**RESOLUTION SETTING THE PROPOSED FY 2007-08  
MILLAGE AND SPECIAL ASSESSMENT RATES AND  
SETTING THE DATE, TIME AND LOCATION OF THE  
PUBLIC BUDGET HEARINGS**

**WHEREAS**, Section 200.065, Florida Statutes, requires that each taxing authority advise the property appraiser of its proposed millage and special assessment rates within 35 days of certification of value so that the information can be included in the notice of proposed property taxes mailed to property owners in August and also establishes and describes the requirement that the governing body of each taxing authority hold public hearings on the tentative budget and proposed millage rates; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that the proposed millage and special assessment rates are approved as reflected in the attached memorandum for transmittal to the Property Appraiser and that the FY 2007-08 public budget hearings are scheduled for September 6, 2007, and September 20, 2007, at 5:01 p.m. in the Commission Chambers.

**Subject:** Setting of Proposed FY 2007-08 Millage and Special Assessment Rates and  
Scheduling of the Public Budget Hearings

## Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board approve the proposed millage and special assessment rates included in the FY 2007-08 Proposed Budget for use in preparing the "Notice of Proposed Property Taxes" to be mailed to all property owners in August.

## Background

State law requires that all property owners be advised of proposed property taxes along with notification of public budget hearings. The Property Appraiser will mail required notices to all property owners in August using proposed tax rates adopted by all taxing authorities in Miami-Dade County. The rates you set for millage rates, special benefit districts, and for special assessments will be used in the notice and will effectively represent the ceiling for all Miami-Dade taxes and fees that appear on the tax bill. As the Board is aware, millage rates and fees cannot be raised at the first budget hearing without again notifying all affected property owners by mail. At the second public budget hearing, millage rates cannot be increased above those adopted at the first budget hearing.

The millage rates included in the FY 2007-08 Proposed Budget conform to the property tax relief legislation adopted last month by the State Legislature. The statutes require Miami-Dade County to reduce the Countywide and Library District budgets by the equivalent of rollback plus an additional nine (9) percent reduction for FY 2007-08. UMMA will be treated as a municipality and based on our performance over the past five years measured by per capita tax levies, that budget will be reduced by rollback plus an additional five (5) percent. The Fire District budget will be reduced by rollback plus an additional three (3) percent. The maintenance of effort payment to the Public Health Trust will be held harmless by being removed from the calculation of rollback and then added back for purposes of setting the millage rate.

The Board may adopt millage rates higher than those dictated by the newly adopted legislation for inclusion in the TRIM notices by a simple majority. However, at the budget hearings in September, the Board of County Commissioners may only override these millage rates up to rollback by a two-thirds vote and may only set the millage rates above rollback up to flat millage rates by a three-fourths vote. Setting of a millage rate higher than in the previous year will now require a referendum. The penalty for violating these standards is the loss of state revenue from the local government half-cent sales tax for a period of twelve months.

As indicated in Attachment 1, the FY 2007-08 Proposed Budget recommends that the millage rates be set as follows:

- ~~Countywide services (for operating purposes): 4.5796 mills~~
- Unincorporated Municipal Service Area (UMSA) services: 2.0416 mills
- Fire-Rescue District services (for operating purposes): 2.2067 mills
- Miami-Dade Library System services 0.3842 mills.

The total millage rate of 9.5391 (including debt service millages) represents a 1.945 mills decrease from the FY 2006-07 combined millage rate and 2.175 mills less than the FY 2005-06 combined millage rate. The total millage rate of 9.5391 mills is the lowest since FY 1982-83. Attachment 2 indicates the 2007 Certified Tax Roll values for each of our taxing jurisdictions. Countywide ad-valorem revenue is decreased by \$66.992 million, unincorporated area ad-valorem revenue is decreased by \$7.5 million, Fire-Rescue District ad-valorem revenue is decreased by \$6.833 million, and Library System ad-valorem revenue is decreased by \$7.718 million from the budgeted revenues for FY 2006-07.

The recommended millage rates for countywide and Fire Rescue District voter-approved debt are recommended to remain at 0.285 mills and 0.042 mills, respectively, to meet all debt service requirements. As established in FY 2003-04, 0.105 of the Countywide operating millage rate continues to be used to fund an Emergency Contingency Reserve that will provide for emergencies and other exigencies that cannot be addressed through historical methods.

The County cannot hold either of its budget hearings on the date selected by the School Board, which has selected August 1 and September 5, 2007. The County's public budget hearings have been scheduled for 5:01 p.m. on Thursday, September 6, 2007, and Thursday, September 20, 2007, in the Commission Chambers. Those dates will be provided to the municipalities, who cannot hold their budget hearings on the same date as the County or the School Board.
