Subject: Resolution authorizing the receipt and expenditure of US HUD funds as per the National Affordable Housing Act to provide housing and services to eligible homeless persons

**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board authorizes the Mayor or his designee to receive and expend, an amount not to exceed, \$1,705,310 from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (US HUD) as per the National Affordable Housing Act for Supportive Housing Programs. These programs provide housing and intensive supportive services to eligible homeless persons through the Miami-Dade County Homeless Trust (Homeless Trust). The attached Resolution also authorizes the Mayor or his designee to: 1) execute such contracts and agreements with US HUD and not for profit homeless housing and services providers, as required, following approval by the County Attorney's Office; 2) expend any and all monies received for the purpose described in the funding request; 3) receive and expend additional funds should they become available under this program for this purpose; and 4) file and execute any necessary amendments to the application, modifications, renewals, cancellations, and termination clauses of any contracts or agreements, for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

**Scope**

Homeless individuals will be housed in scattered-site apartments throughout Miami-Dade County and provided with intensive case management, psychiatric, substance abuse, medical and other needed social services.

**Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

This program, which will serve 65 chronically homeless persons per year at an annual cost of approximately \$24,665 per person (approximately \$1.603 million annually, costing \$3.206 million over the two year term, is extremely cost effective as it usually costs the County twice the amount when these individuals occupy our jails, crisis stabilization units, and emergency rooms.

The application brings \$1,705,310 in new funding into our community. US HUD requires a 25 percent match for supportive services and a 20 percent match for operations. While contracted providers typically cover the entire match, the Homeless Trust will also provide matching funds from Food & Beverage Tax proceeds. The total cash match to the grant over the two-year term is \$1,501,116 from both Camillus House (\$501,116) and the Homeless Trust (\$1 million). The \$500,000 match from the Homeless Trust for the current year was approved by the Board of as part of the FY 2007-08 Budget.

**Background**

The US HUD Super NOFA (Notice of Funding Availability) calls for local communities to develop a community-wide consolidated application process with identified needs and gaps. This process requires the development of an annual analysis of the community's homeless housing and service gaps and needs, as well as homeless funding priorities. Miami-Dade County, through the Homeless Trust, is serving as the coordinating agency and applicant for the entire Miami-Dade community.

Through the process the Homeless Trust identified community priorities for Homeless services. The highest priority is permanent supportive housing for chronically homeless individuals who are frequently at



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jails, behavioral health services and emergency rooms. This program design works in conjunction with Judge Steve Leifman's Criminal Mental Health project.

In July 2007, the Homeless Trust, the designated lead agency for McKinney Homeless programs in our community, submitted a consolidated application to US HUD requesting federal funds for the development of housing and supportive services for homeless persons. The application contained 78 renewal projects and potential funds for one new project in the amount of \$1,705,310 for a two-year term for Camillus House.

**Track Record/Monitor**

The Homeless Trust is responsible for the overall administration of the grant. Camillus House, the most diverse agency in our Community serving homeless individuals and families, is the sub-recipient of this grant selected through a competitive request for application (RFA) process.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO RECEIVE, AND EXPEND FUNDS FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT AS PER THE NATIONAL AFFORDABLE HOUSING ACT FOR THE SUPPORTIVE HOUSING PROGRAM FOR CONTINUUM OF CARE HOMELESS ASSISTANCE

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA** that this the Board authorize the Mayor or his designee to receive and expend an amount not to exceed \$1,705,310 from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development as per the National Affordable Housing Act, Supportive Housing Programs for the purposes of providing housing and services to eligible homeless persons through the Miami-Dade County Homeless Trust; to execute such contracts and agreements with the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development and not for profit homeless housing and services providers, as are required, following approval by the County Attorney's Office; to expend any and all monies received for the purpose described in the funding request; to receive and expend additional funds should they become available under this program for this purpose; and to file and execute any necessary amendments to the application, modifications, renewals, cancellations, and termination clauses of any contracts or agreements, for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County, Florida.
