2020 and ending on December 31, 2020, subject to monthly reviews. A summary of the type of financial relief offered through the extension is as follows:

1) Waiver of monthly MAG payments, rent, and other related fees for duty-free stores and any other concession operators contracted to pay MAG monthly payment as well as monthly rent. Such waivers are effective on a month-to-month basis from September 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020 and are subject to monthly reviews. These concessionaires will continue to pay

- the assigned percentage fee of gross revenues in lieu of the MAG and rent for such time period.
- 2) Waiver of MAG monthly payments and other related fees for Signature Flight Support and all other concessionaires with MAG payments. Such waivers are effective on a month-to-month basis from September 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020 and are subject to monthly reviews. These concessionaires will continue to pay the assigned percentage fee of gross revenues in lieu of the MAG for such time period.

<u>Impacts of COVID-19 Pandemic</u>

Over Labor Day weekend, there was an uptick in air travel. The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) reported screening a total of 968,673 passengers on September 4, 2020, which is the highest number of passengers screened since March 2020. Throughout the month of September, the number of screened passengers fluctuated daily with 516,068 passengers recorded on September 1st as the lowest number and 968,673 passengers recorded on September 4th as the highest number. It should be noted that these numbers continue to show a significant year-to-year decrease when compared to the same days in 2019, during which time, 2,037,750 passengers and 2,198,828 passengers were screened, respectively.

The level of passengers traffic flows and business revenues for the month of September 2020, which are the metrics being used to measure the demand for air travel at MIA are noted below with comparisons to the levels reported in 2019.

1. Passenger Traffic Flows at MIA

A comparative analysis of passenger traffic levels for the months of September 2019 and September 2020 shows an average decline in passenger flows (arrivals and departures) of 72.5 percent at MIA, with the total number of domestic and international passengers falling from 3,192,720 passengers to 876,621 passengers. A more detailed look at the analysis confirms that the number of domestic arrivals decreased by 60.1 percent, from 834,038 passengers to 332,982 passengers while the number of domestic departures dropped by 59.5 percent, from 811,253 passengers to 328,661 passengers. The number of international arrivals decreased by 86.2 percent, from 796,799 passengers to 110,303 passengers, whereas the number of international departures fell by more than 86.1 percent, from 750,630 passengers to 104,675 passengers.

On a cumulative basis, a comparative analysis of passenger traffic levels for March 2019, April 2019, May 2019, June 2019, July 2019, August 2019 and September 2019 as compared to the same months in 2020 shows an average decline in passenger flows (arrivals and departures) of 78 percent at MIA, with the total number of domestic and international passengers falling from 26,613,457 passengers to 5,863,659 passengers. Furthermore, the analysis confirms that the number of domestic arrivals decreased by 70.3 percent, from 6,724,485 passengers to 1,994,968 passengers while the number of domestic departures dropped by 69.1 percent, from 6,809,948 passengers to 2,104,052 passengers. The number of international arrivals decreased by 87.1 percent, from 6,670,966 passengers to 862,402 passengers, whereas the number of international departures fell by more than 85.9 percent, from 6,408,058 passengers to 902,237 passengers.

2. Gross Revenues Variance Analysis at MIA

A comparative analysis of total gross revenues for the months of September 2019 and September 2020 is represented below in Chart A. The analysis shows an average decline in total gross revenues of 75 percent, with revenues falling from \$33,827,189 to \$8,324,536 for concession operators contracted to pay MAG payments in addition to rent as well as for Signature Flight Support and concession operators whose MAG payments include rent.

On a cumulative basis, a comparative analysis of total gross revenues for March 2019, April 2019, May 2019, June 2019, July 2019, August 2019 and September 2019 as compared to the same months in 2020 shows an average decline in total gross revenues of 80 percent, with revenues falling from \$284,001,813 to \$57,494,534 for concession operators contracted to pay MAG payments in addition to rent as well as for Signature Flight Support and concession operators whose MAG payments include rent.

Chart C, as shown below illustrates the total dollar amounts of relief provided by the County to concessionaires and Signature Flight Support at MIA for the month of September 2020 as well as the billed percentage fee from gross revenues. Each relief offer made and accepted or declined for the month of September 2020 is detailed on Attachment 1, as enclosed.
