Subject: Recommendation to Reject all Bids and Award a Non-Competitive Contract Services
For Pavement Repairs, Contract No. RM6-25/31

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Miami International Airport (MIA) continues to rank among the fastest-growing airports in the nation since the global COVID-19 pandemic, underscoring its role as Miami-Dade County's and the State of Florida's largest economic engine. To meet surging demand for passenger and cargo capacity, the Miami-Dade Aviation Department (MDAD) has launched the Future-Ready \$9B Modernization in Action (M.I.A.) Program. This ambitious initiative funds a comprehensive portfolio of projects designed to transform both MIA and the County's general aviation airports (GAA) into state-of-the-art, world-class facilities that will serve the region for decades to come. Another factor critical to the success of MIA's transformation is the upkeep of its infrastructure and assets. Proactive maintenance is essential to extending the lifespan of the County's airport system, ensuring safety and compliance and enhancing operational efficiencies. To advance these goals, on July 16, 2025, MDAD issued a competitive solicitation - Contract No. RM6-25/31(Solicitation) for year-round on-demand construction services that will ensure the long-term reliability of airport infrastructure at MIA and the GAA.

This item seeks approval from the Board of County Commissioners (Board) to: (1) reject the sole bid received in response to the Solicitation; and (2) award a non-competitive contract to the sole bidder under the Solicitation, General Asphalt Company, LLC (Asphalt, LLC), for pavement repairs for MDAD pursuant to Florida Statutes, Section 255.20(1)(C)(2), Section 5.03(D) of the Home Rule Charter and Section 2-8.1(b) of the Code of Miami-Dade County (Code). The scope of work includes on-call 24/7 airfield and pavement repairs as well as resurfacing, restoration and rehabilitation services at MIA and the GAAs. Because the work is highly specialized, MDAD has historically received few, and at times only a single industry response. In the future, MDAD will continue to engage industry stakeholders to seek their recommendations and refine the competitive solicitation so it is more attractive and accessible to potential respondents.

The statutory requirement under Florida Statutes Section 255.20 to competitively award Contract No. RM6-25/31 does not apply to this procurement as the sole bid received by the County in connection with the competitive solicitation issued in July 2025 was determined to be non-responsive by the County Attorney's Office. This statutory authority allowed MDAD to enter negotiations with the sole bidder, Asphalt, LLC, rather than re-advertise the project. During negotiations, Asphalt, LLC satisfied all remaining contractual obligations and provided the County with its Florida contractor license in compliance with Florida Statutes, Section 489.131.

The County has agreed to pay Asphalt, LLC a total compensation amount of \$45,304,855.69, which includes a 10 percent contingency of \$3,736,823.00, a Dedicated Allowance Fee of \$3,736,823.00, an Inspector's General Fee of \$112,979.69 and a mobilization fee of \$350,000.00. The total contract term

consists of 730 calendar days. MDAD, at its sole discretion, may authorize up to two 2-year renewal options.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board reject the sole bid received in response to the Solicitation, and approve the attached resolution waiving competitive bidding pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b)(1) of the County Code and Section 5.03(D) of the Home Rule Charter, by a two-thirds vote of Board members present, to award Contract No. RM6-25/31 entitled: “Pavement Repairs” to Asphalt, LLC in conformity with Florida Statutes, Section 255.20(1)(C)(2).

SCOPE

The scope of work provides continuous construction services across the County’s airport system for airfield and roadway pavement repairs as well as resurfacing, restoration and rehabilitation services, including but not limited to asphaltic concrete overlay, bituminous surface treatment, replacement of aircraft apron concrete pavement, pavement milling, cleaning, routing, and resealing existing joints in concrete pavement, construction of primed lime rock base, pavement rejuvenation, runway grooving, and any other related work.

The County’s airport system includes MIA, Miami-Opa Locka Executive Airport (OPF), Miami Executive Airport (TMB), Miami Homestead General Aviation Airport (X51), and Dade-Collier Training and Transition Airport (TNT), which are all regional assets represented by various commission districts, as such, the impact of this agenda item is countywide.

Project

Description: The scope of work provides 24/7 airfield and roadway repairs, resurfacing, restoration and rehabilitation construction services on an as needed basis throughout the County’s airport system, including MIA, OPF, TMB, X51 and TNT.

Approval Path: Board of County Commissioners, Section 2-8.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

BACKGROUND:

The scope of work under Contract No. RM6-25/31 provides MDAD with construction services (without pause or limitation) across the County’s airport system. By securing on-demand year-round coverage, MDAD guarantees that critical infrastructure needs are addressed promptly, supporting the Modernization in Action Program and reinforcing Miami-Dade’s position as a global aviation hub. As noted previously, the Solicitation was advertised on July 16, 2025, for such services and MDAD issued three (3) addenda in response to seven (7) questions to address and provide clarification to potential bidders.

In response to the Solicitation, MDAD received a total of one (1) bid from Asphalt, LLC. During the bid evaluation process, MDAD staff identified a responsiveness issue with Asphalt, LLC's bid and notified the County Attorney's Office (CAO) on August 27, 2025. On October 8, 2025, the CAO rendered an opinion deeming the sole bid received as non-responsive pursuant to Section 4 of the solicitation documents entitled "Licensing Requirements", which mandates that bidders must hold a General Contractor license at the time its bid is submitted. In its bid submittal, Asphalt, LLC attached a copy of a general contractor license issued to Robert Adolf Lopez, Jr., identified as the qualifier for the company confirming that Asphalt, LLC itself was not licensed as a general contractor at the time of submittal. As a result, based on the local and state regulatory requirements delineated below, because Asphalt, LLC did not meet the licensing requirements in effect at the time of bid submittal, its bid was deemed as non-responsive. (See "Attachment A" as attached)

- Section 10-3(b) of the Code of Miami-Dade County - prohibits any entity without an appropriate contractor's license from submitting a bid on any County or municipal public works project in the County.
- Florida Statutes, Section 489.131 - states that any county or municipality shall require that bids submitted for construction, improvement, remodeling, or repair on public projects be accompanied by evidence that the bidder holds an appropriate certificate or registration as a contractor.
- Florida Statutes, Section 255.20(1) - states that a county, municipality, special district or other political subdivision of the state seeking to construct or improve a public building or structure or other public construction work to competitively award to an appropriately licensed contractor each project that is estimated to cost more than \$300,000.00.

Because the sole bid submitted was deemed as non-responsive by the CAO, it triggered a statutory authority in Florida Statute, Section 255.20, which states that the requirement to competitively award does not apply "if, after notice by publication in accordance with the applicable ordinance or resolution, the governmental entity does not receive any responsive bids or proposals". This statutory authority allowed MDAD to enter negotiations with the sole bidder, Asphalt, LLC, rather than re-advertise the project. During negotiations, Asphalt, LLC fulfilled their remaining obligations and supplied the Florida contractor license to the County in accordance with Florida Statutes, Section 489.131.

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

Due Diligence

Pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12, due diligence was conducted to determine the responsibility of Asphalt, LLC, including verifying the firm's corporate status and conducting a review of their safety records (per Resolution No. R-1181-18) as well as confirming that there are no performance or compliance issues. The following lists were reviewed: 1) Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) logs of work-related injuries and illness (Form 300) including OSHA inspection data, and 2) convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal-excluded parties list. The Florida Department of State Division of Corporations records show the company's status as active.

Procurement History

MDAD advertised Project RM6-25/31 on July 16, 2025, under full and open competition. On August 20, 2025, MDAD received and publicly opened one (1) bid. During the evaluation process, MDAD staff identified responsiveness deficiencies related to licensing requirements. Accordingly, the bid was

referred to the CAO for review. On October 8, 2025, the CAO issued its determination, concluding that the sole bidder was nonresponsive. The statutory authority provided by Section 255.20 of the Florida Statutes, allowed MDAD to enter negotiations with Asphalt, LLC, the sole bidder, rather than re-advertise the project. During negotiations, Asphalt, LLC cured the deficiency and provided the County with the appropriate Florida contractor license.

MDAD's Civil-Environmental Engineering Division (CEED) reviewed the project's tally, and it was determined that the base bid from Asphalt, LLC (\$37,368,230.00) is approximately 2.47 percent higher than the cost analysis provided by CEED (\$36,468,250.00). Although the bid provided by Asphalt, LLC is higher, it accurately reflects the volatile market conditions such as the increases in price of materials, such as asphalt, concrete, and aggregates. Given the current market conditions, CEED considers the bid submitted by Asphalt, LLC to be qualified for the award of this construction contract. (See Attachment "C" as attached).

According to SBD's "Firm History Report," Asphalt, LLC has been awarded 3 contracts as a Prime Contractor in the last three (3) years with a total value of \$8,346,348.00. Additionally, from March 2012 to May 2022, Asphalt, LLC was awarded 7 contracts as Prime Contractor with a total value of \$108,867,436.00, making for a grand total of \$117,213,784.00. (See Attachment "D" as attached)


SBD's Capital Improvements Information System (CIIS) database has 50 evaluations for Asphalt, LLC with an average evaluation rating of 3.5 out of 4.0 points, which is indicative of good performance. (See Exhibit "E" as attached)

No Contract measures were established as part of this construction contract. A copy of the SBD Project Worksheet is enclosed. (See Attachment "F" as attached)



Subject: Request for Responsiveness Determination
BID No. RM6-25/31 Pavement Repairs

You have asked this office if the proposal submitted by General Asphalt Co., LLC (“Asphalt LLC”) in response to BID No. RM6-25/31 (the “Solicitation”) is responsive to the Solicitation. I rely on the information provided in your memorandum dated August 25, 2025, the additional records provided on August 27, 2025, and the additional information provided on October 2, 2025. For the reasons set forth below, we conclude that Asphalt LLC’s bid is not responsive to the Solicitation.

BACKGROUND

Miami-Dade County (the “County”), through its Aviation Department, sought bids from a “general contractor to provide construction services . . . consist[ing] of pavement repair, resurfacing, restoration, and rehabilitation” at all of the Aviation Department’s airports. *See* Solicitation at §3. The Solicitation’s licensing requirements were that the “Bidder must hold a General Contractor license at the time its bid is submitted.” *Id.* at §4. Section 4 of the Solicitation, containing the licensing requirements, expressly advised bidders- in two different places- that “[f]ailure to hold the appropriate certificate” or to “comply with the provisions of this Article at the time this bid is submitted, shall render the Bid non-responsive.” *Id.*

You have indicated that Asphalt LLC was not licensed as a general contractor at the time of bid submittal on August 20, 2025. Instead, Asphalt LLC attached a copy of a general contractor license issued to Robert Adolf Lopez, Jr. as the qualifier for General Asphalt Co., Inc. (“Asphalt Co.”). A review of the Florida Division of Corporation records that you provided our office show that Asphalt Co. was established as a corporation in Florida in 1966 and in 2021, it effectuated a conversion pursuant to the provisions of Florida Statutes section 607.1006 into a limited liability company and became Asphalt LLC. You advised that on August 22, 2025- after bid opening- procurement staff at the Aviation Department called and verified with the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation (“DBPR”) that Asphalt LLC had a pending application for the general contractor’s license.

ANALYSIS

Florida Statutes section 489.131 mandates that “any county or municipality shall require that bids submitted for construction, improvement, remodeling, or repair on public projects be accompanied by evidence that the bidder holds an appropriate certificate or registration” as a contractor. And, section 10-3(b) of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida (“County Code”)

prohibits any entity without an appropriate contractor's license from submitting a bid on any County or municipal public works project in Miami-Dade County. Any bid submitted in violation of section 10(b) of the County is "null and void." See §10(b) of the County Code.

Here, while Asphalt Co. may have effectuated a conversion under Florida law into Asphalt LLC in 2021, that alone did not confer Asphalt LLC with a contractor license under Chapter 489. In order to obtain a license for the limited liability company, Asphalt LLC was required to have filed an application with the DBPR to have the contractor license transfer to the new entity. See DBPR Construction Industry Licensing Board Form # DBPR CILB 23, https://www2.myfloridalicense.com/pro/cilb/documents/CILB23_Request_Name-Change_for_Construction_Business.pdf; see also, Klingen, *Licensing of Florida Contractors*, FL. B.J., Feb. 2018, Vol. 92, No. 2 at 8 ("If a contractor converts its business from a corporation to an LLC, it is not "converting" anything; it is merely creating a new entity, the LLC, that will in all likelihood operate alongside the corporation until the transition is complete. The new LLC is unlicensed until the corporation's qualifying agent applies for and receives CILB authorization to act as the new entity's qualifier. The qualifying agent can apply to qualify two entities, the corporation and the LLC, or apply to transfer from the corporation to the LLC.").

Indeed, Florida courts have strictly interpreted and applied the licensing requirements, qualifications, and registrations associated with qualifiers and legal entities for the purposes of acting as a general contractor. See, e.g. *CAM Bradford Homes, LLC v. Arrants*, 415 So. 3d 266, 269 (Fla. 5th DCA July 20, 2025), *reh'g denied* (July 23, 2025) (Holding that company owned by licensed contractor was unlicensed company and contract entered into by company was unenforceable because "his failure to apply would render meaningless the statutory provisions prohibiting business organizations from engaging in contracting without being certified or registered, *id.* § 489.127(1)(f), as well as those prohibiting a certified or registered contractor from allowing an unqualified business organization to use their individual certification or registration number to engage in contracting, *id.* § 489.127(4)."); see also, Fla. Stat. §489.119(2) ("If the applicant proposes to engage in contracting as a business organization ... or in any name other than the applicant's legal name or a fictitious name where the applicant is doing business as a sole proprietorship, the applicant *must* apply for registration or certification as the qualifying agent of the business organization." (emphasis added)). Whether the legal entity bidding on a public works construction contract holds the required license at the time of bid submission, "is a matter of responsibility and responsiveness." *Am. Lighting and Signalization, LLC, Pet. v. St. of Fla., Dept. of Trans., Res. and Dbi Serv., LLC, Intervenor*, Fla. Div. Admin. Hrgs. 2021 at *4). As the Solicitation, the County Code and Florida law requires that only licensed contractors submit bids for construction work, Asphalt LLC's bid is not responsive to the Solicitation and it may not be considered for award.

Section 1. Approves the rejection of the sole bid received in connection with BID No. RM6-25/31 Pavement Repairs (Solicitation) for the Miami-Dade Aviation Department.

Section 2. Waives competitive bidding procedures pursuant to Section 5.03(D) of the Home Rule Charter and Section 2-8.1(b)(1) of the Code of Miami-Dade County, by a two-thirds vote of Board members present, and in compliance with Section 255.20 of the Florida Statutes, approves the award of a non-competitive contract to General Asphalt Co, LLC., for MDAD Project No. RM6-25/31 to provide airfield and roadway pavement repair, resurfacing, restoration and rehabilitation work at Miami International Airport (MIA), Miami Opa-Locka (OPF), Miami


