

Resolution No. R-651-08

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners select Mr. Eric Tietig to fill the seat for Nursery Industry Representative #1 on the Agricultural Practices Study Advisory Board (APSAB) as recommended by the Florida Nursery, Growers and Landscape Association (FNGLA). This seat will have a term of three years, ending December 2010, with the option to reappoint for a second term.

Scope

The Agricultural Practices Study Advisory Board has a countywide impact.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

There is no fiscal impact to the County.

Track Record/Monitor

This section regarding vendors does not apply.

Background

The APSAB consists of thirteen members representing a variety of agricultural industries. The term for the member filling the Nursery Industry Representative #1 seat expired on December 31, 2007. Section 2-932, Code of Miami-Dade County, requires that the Board of County Commissioners appoint vacancies occurring on the Agricultural Board. This seat will have a term of three years, and will end December 2010. The new representative will be eligible for a second term.


The nominating organization is required to submit resumes of two qualified individuals to represent them on the APSAB, and is encouraged to recommend the member they wish to have appointed as representative. The FNGLA nominations are Mr. Eric Tietig and Mr. Neal Spencer, with the recommendation that Mr. Eric Tietig be appointed.

Mr. Tietig is Vice President of Pine Island Nursery and is the former president of FNGLA. He has served on various other agricultural boards, such as the Tropical Fruit Growers of South Florida and the Dade County Farm Bureau, as well as on several citizens' advisory boards pertaining to agriculture. Mr. Neal Spencer is the co-owner of Castlerock Nursery/Bayside Tree Farms and has worked in managerial positions for local row crop growers since 1995.

As a matter of disclosure, both these individuals serve on the Farm Bureau Board of Directors, an organization that holds private meetings. Currently four other members of the twenty-seven Farm Bureau Board of Directors serve on the ABSAB. The appointment of another member serving on the same boards could increase the potential risk of a Sunshine Law violation and may also hinder discussions and decisions within the Farm Bureau.

RESOLUTION APPROVING APPOINTMENT TO THE

WHEREAS, Sections 2-931, 2-932 and 2-933 of the Code of Miami-Dade County provide for the creation, composition, terms, purpose, and duties of the Agricultural Practices Study Advisory Board (APSAB); and

WHEREAS, a term on the APSAB has expired for Nursery Industry Representative #1; and

WHEREAS, Section 2-932 of the Code of Miami-Dade County directs that vacancies on the APSAB are to be filled by the Board of County Commissioners from a slate of nominees selected by the County Manager through a process to be implemented by the Department of Planning and Zoning (DP&Z); and

WHEREAS, the Florida Nursery, Growers and Landscape Association (FNGLA) has submitted résumés for Eric Tietig and Neal Spencer and has recommended Mr. Eric Tietig as Nursery Industry Representative #1; and

WHEREAS, the County Manager identifies the following slate of nominees (résumés attached) to the APSAB: Eric Tietig and Neal Spencer,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that Eric Tietig, representing the nursery industry, is hereby appointed to the Agricultural Practices Study Advisory Board for a three-year term to expire December 31, 2010.
