RESOLUTION NO. R-1012-07

**RESOLUTION URGING THE U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS TO ALLOW THE USE OF NON-DOMESTIC SAND FOR BEACH RENOURISHMENT; AND URGING THE U.S. CONGRESS TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR BEACH RENOURISHMENT PROJECTS IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY**

**WHEREAS**, Miami-Dade County beaches are critically important to the economy of the South Florida; and

**WHEREAS**, the Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) administers all federal beach erosion control projects; and

**WHEREAS**, the USACE has been unsuccessful in identifying domestic sand sources for the renourishment of Miami-Dade beaches; and

**WHEREAS**, the USACE is currently reviewing a USACE report to allow the use of non-domestic sand sources on a pending beach renourishment project in the City of Miami Beach; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board would like to recognize and thank the members of the Miami-Dade Congressional Delegation for their ongoing support of beach renourishment issues,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that this Board:

**Section 1.** Urges the United States Army Corps of Engineers to expedite the review of the report concerning the use of non-domestic sand sources by permitting the concurrent review of this report at the District, Division, and Headquarters levels.

**Section 2.** Urges the U.S. Congress to appropriate funds for Miami-Dade County beach renourishment projects.

**Section 3.** Directs the Clerk of this Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the members of the Miami-Dade County Congressional Delegation.

**Section 4.** Directs the County's federal lobbyists to advocate for the action set forth in Section 1 above and the passage of the legislation set forth in Section 2 above, and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include these items in the 2007 and 2008 Federal Legislative Package.

The foregoing resolution was sponsored by Chairman Bruno A. Barreiro and offered by Commissioner Jose "Pepe" Diaz, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Joe A. Martinez and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:


