RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO ENACT A STUDENT LOAN FORGIVENESS PROGRAM FOR TEACHERS, PROSECUTORS, AND PUBLIC DEFENDERS

**WHEREAS**, approximately two-thirds of college graduates in 2006 have student loans; and

**WHEREAS**, large student loan repayments can prevent recent graduates from going into government, nonprofit, and teaching jobs; and

**WHEREAS**, loan repayment assistance programs help college graduates who take lower paying government or public service jobs to repay their student loans; and

WHEREAS, the current average starting salary for teachers in Florida is currently approximately \$30,000; and

WHEREAS, current average starting salaries for assistant state attorneys and assistant public defenders in Florida are currently approximately \$40,000; and

**WHEREAS**, many graduates from law schools have accumulated educational debt in excess of \$80,000 for their undergraduate and law school degrees; and

WHEREAS, the first choice of some law school graduates is to become a prosecutor or public defender but often they find that they can't afford to accept these positions because of student loans; and

WHEREAS, Florida will need more than 116,000 teachers over the next five years, but Florida public and private colleges of education with state approved teacher preparation programs are projected to produce only 30,000 new teachers during this same period; and

WHEREAS, Florida currently has a student Loan Forgiveness Program for teachers, but it is limited to areas where there are critical teacher shortages, such as math, science, foreign languages and exceptional student programs; and

WHEREAS, more efforts need to be made to encourage students to go into teaching and to encourage law students to accept positions as assistant state attorneys and assistant public defenders,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

<u>Section 1.</u> Urges the Florida Legislature to enact a student loan forgiveness program for teachers, assistant state attorneys, and assistance public defenders.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of the resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, and the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade County State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the actions set forth in Section 1 and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item in the 2008 State Legislative Package.

The foregoing resolution was sponsored by Commissioner Rebeca Sosa and Commissioner Jose "Pepe" Diaz and offered by Commissioner Rebeca Sosa , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Jose "Pepe" Diaz and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
