**Subject:** FY 2024-25 Fourth Quarter Federal and State Funding Report – Directive No. 240752

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### **Executive Summary**

This report is in response to Resolution No. R-333-24, adopted by the Board of County Commissioners (Board) on April 16, 2024, and sponsored by Commissioner Danielle Cohen Higgins. Among other things, the resolution directed the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee to prepare a quarterly report detailing (i) the total amount of state and federal funding secured by Miami-Dade County (County) through grants and other allocations since 2020, including information on pass-through grants and required matching funds, along with a brief description of each grant's use; and (ii) all state and federal grants for which the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee has submitted an application, where the funding decision is still pending. The County has been awarded approximately \$6.4 billion in federal funding and \$724.1 million in state funding cumulatively from January 1, 2020, through September 30, 2025.

The attached report compiles federal and state grants along with other allocations awarded and applied for from July 1, 2025, to September 30, 2025. During this quarter, the County was awarded approximately \$171.5 million in federal grants and nearly \$8.9 million in state grants. As of September 30, 2025, the County has approximately \$430.2 million in pending federal applications and approximately \$1.14 billion in pending state applications; the latter includes a pending application for \$807.9 million to the Florida Department of Transportation for cruise terminal improvements.

### **Background**

The report is based on available data entered by County departments on the Grants Information Management System (GIMS), an internal countywide database of grant and other federal and state funding information developed by the Communications & Information Technology Department (CITD) and managed by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB).

This quarterly report compiles federal and state grants, as well as other allocations awarded, that have a start date within the fiscal quarter from July 1, 2025, to September 30, 2025. It also includes applications submitted during this period that are pending federal or state award decisions. . The report is organized alphabetically by the granting organization and identifies any applicable pass-through agencies. Additional details include: (i) award or requested amount, (ii) amount of matching funds (cash or value of in-kind services and source if applicable), (iii) County department responsible for the award or request, (iv) project title and brief description, and (v) start date of award (if applicable).
