Subject: Resolution Ratifying the Award of a Non-Exclusive Professional Services Agreement for Water and Sewer Rates, Fee Analysis and Bond Engineering Services with Arcadis U.S., Inc., Agreement No. 25AUSI003 - Project No. E24WS06

Executive Summary

This item seeks ratification by the Board of County Commissioners (the Board) of the action taken by the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee approving a Non-Exclusive Professional Services Agreement No. 25AUSI003 (the Agreement), competitively solicited under Project No. E24WS06, between Miami-Dade County (the County) and Arcadis U.S., Inc. (the Consultant) for Water and Sewer Rates, Fee Analysis and Bond Engineering Services. The Agreement is for an amount not to exceed \$6,655,000.00, inclusive of a ten percent (10%) contingency allowance, for a contract term of three (3) years, with two (2) one (1) year options-to-renew.

The Agreement will provide the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) with specialized rate, fee analysis, and bond engineering services that are essential to preserving WASD's financial stability and compliance with bond covenant requirements, as well as providing the technical and financial expertise required to support strategic decision making, protect the County's financial interests, and ensure transparency and accountability in rate setting processes. The Agreement was awarded following a full and open competitive solicitation, the Consultant was ranked the highest qualified firm after evaluation of qualifications and oral presentations.

WASD is one of the largest utilities in the United States, operating an extensive integrated system of infrastructure and facilities that delivers essential water and sanitary sewer services to more than 2.8 million residents, visitors, and businesses throughout the County. Given WASD's substantial capital commitments—including federally mandated projects, long-term infrastructure renewal programs, and ongoing regulatory compliance requirements—dependent financial and engineering evaluations of system revenues, capacity, and rate structures are critical to maintaining strong credit ratings and ensuring long-term fiscal sustainability. This Agreement enables WASD to make informed infrastructure investment decisions, support responsible growth and development while safeguarding system capacity, preserve regulatory compliance, and enhance the long-term reliability, resilience, and efficiency of the County's water and wastewater systems.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board ratify the action of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, as authorized under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County (WASD's Acceleration Ordinance) for the funded Agreement identified below and on Exhibit A attached hereto.

Scope

The Agreement will provide services throughout the County; therefore, the impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Delegation Of Authority

The authority of the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee to execute and implement this contract is consistent with the authorities granted under the Code of Miami-Dade County. The Agreement was awarded pursuant Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code (WASD's Acceleration Ordinance), which delegates authority to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award certain projects, and, among other things, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount, all subject to ratification by the Board. This item approves the award and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise the provisions contained in the Agreement, including termination.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact to the County is \$6,655,000.00 and will be funded out of WASD's Proprietary Revenues. There is no impact to the General Fund. This Agreement is in WASD's Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Adopted Budget and Multi-Year Capital Plan, Volume #3, Contractual Services, Page #98.

Track Record/Monitoring

WASD's Chief Financial Officer, Frances G. Morris, will oversee the implementation of this Agreement.

Due Diligence/Safety Information

Due diligence was conducted by WASD and the Strategic Procurement Department (SPD) in accordance with SPD's Procurement Guidelines to determine responsibility, including verifying corporate status; performance; and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federally excluded parties. There were no adverse findings related to the Consultants' responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12.

Background

On September 3, 2014, the Board approved Ordinance No. 14-77 authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award contracts for funded capital projects and related goods and services, and to accelerate the approval of WASD's (1) Consent Decree projects and (2) projects identified in WASD Multi-Year Capital Plan's Capital Improvements Program without the need for prior Board approval but subject to ratification by the Board.

The Agreement is for services that will provide specialized rate, fee analysis, and bond engineering services that are essential to preserving WASD's financial stability and compliance with bond covenant requirements. The Agreement will also provide services that include preparation of the Annual Adequacy of Rate and Charges Report, annual bond consultant inspections and reporting, bond feasibility reports for future revenue bond issuances, wholesale and retail rate analyses, and certification of service area releases in accordance with applicable ordinances.

The solicitation was issued on June 9, 2025, as a Notice to Professional Consultant under full and open competition. Two (2) proposals were received by the submittal deadline of July 16, 2025. Arcadis U.S., Inc. was ranked the highest-qualified firm after evaluation of qualifications and oral presentations. The Negotiation Team concluded successful negotiations on January 28, 2026, and the contract was awarded.

The two proposals received were found to be in compliance with the Small Business Development contract measures on July 22, 2025. Due diligence was conducted by WASD and SPD, which included reviewing lists for convicted, debarred, and suspended vendors, and no adverse findings were reported related to Arcadis U.S., Inc.

SUMMARY

The Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) operates one of the largest regional water and wastewater utilities in the southeastern United States, serving more than 2.8 million residents, visitors, and businesses. Maintaining the financial integrity of this utility system is critical to ensuring uninterrupted service delivery, regulatory compliance, and long-term sustainability of the Miami-Dade County's (County) multi-billion-dollar Capital Improvement Program (CIP).

To support these objectives, WASD conducted a competitive solicitation (Project No. E24WS06) to secure rate, fee analysis, and bond engineering services from a qualified firm. These services will provide specialized rate, fee analysis, and bond engineering services that are essential to preserving WASD's financial stability and compliance with bond covenant requirements. These services include preparation of the Annual Adequacy of Rate and Charges Report, annual bond consultant inspections and reporting, bond feasibility reports for future revenue bond issuances, wholesale and retail rate analyses, and certification of service area releases in accordance with applicable ordinances.

Arcadis U.S., Inc. was ranked the highest-qualified firm after evaluation of qualifications and oral presentations. The Negotiation Team concluded successful negotiations on January 28, 2026, and the total recommended contract amount will not exceed \$6,655,000, which includes a ten percent (10%) contingency allowance. The Agreement has a three (3) year term, with two (2) one-year options-to-renew, and will be funded through WASD Proprietary Revenues.

Given WASD's significant capital commitments including federally mandated projects and long-term infrastructure renewal programs, independent financial and engineering validation of system revenues and rate structures are necessary to maintain strong credit ratings. This Agreement provides the technical and financial expertise required to support strategic decision making, protect the County's financial interests, and ensure transparency and accountability in rate setting processes.

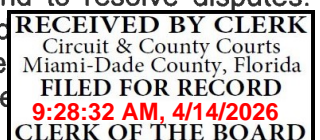
RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee approve the Agreement with Arcadis U.S., Inc. (the Consultant) to provide WASD with rate, fee analysis, and bond engineering services. The total compensation amount under the Agreement will not exceed \$6,655,000, which includes a ten percent (10%) contingency allowance, and the Agreement has a three (3) year term, with two (2) one-year options-to-renew.

DELEGATED AUTHORITY

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 2-8.2.12 of the County Code, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee has the authority to execute, amend, and terminate the Agreement, and to resolve disputes. Additionally, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code, the County Mayor's designee has the authority to amend and/or extend the Agreement, execute unfinished work, waive liquidated damages, negotiate and settle claims, and execute

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not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base/alternate Agreement amount. Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 (7), all actions taken pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 are subject to ratification by the Board of County Commissioners.

SCOPE

The scope of services includes the following:

Task 1: Annual Adequacy of Rates and Charges Report

The Consultant shall be responsible for preparing a written annual report on the water and sewer utility system before September 1st of each year as set forth in Section 6.07 of Ordinance 93-134. In the Report, the Consultant will set forth recommendations as to any necessary revision of rates and charges; determine the amount to be deposited in the renewal and replacement fund during the next fiscal year; and advise and/or make recommendations as appropriate.

Task 2: Annual Bond Consultant Report

The Consultant shall conduct an annual physical inspection of approximately one-third of WASD's facilities as set forth in Section 6.07 of Ordinance 93-134; render a written report as to the state of condition and repair of the water and wastewater systems, including therein recommendations as to repairs, replacements, and improvements required, prioritized based on criticality for consideration within the Multi-Year CIP.

Task 3: Bond Feasibility Report

The Consultant shall issue an Engineering Consultant's Report for inclusion in official statements for water and sewer revenue bond offerings as set forth in Section 208 of Ordinance 93-134.

Task 4: Annual Wholesale Rate Review and Meeting

The Consultant shall annually be tasked with a thorough analysis of wholesale customer cost allocations and rate calculations based on actual, projected, proposed, and budgeted costs. On an annual basis, the Consultant will perform an analysis and make recommendations regarding a) True-Up of actual audited costs, including allocations to regional and local costs and b) Proposed wholesale rate calculations and allocations. In addition, on an annual basis, the Consultant shall hold a minimum of one meeting by June 30th with wholesale customers to include a written and visual presentation in support of costs methodologies and rate calculations. The County project manager may request additional analysis on an as needed basis.

Task 5: Retail Rate Study

The water and wastewater systems operating revenue streams need to provide sufficient funding for WASD's cost requirements including reserves. Adequate revenue streams are necessary to operate and maintain both the water and wastewater systems and to maintain strong financial ratios that determine the cost of financing future debt required to fund the Multi-Year CIP. Water and wastewater tiered rate structures require annual analysis to ensure that adopted rates and fees allocations are generating revenues as anticipated through the course of annual rate adjustments. WASD is facing a multi-year, multi-billion CIP, which includes a \$1.6 billion Consent Decree Settlement Agreement. Given the magnitude of future capital needs, a review of retail rates and rate structure to fully recover revenue requirements of both systems is needed.

Task 6: Service Area Releases

During the term of the Agreement, the Consultant, shall conduct a review of the Service Area Release application in accordance with the standards set forth in Section 6.11 of Ordinance 93-134, and prepare a letter certifying that the release is in compliance.

Task 7: Miscellaneous Tasks as approved by the Director through task authorizations

During the term of the Agreement, the Consultant, at the sole discretion of WASD, will also provide consulting services for WASD, such as planning; strategic planning; feasibility development of business cases and alternatives, vulnerability and risk assessment; process studies; sea level rise analyses; assistance with grant proposals and applications, and other relevant studies or tasks which do not present conflicts of interest relative to the firm's bond consultant duties.

Pursuant to County Resolution No. R-62-22, which amended Implementing Order 3-34, and became effective on July 11, 2022, the Strategic Procurement Department (SPD) submitted a request to the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) on July 22, 2025, regarding any Proposer and their proposed subconsultants for the Competitive Selection Committee (CSC) consideration while scoring in accordance with the applicable criteria identified in the solicitation. No reports were located by the OIG. In addition, no reports were located by the Commission on Ethics and Public Trust.

At the First Tier “Evaluation of Qualifications” meeting held on November 21, 2025, the CSC reviewed and ranked the two (2) proposals in accordance with evaluation criteria outlined in the solicitation. DUE DILIGENCE

Pursuant to R-187-12, the SPD conducted due diligence in accordance with SPD's Procurement Guidelines to determine vendor responsibility including verifying corporate status and that no performance or compliance issues exist. The lists referenced included: Capital Improvements Information System (CIIS), Office of Small Business Development's (SBD) database, Sunbiz, Tax Collector's Office, convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties list. Also examined as part of this due diligence: Florida Division of Business and Professional Regulation. There were no adverse findings relating to vendor responsibility.

A review of the County's CIIS showed that Arcadis U.S., Inc. has 93 evaluations with an average evaluation score of 3.9 out of a possible maximum score of 4.0. (See Attachment G: Contractor Evaluation Report)

A review of CIIS, managed by the SBD, showed that Arcadis U.S., Inc. has been awarded one (1) contract with the County within the last three (3) years from the proposal submittal date, with a total contract value of \$5,090,040. (See Attachment H: Firm Work History Report)

The Competitive Selection Committee (CSC) has completed the evaluation of the proposals submitted in response to the referenced Strategic Procurement Department (SPD) solicitation and consistent with the guidelines published in the Notice to Professional Consultants (NTPC).

Scope of Services Summary: The scope of services includes water and sewer rates, fee analysis, and bond engineering services including reports on adequacy of rates and charges, state of condition and repair of water and wastewater systems, and bond feasibility. The scope also includes but is not limited to annual wholesale rate review and meeting, retail rate study, review of the Service Area Release application, and other tasks such as planning, strategic planning, feasibility development of business cases and alternatives, vulnerability and risk assessments, process studies, sea level rise analyses and other tasks which do not present a conflict of interest with the firm's bond consultant duties.

Preferred Experience and Qualifications: Please refer to the attached Experience and Qualifications.

Contract Terms: The County intends to retain one (1) qualified consultant/team for one (1) non-exclusive Professional Services Agreement (PSA) with an effective term of three (3) years, with two (2) one- year options to extend.

Participation Restrictions: The Prime Consultant and/or Subconsultant under this Agreement will not be allowed to be considered for any design projects for WASD advertised during the term of this Agreement.

Small Business Enterprise Measure: On April 8, 2025, the Office of Small Business Development (succeeded by SPD's Project Review and Analysis Unit) established No Measures for this project.

Advertisement Date: June 9, 2025.

Number of Proposal(s) Received: Two (2) proposals were received by the submittal deadline of July 16, 2025.

Analysis of Market Availability: Because fewer than three (3) firms submitted response to the solicitation, and in accordance with the requirements of the



research was performed. On July 17, 2025, the recommendation of the market research was to proceed with the evaluation of the two (2) proposals. Please refer to the attached Analysis of Market Availability.

Office of the Commission Auditor (OCA) Background Checks: SPD submitted CSC members' completed Neutrality Affidavits and resumes to OCA on August 27, 2025. A response was received on August 28, 2025. OCA submitted the results of the background checks to the Commission on Ethics and Public Trust (COE) for further review of findings. A response was received from COE regarding findings on October 10, 2025. A revised OCA response was received on October 16, 2025, which was also submitted to COE for further review of findings. A response was received from COE regarding findings on October 28, 2025.

Office of the Inspector General (OIG) / Office of the Commission on Ethics and Public Trust (COE) Reports, Findings and/or Enforcement Documentation for Proposer and Subcontractor(s):

SPD submitted a request to OIG on July 22, 2025. A response was received on July 24, 2025 advising that no reports were located.

SPD submitted a request to COE on July 22, 2025. A response was received on July 28, 2025 advising that no reports were located.

Selection Process: The Architectural and Engineering professional services solicitation process is a two-tiered selection process; First Tier is the evaluation of team members assigned to the project, firms' past experience of similar projects, firms' project staffing availability, and firms' performance data. The Second Tier is the evaluation of the shortlisted firms' qualifications of professional personnel and team members assigned to the project, knowledge of project scope and project approach, and proposer's project management methodology, as demonstrated through requested additional information and/or an oral presentation from firms.

First Tier Results: The First Tier meeting was held on November 21, 2025. The CSC was tasked with evaluating the experience and qualifications of the Proposers, and scoring and ranking the proposals in accordance with the evaluation criteria outlined in the solicitation. The CSC scored both proposals. Please refer to the attached First Tier Tabulation Sheet.

Second Tier Results: The Second Tier meeting was held on December 9, 2025. Highest ranked firm, ARCADIS US, INC., was recommended for negotiations by the CSC. Please refer to the attached Second Tier Tabulation Sheet.

Special Circumstances: This project experienced several delays. The CSC appointment was requested on June 6, 2025, and the CSC Appointment Memorandum was received on August 11, 2025 resulting in a delay of 20 days. A few days before the originally scheduled First Tier meeting on October 21, 2025, a CSC member indicated, after reviewing the proposals, that they had a conflict with one of the firms. This was not previously disclosed in their Neutrality Affidavit which required a revised Neutrality Affidavit, subsequent OCA review and a revised COE opinion, resulting in a delay of 30 days.
