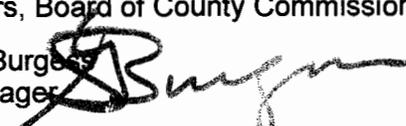

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board adopt the attached resolution approving the appointment of Commissioner Michelle Spence-Jones and Juan Carlos Palacios to the Tourist Development Council for the balance of two (2) four-year terms expiring in December 2009.

BACKGROUND

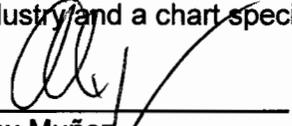
On April 4, 1978, the Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance No. 78-28 pursuant to State Statute No. 125.0104, establishing the Tourist Development Council (TDC). The Ordinance and Statute specify that the TDC is a nine (9) member volunteer board that includes: a County Commissioner, who is appointed by the chair of the governing Board of the County; two (2) elected municipal officials, at least one of whom must be from the most populous municipality in the County; three (3) owners or operators of motels, hotels, or other tourist accommodations in the County and subject to the tourist development tax; and three (3) persons involved in the tourist industry and have verifiably demonstrated interest in the tourist development of Miami-Dade County but who are not owners or operators of motels, hotels, or other tourist accommodations in the County and are subject to the tourist development tax.

Further, all members of the TDC must be electors of the County and shall serve staggered terms of four years as determined in the appointing resolution. As a result of a vacancy on the TDC Board due to a member moving outside of Miami-Dade County, a public nomination process was implemented to fill the balance of a four-year term expiring in December 2009. The vacant seat requires an individual that is an owner or operator of motels, hotels, or other tourist accommodations in the County and subject to the tourist development tax.

In response to the advertisement for nominations, credentials of eligible candidates for the TDC were submitted and reviewed by the TDC Nomination Committee. Present at the meeting were: Commissioner Jose "Pepe" Diaz, Chairperson, Tourist Development Council; Stuart Blumberg, President & CEO, Greater Miami & the Beaches Hotel and Motel Association; and William Talbert, III, President & CEO, Greater Miami Convention and Visitors Bureau. Based on a thorough review of qualifications, the TDC Nomination Committee selected the recommended candidate, Juan Carlos Palacios, and unanimously voted to recommend this candidate to the Board of County Commissioners to fill this vacancy on the TDC Board. On June 10, 2008, the TDC met and endorsed this recommendation.

In addition, the City of Miami Commission recently notified the Tourist Development Council that Commissioner Michelle Spence-Jones had been appointed by resolution to serve as a member of the Council for the seat requiring an elected official of the most populous municipality in the county.

Attached is the City of Miami's resolution appointing Commissioner Spence-Jones to the Tourist Development Council and Mr. Palacios' biography summarizing his extensive experience in the tourism industry and a chart specifically identifying their professional or civic affiliations and designated terms.

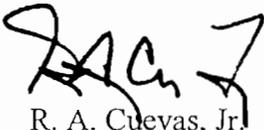

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE APPOINTMENT OF TWO
(2) MEMBERS TO THE TOURIST DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL

WHEREAS, On April 4, 1978, the Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance No. 78-28, establishing the Tourist Development Council; and

WHEREAS, the Ordinance directs that each member of the Tourist Development Council shall be appointed by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Ordinance specifies that the Tourist Development Council shall be composed of 9 members, including a County Commissioner, who is appointed by the chair of the governing Board of the County, two (2) elected municipal officials, three (3) owners or operators of motels, hotels, or other tourist accommodations in the county and subject to the tourist development tax and three (3) persons involved in the tourist industry but who are not owners or operators of motels, hotels or other tourist accommodations in the County subject to the tourist development tax; and

WHEREAS, the Ordinance specifies that all members of the Council must be electors of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Ordinance specifies that Council members shall serve staggered terms of four years as determined in the appointing resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Ordinance specifies that any member of the Council who ceases to be a qualified elector of Dade County shall immediately forfeit his or her office and the County Commission shall fill the vacancy created thereby by appointment; and

WHEREAS, the Ordinance specifies that there shall be at least one elected municipal official from the most populous municipality in the county and the County Commission shall fill this seat thereby by appointment; and

WHEREAS, it is recommended that Commissioner Michelle Spence-Jones and Juan Carlos Palacios be appointed to the Council to fill these positions,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that the Board approves the appointment of two (2) members to the Tourist Development Council:
