Subject: Recommendation to Ratify Emergency Purchase: Miami-Dade Police Department
Elevator Modernization

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve this request for a designated purchase pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b)(3) of the Miami-Dade County Code, by a two-thirds vote of the Board members present, and to ratify an emergency award, *E-10115, Elevator Modernization*, for the purchase of elevator modernization services in the amount of \$540,000 for the Miami-Dade Police Department. This emergency award was necessary to purchase urgent upgrades to two elevators, one at the South District Station and another at the Intracoastal District Station.

An emergency was declared by the Director of the Department on October 1, 2020, to ensure that the elevators at these locations receive the necessary modernization to comply with current State of Florida code requirements. The equipment was not interfacing with the fire alarm system, which posed a life safety hazard. The Miami-Dade Police Department contacted ThyssenKrupp Elevator Corp. and requested an emergency quote for the modernization as they are the incumbent vendor for the maintenance and support services for these elevators.

Competition for these services was not practicable due to the urgent need to bring the elevators up to code to ensure the well-being and safety of all patrons using them. As such, the Department declared an emergency and immediately secured the services of a qualified firm to accomplish the upgrades. The firm was contacted and a quote for the services was requested. Upon review, the Department deemed the quote was fair and reasonable under the circumstances, and proceeded with the work. Therefore, ratification of this emergency award is in the County's best interest, as the upgrades were critical and necessary to protect the safety and welfare of all persons using these elevators.

Scope

The scope of this item is countywide in nature.

Delegation of Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise all provisions of the contract, including any cancellation, renewal or extension provisions, pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the one-year term is \$540,000.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A DESIGNATED PURCHASE PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-8.1(B)(3) OF THE COUNTY CODE BY A TWO-THIRDS VOTE OF THE BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT; RATIFYING AN EMERGENCY PURCHASE FOR THE MIAMI-DADE POLICE DEPARTMENT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$540,000.00 FOR ELEVATOR MODERNIZATION, EMERGENCY CONTRACT NO. E-10115 FOR A ONE-YEAR TERM; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXERCISE ALL PROVISIONS OF THE CONTRACT, INCLUDING ANY CANCELLATION, RENEWAL OR EXTENSION PROVISIONS, PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-8.1 OF THE COUNTY CODE AND IMPLEMENTING ORDER 3-38

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board finds it is in the best interest of Miami-Dade County to award Contract No. E-10115, elevator modernization, as a designated purchase in an amount not to exceed \$540,000.00 for the Miami-Dade Police Department for a one-year term, pursuant to section 2-81(b)(3) of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board members present.

Section 2. This Board ratifies an emergency purchase authority in an amount not to exceed \$540,000.00 for the Miami-Dade Police Department for elevator modernization, Contract No. E-10115, as set forth in the incorporated memorandum.

Section 3. This Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise all provisions of the contract, including any cancellation, renewal or extension provisions, pursuant to section 2-8.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida and Implementing Order 3-38. Copies of the contract document are on file with and available upon request from the Internal Services Department, Strategic Procurement Division.
