

RESOLUTION NO. R-1388-08

RESOLUTION URGING THE CENTERS FOR MEDICARE  
AND MEDICAID SERVICES WITHIN THE U.S.  
DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES TO  
RESCIND THE SIGNATURE REQUIREMENT FOR PATIENTS  
TRANSPORTED BY PUBLIC EMERGENCY MEDICAL  
SERVICE TRANSPORT

**WHEREAS**, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services within the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services adopted a new rule effective January 1, 2008 that required a patient signature for Medicare emergency medical services (EMS) transport, including public EMS transport, 42 C.F.R. § 424.36; and

**WHEREAS**, the very reason a patient needs public EMS transportation often runs counter to the appropriateness of attempting to obtain a signature from the patient; and

**WHEREAS**, many patients are in physical distress, unconscious, or of diminished mental capacity due to age or illness; and

**WHEREAS**, the previous rule required public EMS transportation providers to document that the patient was unable to sign, to specify the reason the patient was unable to sign and to indicate that no one else was available to sign for the patient; and

**WHEREAS**, the new rule requires a patient signature regardless of the patient's condition, with limited and cumbersome exceptions; and

**WHEREAS**, the new rule was intended to curtail Medicare fraud, but there have not been allegations of fraud among public EMS transportation providers; and

**WHEREAS**, if the appropriate documentation cannot be obtained, then the patient is responsible for the cost of the public EMS transportation; and

**WHEREAS**, making the patient responsible results in many senior citizens receiving bills for public EMS transportation; and

**WHEREAS**, the signature requirement has resulted in more than \$2.1 million in lost revenue to the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department since January 1, 2008; and

**WHEREAS**, city and county fire departments have realized lost revenue from the signature requirement,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that this Board:

**Section 1.** Urges the Administrator of the Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services within the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services to rescind the signature requirement for patients transported by public EMS providers.

**Section 2.** Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the members of the Florida Congressional Delegation and the Administrator of the Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services.

**Section 3.** Directs the County's federal lobbyists to advocate for the action set forth in Section 1 above, and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item in the 2009 Federal Legislative Package.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Carlos A. Gimenez and the Co-Sponsor is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner **Rebeca Sosa**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Joe A. Martinez** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
