RESOLUTION NO. R-191-07

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO
CONTINUE AND EXPAND THE HURRICANE SALES TAX
HOLIDAY

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 99-05 sponsored by Senator Javier D. Souto and adopted on January 20, 2005, this Board urged the Florida Legislature to adopt a Hurricane Sales Tax Holiday on personal hurricane supplies, such as batteries, flashlights, portable radios and bottled water, and on materials used to protect residential property from hurricanes, such as hurricane shutters, plywood, wind-resistant windows, generators, and materials used to build hurricane-safe rooms; and

WHEREAS, during the 2005 Legislative Session, the Florida Legislature passed HB 6001, which provided for a Hurricane Sales Tax Holiday from June 1, 2005 to June 12, 2005 on the sale of flashlights, portable radios, tarps, first-aid kits, tie-down kits, fuel tanks, batteries, coolers, and generators; and

WHEREAS, the Hurricane Sales Tax Holiday was the nation's first such holiday and was a great success in encouraging Floridians to prepare for hurricane season; and

WHEREAS, Floridians saved approximately \$10 million in sales tax during the 12-day 2005 sales tax holiday and many retailers sold out their entire stock of some hurricane supplies, such as generators, flashlights, and batteries; and

WHEREAS, during the 2006 Legislative Session, the Florida Legislature passed HB 47, which provided for a Hurricane Sales Tax Holiday from May 21, 2006 to June 1, 2006, leading up to the beginning of the 2006 hurricane season on June 1; and

WHEREAS, the popularity of the Hurricane Sales Tax Holiday increased substantially in 2006, with Floridians saving approximately \$41 million in sales tax; more than four times the amount saved in 2005; and

WHEREAS, the 2006 Hurricane Sales Tax Holiday was expanded to include, among other things, a small sales tax abatement for storm-shutter purchases; and

WHEREAS, an annual Hurricane Sales Tax Holiday sends the right message to Floridians to prepare for hurricanes in advance; and

WHEREAS, this Board considers the Hurricane Sales Tax Holiday to be worth repeating and expanding in 2007 to include additional sales tax abatements for hurricane shutters, wind-resistant windows, plywood to be used to cover windows, and materials used to build hurricane-safe rooms,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature during the 2007 Legislative Session to re-enact a Hurricane Sales Tax Holiday in the two weeks leading up to the start of the 2007 hurricane season.

Section 2. Urges the Florida Legislature to expand the 2007 Hurricane Sales Tax Holiday to include a larger sales tax abatement for hurricane shutters, wind-resistant windows, limited supplies of plywood to be used to cover windows, and materials used to build hurricane safe rooms, all in addition to the items included in the 2006 Hurricane Sales Tax Holiday.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for passage of legislation that re-adopts and expands the Hurricane Sales Tax Holiday, and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item in the 2007 State Legislative Package.

Section 4. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, and Chair and members of the Miami-Dade County State Legislative Delegation.

The foregoing resolution was sponsored by Senator Javier D. Souto and Commissioner Joe A. Martinez and offered by Commissioner Dennis C. Moss who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Dorrin D. Rolle and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:


