RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve the transfer of Passenger Motor Carrier Certificate of Transportation No. 273 from Personalized Transportation Services, Inc. d/b/a Carefree Transportation Service to Gregoire Eugene d/b/a Universal Limo & Airport Shuttle Service.

SCOPE

This Passenger Motor Carrier Certificate of Transportation is countywide, allowing the license holder to operate in unincorporated and incorporated areas of Miami-Dade County.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE

There is no fiscal impact to the County.

TRACK RECORD/MONITOR

Applicant is a permit holder with two taxicab medallions and one luxury sedan permit which are privately owned and operated by the applicant. Applicant will provide pre-arranged transportation scheduled at least 24-hours in advance. The Consumer Services Department will be responsible for monitoring this company.

BACKGROUND

On February 17, 1981, the Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance 81-17, subsequently amended by Ordinance 85-20 on April 16, 1985, which regulates the passenger motor carrier industry in Miami-Dade County under Chapter 31 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

Section 31-103 (m) of the Code provides the procedures to be followed by Miami-Dade County in processing transfer applications. No certificate may be sold, assigned or transferred to another until the proposed sale, assignment, or transfer has been approved by the County Commission. The Economic Development and Human Services Committee and Board of County Commissioners, in considering the proposed transfer of ownership or control of the certificate, shall determine, upon evidence submitted by the parties or any other party or person affected by the proposed transfer, whether or not said transfer is contrary to the public interest. The Commission may approve said transfer or refuse to approve said transfer upon such terms and conditions or may reasonably alter, restrict or modify the terms and provisions of such transfer where the same may best serve the public interest.

Personalized Transportation Services, Inc. d/b/a Carefree Transportation Service has filed an application to transfer Passenger Motor Carrier (PMC) Certificate of Transportation No. 273 to Gregoire Eugene d/b/a Universal Limo & Airport Shuttle Service. The Code requires that such transfers be approved by the Board. PMC No. 273, originally issued on March 17, 1998, to Progress Wholesale of America, Inc.; then transferred to Personalized Transportation Services, Inc. d/b/a Carefree Transportation Service on June 7, 2005, authorizes charter service. This class of service is defined as transportation of a group of persons pursuant to a common purpose and traveling under a single contract involving the exclusive use of a motor vehicle. Gregoire Eugene d/b/a Universal Limo & Airport Shuttle Service located at 15838 N.W. 7 Avenue, Miami, Florida, 33168, seeks to continue providing this class of service.

The company is required to adhere to the terms of the resolution, which approved the initial certificate (R-252-98, attached). Gregoire Eugene d/b/a Universal Limo & Airport Shuttle Service seeks to continue transporting resident and tourist groups to and from various locations throughout Miami-Dade County.

Transportation will be pre-arranged on a 24-hour minimum basis. These services will be provided seven days a week, 24 hours a day, using chauffeur driven vehicles with a seating capacity of nine or more, but less than 28 passengers, excluding the driver. The proposed rates are listed on the attached rate schedule.

The management plan submitted by Mr. Gregoire Eugene, President of Universal Limo & Shuttle Service includes maintenance, communication, and record keeping systems and meets the requirements of the Code. All required financial statements and credit references have been submitted and the proposed service standards adequately meet passenger transportation and comfort needs. A background investigation reveals no criminal conviction for the applicant or any corporate officers within five years of the date of the application.

As required by the Code, the applicant has provided disclosure of the terms and conditions regarding the transfer of the certificate. A Sales Agreement between Personalized Transportation Services, Inc. d/b/a Carefree Transportation Service and Gregoire Eugene d/b/a Universal Limo & Airport Shuttle Service establishes the acquisition by Gregoire Eugene d/b/a Universal Limo & Airport Shuttle Service of PMC Certificate of Transportation No. 273 for a total price of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00).

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve the transfer of Passenger Motor Carrier Certificate of Transportation No. 273 from Progress Wholesale of America, Inc. to Personalized Transportation Services, Inc. d/b/a Carefree Transportation Service.

BACKGROUND

On February 17, 1981, the Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance 81-17, subsequently amended by Ordinance 85-20 on April 16, 1985, which regulates the passenger motor carrier industry in Miami-Dade County under Chapter 31 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

Section 31-103 (m) of the Code provides the procedures to be followed by Miami-Dade County in processing transfer applications. No certificate may be sold, assigned or transferred to another until the proposed sale, assignment, or transfer has been approved by the County Commission. The Community Empowerment and Economic Revitalization Committee and Board of County Commissioners, in considering the proposed transfer of ownership or control of the certificate, shall determine, upon evidence submitted by the parties or any other party or person affected by the proposed transfer, whether or not said transfer is contrary to the public interest. The Code requires that such transfers be approved by the Board. PMC No. 273, originally issued on March 17, 1998, to Progress Wholesale of America, Inc. authorizes charter service. This class of service is defined as transportation of a group of persons pursuant to a common purpose and traveling under a single contract involving the exclusive use of a motor vehicle. Personalized Transportation Services, Inc. d/b/a Carefree Transportation Service located at 1031 5th Street, Miami Beach, Florida, 33139, seeks to continue providing this class of service.

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The company is required to adhere to the terms of the resolution, which approved the initial certificate (R-252-98, attached). Personalized Transportation Services, Inc. d/b/a Carefree Transportation Service seeks to continue transporting resident and tourist groups to and from various locations throughout Miami-Dade County.







- (6) Reduction of restrictive regulatory barriers to entry into the industry and promotion of equal opportunities.
- (7) Promotion of the safety and welfare of the residents and visitors of Miami-Dade County who use the services of passenger motor carriers to meet their transportation needs.

- (2) Coordination of regulatory decision-making with the transportation improvement plan, and the orderly development of an integrated transportation/transit system for Miami-Dade County so as to ensure the development and maintenance of a transportation/transit system responsive to the needs of the public, in which regulatory decisions are reached fairly and expeditiously, and with consideration of their costs and benefits.
- (3) Improvement of motor vehicle safety.
- (4) Achievement of County, national and State energy conservation goals.
- (5) Reduced concentration of market power, and prevention of unfair, deceptive, predatory or anticompetitive practices.
- (6) Reduction of restrictive regulatory barriers to entry into the industry and promotion of equal opportunities.
- (7) Promotion of the safety and welfare of the residents and visitors of Miami-Dade County who use the services of passenger motor carriers to meet their transportation needs.
