Subject: Resolution Requesting Authority to Exercise Option-to-Renew Periods Under Existing Non-Competitive Contracts that Would Bring the Cumulative Contract Value to More than \$100,000

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners delegate to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee the authority to exercise, in his discretion, the Options-to-Renew (OTRs) set forth in this item when in the best interest of Miami-Dade County. Ordinance #07-139 provides for committee review exemption. **Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on estimated past usage. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments and/or agencies.**

Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying OTR package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The accompanying OTR package states the allocation amount and funding source for each department utilizing a contract. **Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures as approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board.**

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the accompanying OTR package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the accompanying agenda item.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise OTRs in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contracts listed in the accompanying package.

Background

The non-competitive contracts listed in this item require approval to exercise OTRs contained in each contract that would, if exercised, bring the cumulative value of the contract over \$100,000. Each of the contracts were awarded under the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee's delegated authority (\$100,000 for non-competitive procurements) pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b) of the County Code and the Master Procurement Administrative Order, A.O. 3-38.

Prior to exercising any Options-to-Renew (OTR) periods, market research is conducted to ensure continuing to purchase from the awarded vendors is in the best interest of the County. Market research includes competitive factors such as pricing, quality, product features, technology, and lead time. It may also include commercial factors such as environmental issues, other governmental entity practices, industry trends, support and capabilities. The OTRs for each contract in this package will be executed if determined to be in the best interest of the County.

Item No. 1: Waukesha Engine Parts and Service seeks authority to exercise the first OTR period for a contract to purchase original equipment manufacturer (OEM) parts and services for Waukesha engines owned by the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department. The amount being requested for the first option year is **\$80,000**.

Item No. 2: Draeger SCBA Leasing, Maintenance and Parts seeks authority to exercise the first OTR period for a contract to lease Self-Contained Breathing Apparatuses (SCBA) and to purchase maintenance parts for existing Draeger's SCBA equipment for the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department. The amount being requested for the first option year is **\$100,000**.

Item No. 3: Heat Pump Rental Services seeks authority to exercise the first OTR period for a contract to rent pumps to heat generators at Miami International Airport. The amount being requested for the first option year is **\$57,300**.

Description: It is recommended that the Board authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise the first Option-to-Renew (OTR) period to purchase original equipment manufacturer (OEM) parts and services, provided by Regan Equipment Co., Inc., for 18 Waukesha engines owned by the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD). The contract is in its initial term which expires on January 31, 2009. Exercising the first OTR will bring the cumulative value of the contract over \$100,000.

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JUSTIFICATION

This contract provides for purchase of original equipment manufacturer (OEM) parts and maintenance and support services, provided by Regan Equipment Co., Inc., for 18 Waukesha engines owned by the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department. Regan Equipment Co., Inc. is the only authorized distributor of Waukesha Engine parts and services in Florida. The engines are the only source of emergency electrical power available for well field pumps to transfer water in the event electrical power is disrupted. They are also critical to the daily operation of well fields and pump stations in order to reduce the potential for a boil-water order and/or a waste water spill when there is loss of power.

Regan Equipment Co., Inc is the only vendor in Florida that can provide technicians certified by Waukesha Engines to perform these maintenance services. Purchasing parts and services from Reagan Equipment Co. Inc. ensures that the OEM specifications are met and parts and repairs will be under warranty. The current term expires on January 31, 2009. Exercising the next option-to-renew will bring the cumulative value of the contract to \$160,000.

Contract Title: **Draeger SCBA Leasing and Maintenance/Parts**

Description: It is recommended that the Board authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise the first option-to-renew (OTR) period to lease Self-Contained Breathing Apparatuses (SCBA) and to purchase maintenance parts for existing SCBA equipment used by Miami-Dade Fire Rescue firefighters provided by Draeger Safety, Inc. The contract is in its initial term which expires on November 30, 2008. Exercising the first OTR will bring the cumulative value of the contract over \$100,000.

JUSTIFICATION

This contract provides the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department (MDFR) with the ability to lease 50 Draeger Self-Contained Breathing Apparatuses (SCBA), and purchase of maintenance parts for existing Draeger's SCBA equipment used by MDFR firefighters. Currently, MDFR has approximately 650 units requiring maintenance.

To replace the aging fleet of Draeger SCBAs, MDFR purchased SCBA equipment from Scott Health and Safety. MDFR has not been able to place these new units in service due to failures and defects that have not been resolved with the manufacturer. The County is currently in litigation to resolve these issues. Since the new units cannot be used, MDFR needs to keep the existing Draeger SCBAs properly functioning for safety purposes.

The National Fire Protection Association and the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health that require all fire personnel be trained and certified on respiratory equipment used in firefighting operations. Professional standards also require that personnel receive a personally issued mask, and in some cases, regulators. As such, it is not feasible for MDFR to lease or introduce equipment from other manufacturers with different training procedures and incompatible masks and regulators. Due to training and compatibility issues, it is critical that MDFR's fleet of SCBA equipment be purchased from a single manufacturer.

Description: It is recommended that the Board authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise the first Option-to-Renew (OTR) period to rent pumps to heat generators at the Miami International Airport for the Miami-Dade Aviation Department (MDAD). The current contract is in its initial one-year term which expires on December 31, 2008. Exercising the first OTR will bring the cumulative value of the contract over \$100,000.

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JUSTIFICATION

This contract is used by the Miami-Dade Aviation Department (MDAD) to provide heating services for diesel generators at the Miami International Airport.

MDAD has 26 diesel generators which provide electrical back-up to run the emergency circuit in case of power failure. The internal combustion engine of these generators must be kept at a predetermined temperature to allow them to start instantly in case of power failure. Pumps are used to heat generators and keep them at a constant temperature during all times.

Geo-Thermal Systems, Inc. is the sole source authorized company of the US patent heat pump system specifically designed to operate with diesel engines. Approval of the first Option-to-Renew period will ensure continuity of services to the County.

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
