RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve the transfer of Passenger Motor Carrier Certificate of Transportation No. 329 from Brickell Transportation, Inc. to Quality Limo Service, Corp. d/b/a QLS Transportation Service.

SCOPE

This Passenger Motor Carrier Certificate of Transportation is countywide, allowing the license holder to operate in unincorporated and incorporated areas of Miami-Dade County.

FISCAL IMPACT/FUNDING SOURCE

There is no fiscal impact to the County.

TRACK RECORD/MONITOR

Applicant is a new service provider. The Consumer Services Department will be responsible for monitoring this company.

BACKGROUND

On February 17, 1981, the Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance 81-17, subsequently amended by Ordinance 85-20 on April 16, 1985, which regulates the passenger motor carrier industry in Miami-Dade County under Chapter 31 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

Section 31-103 (m) of the Code provides the procedures to be followed by Miami-Dade County in processing transfer applications. No certificate may be sold, assigned or transferred to another until the proposed sale, assignment, or transfer has been approved by the County Commission. The Economic Development and Human Services Committee and Board of County Commissioners, in considering the proposed transfer of ownership or control of the certificate, shall determine, upon evidence submitted by the parties or any other party or person affected by the proposed transfer, whether or not said transfer is contrary to the public interest. The Commission may approve said transfer or refuse to approve said transfer upon such terms and conditions or may reasonably alter, restrict or modify the terms and provisions of such transfer where the same may best serve the public interest.


Brickell Transportation, Inc. has filed an application to transfer Passenger Motor Carrier (PMC) Certificate of Transportation No. 329 to Quality Limo Service, Corp. d/b/a QLS Transportation Service. The Code requires that such transfers be approved by the Board. PMC No. 329, originally issued on December 16, 1999, to S & V Tour of Miami, Inc., then transferred to Brickell Transportation, Inc., on October 8, 2002, authorizes special operations services. This class of service is defined as the transportation of persons in a motor vehicle to a common destination or series of common destinations where the person may be charged as an individual or as part of a group, including but not limited to charter, sightseeing, or subscription service, not between fixed terminals or on a regular route. Quality Limo Service, Corp. d/b/a QLS Transportation Service located at 2114 N. Flamingo Road, Suite 1115, Pembroke Pines, Florida 33028, seeks to continue providing this class of service.

The company is required to adhere to the terms of the resolution, which approved the initial certificate (R-1340-99, attached). Quality Limo Service, Corp. d/b/a QLS Transportation Service seeks to continue transporting resident and tourist groups to and from various locations throughout Miami-Dade County.

Transportation will be pre-arranged on a 24-hour minimum basis. These services will be provided seven days a week, 24 hours a day, using chauffeur driven vehicles with a seating capacity of nine or more, but less than 28 passengers, excluding the driver. The proposed rates are listed on the attached rate schedule.

The management plan submitted by Mr. Hernan Escobar, President of Quality Limo Service, Corp. d/b/a QLS Transportation Service includes maintenance, communication, and record keeping systems and meets the requirements of the Code. All required financial statements and credit references have been submitted and the proposed service standards adequately meet passenger transportation and comfort needs. A background investigation reveals no criminal conviction for the applicant or any corporate officers within five years of the date of the application.

As required by the Code, the applicant has provided disclosure of the terms and conditions regarding the transfer of the certificate. A Sales Agreement between Brickell Transportation, Inc. and Quality Limo Service, Corp. d/b/a QLS Transportation Service establishes the acquisition by Quality Limo Service, Corp. d/b/a QLS Transportation Service of PMC Certificate of Transportation No. 329 for a total price of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00).

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

ARTICLE III. PASSENGER MOTOR
CARRIERS*

Sec. 31-101. Transportation policy.

To assure the development and maintenance of a safe, healthy and efficient passenger transportation system for Miami-Dade County, the Commission, County Manager and County staff, in carrying out the duties and responsibilities prescribed in this article, shall consider the following as being in the public interest:

- (1) Reliance on market forces and on actual and potential competition among all transportation modes, so as to provide transportation services at competitive prices.
- (2) Coordination of regulatory decision-making with the transportation improvement plan, and the orderly development of an integrated transportation/transit system for Miami-Dade County so as to ensure the development and maintenance of a transportation/transit system responsive to the needs of the public, in which regulatory decisions are reached fairly and expeditiously, and with consideration of their costs and benefits.
- (3) Improvement of motor vehicle safety.
- (4) Achievement of County, national and State energy conservation goals.
- (5) Reduced concentration of market power, and prevention of unfair, deceptive, predatory or anticompetitive practices.
- (6) Reduction of restrictive regulatory barriers to entry into the industry and promotion of equal opportunities.
- (7) Promotion of the safety and welfare of the residents and visitors of Miami-Dade County who use the services of passenger motor carriers to meet their transportation needs.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve the application of S & V Tour of Miami, Inc. for a Passenger Motor Carrier Certificate of Transportation to provide pre-arranged special operations service.

BACKGROUND

On February 17, 1981, the Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance 81-17, subsequently amended by Ordinance 85-20 on April 16, 1985, which regulates the passenger motor carrier industry in Miami-Dade County under Chapter 31 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

Section 31-103 of the Code provides the procedures to be followed by Miami-Dade County in processing certificate applications. Based on those requirements, a public hearing has been scheduled before the Board of County Commissioners. At the conclusion of the public hearing the Board may issue or refuse to issue the certificate, or issue the certificate with such modifications or upon such terms and conditions as in its judgment the public interest may require. In reaching its determination, the Board shall consider the application, the County Manager's report and recommendation, all matters presented at the public hearing, and among others, the following criteria:

- (1) That the applicant is fit, willing and able in accordance with the requirements of this section, to provide the transportation to be authorized by this certificate and is able to comply with this article and regulations of the commission.
- (2) That the transportation to be provided under the requested certificate is consistent with the public interest.
- (3) That the proposed transportation service will improve the quality of transportation available to the public.

ANALYSIS

S & V Tour of Miami, Inc., located at 600 N.E. 25 Street, Suite 21, Miami, Florida 33137, seeks to obtain a Passenger Motor Carrier Certificate of Transportation to provide pre-arranged special operations service transportation to passengers throughout all of Miami-Dade County. This class of service is defined as the transportation of persons to a common destination or series of common destinations where the person may be charged as an individual or as part of a group, including but not limited to charter, sightseeing, or subscription service. not between fixed terminals or on a regular route.

The company is a tour operator that seeks to transport tourists and resident groups to and from various locations throughout Miami-Dade County. Transportation will be pre-arranged on a 24-hour minimum basis. These services will be provided seven days a week, 24 hours a day, using chauffeur-driven vehicles with a seating capacity of nine or more, but less than 28 passengers, excluding the driver. The proposed rates are listed on the attached rate schedule.

The management plan submitted by Mr. Miguel Simisterra, President of S & V Tour of Miami, Inc., includes maintenance, communication, and record keeping systems and meets the requirements of the Code. All required financial statements and credit references have been submitted and the proposed service standards adequately meet passenger transportation and comfort needs. A background investigation reveals no criminal conviction for the applicant or any corporate officers within five years of the date of the application.

In accordance with Section 31-103(e) of the Code, a 20-day notice of application was provided to all affected municipalities within Miami-Dade County, all passenger motor carrier certificate holders and interested parties. No protests were filed.

This application was filed prior to the adoption of R-1404-98 which provides that new applications will not be received by the department after December 15, 1998; however, applications on file will be processed for Board consideration.

- (c) Has not paid the fines, if any, and towing and storage fees within ten (10) days of denial of a motion to vacate a default determination pursuant to Section 31-94(E)(5); or
 - (d) Has not paid the fines, if any, and towing and storage fees within ten (10) days after a notice was mailed by the CSD to the owner that the County will not pursue the remedy of forfeiture pursuant to Section 31-94 herein.
- (3) In the event that a vehicle has been deemed abandoned pursuant to paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection (H), the CSD shall mail to the owner a notice that the vehicle has been recovered by CSD as an abandoned vehicle and that, if unclaimed, its ownership shall vest in Miami-Dade County and it will be sold at public auction or by bid after ten (10) days from the date such notice was mailed. Such notice shall also be mailed to any lienholder or mortgagee shown in the records of the jurisdiction which issued the number of license plates on the vehicle.
- (4) An owner, lienholder or mortgagee may claim the vehicle within ten (10) days from the date that the notice described in paragraph (3) of this subsection (H) was mailed, by paying the towing and storage fees due and any fine(s).

- (5) Reduced concentration of market power, and prevention of unfair, deceptive, predatory or anticompetitive practices.
- (6) Reduction of restrictive regulatory barriers to entry into the industry and promotion of equal opportunities.
- (7) Promotion of the safety and welfare of the residents and visitors of Miami-Dade County who use the services of passenger motor carriers to meet their transportation needs.


