**RESOLUTION APPOINTING VOTING TRUSTEES TO
THE PUBLIC HEALTH TRUST BOARD OF TRUSTEES
FOR THE 2007-2010 TERM**

WHEREAS, in accordance with Chapter 25-A-3(d) of the Code of Miami-Dade County, the Public Health Trust Nominating Council convened for the purpose of determining its recommendation of nominees to be submitted to the Board of County Commissioners for appointment as voting trustees to the Public Health Trust Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, there are four (4) vacancies created by the expiration of the terms of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 25-A-3(d) further provides that the Public Health Trust Nominating Council shall submit to the Commission a list of nominees containing a total number of names equal to the number of vacancies plus the names of two (2) additional nominees and that the Commission shall select and appoint the voting trustees from that list; and

WHEREAS, as referenced in the attached Memorandum, the list of nominees is: ROSY CANCELA, WALTER JAMES HARVEY, ANGEL MEDINA, JR., SAIF YAMANI ISHOOF, CARLOS C. LOPEZ-CANTERA and MARIA SANCHEZ de VARONA,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board hereby appoints as voting trustees to the Public Health Trust Board of Trustees the following four (4)

3. Maria Sanchez de Varona.

Notwithstanding the Council's recommendation of Ms Sanchez de Varona to the Commission, in the interest of full disclosure, the Council noted that Ms. Sanchez de Varona's current employment with CAC Florida Medical Centers may present a conflict of interest. Ms. Sanchez de Varona advised the Council that she had sought advice from the legal department of CAC prior to applying for the position, and had been advised that there was no conflict from their point of view.

The slate of six (6) nominees is submitted for the Commission's consideration and for the selection and appointment of four (4) of them to fill the four (4) vacancies on the PHT Board of Trustees caused by the expiration of terms as of October 3, 2007. The terms of each of the four (4) voting trustees who will be appointed by the Commission will commence as of the effective date of the Resolution and will end October 3, 2010.

The PHT Nominating Council sincerely believes that the recommended list of nominees is both objective and balanced and in the best interest of the community.

BACKGROUND

As previously stated, Chapter 25A-3(d) of the Miami-Dade County Code provides that voting trustees of the PHT Board of Trustees shall be appointed by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners ("Commission"). In addition, it provides that the Nominating Council shall submit to the Commission a list of nominees containing a total number of names which is equal to one (1) nominee for each vacancy on the PHT Board plus two (2) additional nominees. The Commission shall select and appoint the voting trustees from the list of nominees submitted by the Nominating Council.

In accordance with the procedures of the Nominating Council, the Council placed advertisements for applicants which appeared on multiple occasions in the Miami Herald, El Nuevo Herald, Miami Times, Diario de Las Americas, Haiti en Marche and the Miami Today, Libre, South Dade Newsleader, and Sunpost Newspaper commencing June 13, 2007, through June 21, 2007. The ad was also posted on the Miami-Dade County website. The deadline for submission of applications was set as June 22, 2007.

On July 9, 2007, the PHT Nominating Council met to review each of the sixteen (16) applications and to select finalists to be interviewed. It was agreed that the Council would review the applications and attendance records of the incumbent applicants but that it was not necessary for the Council to interview the three incumbent applicants. Nine (9) new applicants were then selected to be interviewed. In accord with the procedures of the Nominating Council, both a criminal background check and media check were initiated on the incumbents applicants and all the new applicants selected for interview. The three incumbent applicants and eight of the nine new applicants completed the background screening process. The eight new applicants were interviewed by the Council on July 25, 2007.

During the July 25, 2007 PHT Nominating Council meeting, the Council voted to recommend that the three incumbent applicants be reappointed for a new term. The incumbent applicants are listed in alpha order as follows:

1. Rosy Cancela -- Incumbent
2. Walter James Harvey -- Incumbent
3. Angel Medina, Jr. -- Incumbent

The Council further voted unanimously to provide the recommended slate of new applicants in order of the Council's priority ranking. The nominees in priority ranking are as follows:

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners select and appoint four (4) voting trustees from the list of six (6) nominees being submitted by the Public Health Trust (PHT) Nominating Council for the 2007 appointments to the PHT Board of Trustees.

SCOPE

A recommended slate of candidates has been selected in accord with Chapter 25A-3(d) of the Miami-Dade County Code which states that the membership of the PHT Board of Trustees should be representative of the community and "should reflect the racial, gender, ethnic and disabled makeup of the community". Chapter 25A-3(d) provides that voting trustees of the PHT Board of Trustees shall be appointed by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners ("Commission") after the Nominating Council submits to the Commission a list of nominees containing a total number of names which is equal to one (1) nominee for each vacancy on the PHT Board plus two (2) additional nominees. The Commission shall select and appoint the voting trustees from the list of nominees submitted by the Nominating Council.

FISCAL IMPACT

This action has no fiscal impact to the County as the PHT Board members serve without compensation and are "entitled to reimbursement for necessary expenses, including the expense of performance bonds, incurred in the discharge of their duties". The expenses incurred by PHT Board members are funded by the PHT.

TRACK RECORD

The PHT Nominating Council has reviewed the applications and attendance records of the three applicants who are incumbents of the PHT Board of Trustees and has determined that their past performance is sufficient to warrant recommendation for an additional term of service. The PHT Nominating Council is recommending the appointment of the new applicants based on their interviews and their history of service to the community as described in their applications and resumes.

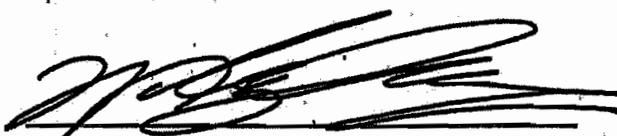

 Walter J. Harvey received his Bachelor's degree (B.A., *cum laude*, 1991) from the University of California San Diego and his law degree from Harvard Law School (J.D., 1995).

A member of the Firm's Litigation practice group, Mr. Harvey represents major corporations and government entities in matters throughout Florida and the United States. 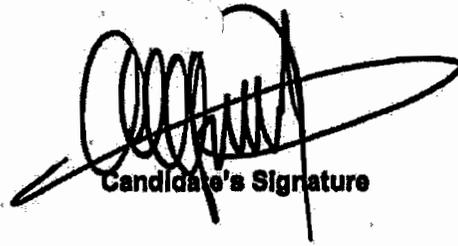

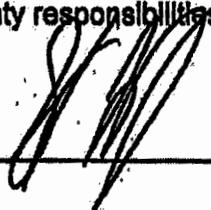

As a trustee of the Public Health Trust, there are a number of goals and objectives that I would wish to accomplish. The first goal would be to see the implementation of intelligent Information Technology systems which can minimize informational inefficiencies in the system, and this would be accomplished both through substantive training for PHT employees and the establishment of strategic technological partnerships with companies and organizations which are already on the cutting edge of this arena. A health system merely being chartless is insufficient, the real strength of information technology are seamless and pervasive systems that are constantly updating users and generators of information while learning all the while. While most major health institutions talk greatly about the use of the internet, most have failed to really harvest the power of the web in providing service automation features like appointment scheduling, intelligent data mining, the PHT has the unique opportunity to lead this wave.

A second area I would like to see positive movement on, is the implementation of massive preventive medicine outreach programs throughout the territory that the PHT covers. By this I mean the sponsorship of en masse breast cancer screenings, blood work analysis, and the crafting of wellness initiatives with other large governmental institutions, private sector entities, and schools. If this program were to be managed effectively, the ultimate savings to the PHT would be in the billions over a schedule of ten years, because it would mean many patient illnesses would have been treated as interventions rather than as midnight reactions flooding our ER. By having many of these services rendered by existing community based organizations which have to provide such services under competitive terms, the PHT would be able to cost effectively fulfill this mandate.

The third and final arena that I would like work on as an organizational goal, is boosting PHT's reputation as a learning organization. This can be accomplished both through the investment in educational training for PHT medical staff, nursing staff, as well as through a commitment to serious interdisciplinary learning programs. Additionally, the PHT should make it a priority to invest heavily in medical education programs in those neighboring nations that provide the bulk of our medical tech support staff, and in this way we are training future employees for our standards without depleting the resources of impoverished nations. I would also see to it that such programs result in the stemming the tide of brain drain of critical medical services from our poorer neighbors.

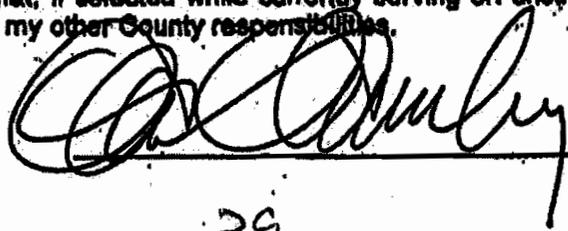

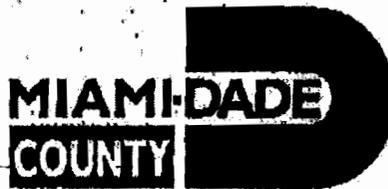

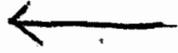
