RESOLUTION APPROVING CONFIDENTIAL PROJECT NO. 07-00135 AS A QUALIFIED TARGET INDUSTRY BUSINESS PURSUANT TO FLORIDA STATUTES S-288.106, CONFIRMING THAT THE COMMITMENTS OF LOCAL FINANCIAL SUPPORT NECESSARY FOR CONFIDENTIAL PROJECT #07-00135 EXIST; AND PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION OF UP TO \$105,000 FROM GENERAL REVENUE FUNDS AS LOCAL PARTICIPATION IN THE STATE OF FLORIDA QUALIFIED TARGET INDUSTRY TAX REFUND PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEARS 2008 THROUGH 2018, INCLUSIVE, OR OVER A TIME PERIOD AS DETERMINED BY THE STATE OF FLORIDA IN ITS APPROVAL OF CONFIDENTIAL PROJECT #07-00135 APPLICATION WITH THE PROVISIO THAT ANY TAX ABATEMENT GRANTED TO CONFIDENTIAL PROJECT #07-00135 UNDER FLORIDA STATUTE 196.1995 REDUCES ANY QUALIFIED TARGET INDUSTRY TAX REFUND TO CONFIDENTIAL PROJECT #07-00135 BY THE AMOUNT OF ANY SUCH TAX ABATEMENT GRANTED, IN COMPLIANCE WITH FLORIDA STATUTE 288.106(5)9; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, Economic Impact Overview, and Application and Agreement, copies of which are incorporated herein by reference; and

**WHEREAS**, said industries include enterprises like Confidential Project #07-00135, that relocate, expand or otherwise increase their operations within the County, and which increase employment by at least ten (10) jobs,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that this Board hereby finds that attracting, retaining and providing favorable conditions for the growth of target industries provide quality employment opportunities for residents of the County and enhance the County's

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economic foundations and recommends that Confidential Project No. 07-00135 be approved as a qualified target industry business pursuant to Florida Statute 288.16, which created the Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund Program.

The necessary commitment of local financial support for Confidential Project #07-00135, as required under Florida Statute 288.106, exists in an amount not to exceed \$105,000 from General Revenue Funds; and that this local financial support will be available in the following increments:

or payable over a time period and at annual amounts as determined by the State of Florida in its approval of Confidential Project #07-00135 application, as long as the \$105,000 total is not exceeded with the proviso that any tax abatement granted to Confidential Project No. 07-00135, under Florida Statute 196.1995, reduces any QTI tax refund by the amount of any such abatement granted, in compliance with Florida Statute 288.106(5)(c); and will be paid to the Florida Economic Development Trust Fund with the stipulation that these funds are intended to represent the "local financial support" required by Florida Statute 288.106 for Confidential Project #07-00135 in compliance with the QTI Program, including the requirement that at least ten (10) jobs be created.

The necessary commitment of local financial support shall be contingent on Confidential Project No. 07-00135 maintaining the jobs during the life of the incentive and ensuring that its hiring practices are consistent with and reflect the diversity of the Miami-Dade County community.

The foregoing resolution was offered by Commissioner Dorrin D. Rolle, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Joe A. Martinez and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

Enclosed please find the QTI application for Confidential Project #07-00135, codename "Project Detect." The project has requested confidentiality and is covered by Florida State Statute Section 288.075.

Project Detect is considering the purchase of a manufacturing facility in Miami-Dade County. The project would renovate the site for the production of premium products and instruments for research and clinical applications.

The impact of this project will be significant and multifaceted. As a company within a targeted industry, Project Detect will bring 75 high paying jobs to the County over an 8 year period. Further, the project involves a \$21.1 million capital investment and will be located in an Enterprise Zone.

Our approach to the incentives was originally reviewed with County Manager Burgess in December 2006. We agreed that we wanted to be aggressive in our negotiations as the result would bring a high profile North East biopharmaceutical company to Miami-Dade that would further support Miami-Dade as a Bio Center. The competition is Baltimore and Northern New Jersey and incentives will play a significant if not deciding role in the final decision. Enterprise Florida has also committed to very aggressive approach to this project, fully supporting a lengthened QTI term as well as other incentive support.

The company is applying for a QTI/TJIF combination, which not only recognizes the new jobs being created, but also the significant capital being committed by the project. The QTI and TJIF combination has a ROI to the County of 1.1. We are recommending a QTI that will be extended through an 11 year period, and will include Enterprise Zone and Brownfield benefits. The State of Florida will support 80% of the QTI and 100% of the Brownfield Bonus. The County TJIF will include an 8 year period, extending by two years the usual TJIF term.

The QTI includes 75 new jobs created between 2008 and 2015, producing a maximum payout of \$105,000, paid over 11 years. Attached is the project economic impact analysis prepared by the Beacon Council's Research Department. The State of Florida will

## Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board approve the attached resolution that recommends Confidential Project #07-00135 be approved as a Qualified Target Industry (QTI) business. The attached documents relating to the support for a QTI tax refund, under the State of Florida QTI tax refund program pursuant to Florida Statutes Section 288.106, have been prepared by the Office of Community and Economic Development in conjunction with the Beacon Council.

## Scope

The business operations of this project will bring 75 high-quality, high-income jobs that will primarily impact Commission District 1, but also will have a positive countywide impact through indirect employment and multiplier effect.

## Fiscal Impact / Funding Source

The County uses general revenues to fund this incentive. Confidential Project No. 07-00135 has applied for \$105,000 in matching QTI State funds. In addition, the business is also applying for consideration of Targeted Job Incentive Fund (TJIF) incentive in the amount of \$733,450. This request is being brought to the Board under a separate item.

If both the QTI and TJIF incentives are approved, the County will provide a total of \$838,450 in economic development incentives to the business. The County's payout of both QTI and TJIF funds is being extended beyond the normal periods (usually six years and three years, respectively) to lessen the impact to the County of assisting through both programs.

## Track Record/Monitor

This is a new business for Miami-Dade County, so there is no local track record established.

QTI funds provided for job creation are provided as a matching basis upon the State of Florida invoicing the County for jobs created that the State has verified. In essence, the State monitors the creation of the QTI jobs.

**Background**

Confidential Project No. 07-00135 is a business involved in the bioscience/life sciences industry, and is currently looking at Baltimore, Maryland and New Jersey, in addition to Miami-Dade County, as possible locations to develop a facility for the production of premium products and instruments for research and clinical applications. pay the remaining 80% of the QTI, or \$420,000, over an 11 year period and will also pay 100% of the Brownfield Bonus applicable or \$150,000 also over the 11 year span.

The TJIF includes an 8 year payout of \$ 733,450 and recognizes the incremental increase in property taxes that will be created as a result of the significant new investment of capital.

We are expediting the QTI application because we are soon going to request a letter preserving inducement. The company is currently negotiating with the landlord for the site and it may need to make a decision quickly. The TJIF application will follow shortly. We request that once all the necessary application materials are submitted and that your review process is completed, that a resolution be prepared and placed on the agenda of an upcoming Economic Development and Human Services Committee.
