RESOLUTION URGING MUNICIPAL POLICE
DEPARTMENTS WITHIN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY
DESIGNATE AT LEAST ONE SWORN OFFICER TO ACT AS
A LIAISON WITH THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT
OF CHILDREN AND FAMILIES TO COORDINATE
INVESTIGATIONS REGARDING INCIDENTS OF ALLEGED
ABUSE OF THE ELDERLY

WHEREAS, incidents of elderly abuse are an increasing problem throughout Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida Department of Children and Families Adult Protective Services Program is charged with the responsibility to investigate and make recommendations regarding what, if any, action should be taken where there are allegations of elderly abuse; and

WHEREAS, a substantial number of claims of elderly abuse are initially reported to the municipal police departments located within Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County Police Department has already designated at least one officer to serve as a liaison between the Department of Children and Families and its proven to be an invaluable tool; and

WHEREAS, it would be of great benefit to the alleged victim of elderly abuse as well as the State of Florida Department of Children and Families to have a trained sworn law enforcement officer designated by each municipal police department to act as liaison with the Department of Children and Families to assist in the coordination and investigation of alleged abuse of the elderly,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that it is recommended that all police departments located within Miami-Dade County designate at least one sworn officer to act as a liaison between each police department and the State of Florida Department of Children and Families to coordinate referrals and investigation of alleged elderly abuse. Further, the Clerk of the Board is directed to disseminate this resolution to all municipalities within Miami-Dade County.

The foregoing resolution was sponsored by Commissioner Rebeca Sosa and offered by Commissioner Jose "Pepe" Diaz , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Carlos A. Gimenez and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:


