Subject: Resolution Requesting Authority to Exercise Option-to-Renew Periods Under Existing Competitively Bid Contracts that Would Bring the Cumulative Contract Value to More than \$1 Million

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners delegate to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee the authority to exercise, in his discretion, the Options-to-Renew (OTRs) set forth in this item when in the best interest of Miami-Dade County. Ordinance #07-139 provides for committee review exemption. **Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on estimated past usage. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments and/or agencies.**

Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying OTR package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The accompanying OTR package states the allocation amount and funding source for each department utilizing a contract. **Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board.**

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the accompanying OTR package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the accompanying agenda item.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise OTRs in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contracts listed in the accompanying package.

Background

The competitively bid contracts listed in this item require approval to exercise OTRs contained in each contract that would, if exercised, bring the cumulative value of the contract over \$1 million. Each of the contracts were awarded under the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee's delegated authority (\$1 million for competitive procurements) pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b) of the County Code and the Master Procurement Administrative Order, A.O. 3-38.

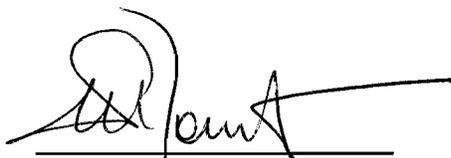
Prior to exercising any OTR periods, market research is conducted to ensure continuing to purchase from the awarded vendors is in the best interest of the County. Market research includes competitive factors such as pricing, quality, product features, technology, and lead time. It may also include commercial factors such as environmental issues, other governmental

entity practices, industry trends, support and capabilities. The OTRs for each contract in this package will be executed if determined to be in the best interest of the County.

Item No. 1: Temporary Laborers, Unskilled seeks authority to exercise OTRs for a contract to purchase temporary laborers for various County departments. The amount being requested for the remaining four option years is **\$2,920,296**.

Item No. 2: Repair Services for Metrorail, Metromover and Other Vehicle and Rail Systems/Pre-qualification of Vendors seeks authority to exercise OTRs for a contract to purchase specialized repair services for rail vehicles and rail systems for the Miami-Dade Transit and Water and Sewer departments. The amount being requested for the remaining three option years is **\$1,500,000**.

Item No. 3: Investigative Services for Selected Workers' Compensation and Tort Liability Claims seeks authority to exercise OTRs for a contract to purchase investigative services for the General Services Administration and Building Department. The amount being requested for the remaining two option years is **\$553,148**.

JUSTIFICATION

This contract is utilized by various County departments to purchase temporary unskilled laborer services to perform heavy manual work that does not require specialized knowledge and/or skill. Assignments under this contract include spraying and trimming foliage, cutting grass and weeds, digging holes for trees and shrubs, assisting craftsmen by carrying materials and tools, clean up of job sites, sweeping, removing refuse and paper from ground and buildings, loading and unloading materials from trucks and vans, and moving boxes or equipment. The allocations requested are based on the expected usage of hours for the upcoming year, and include funds for unforeseen circumstances such as severe weather conditions.

Market research was conducted. Market pricing is currently higher than the current contractual hourly rate on the County's contract. It is in the County's best interest to exercise the Option-to-Renew periods.

Contract Title: **Repair Services for Metrorail, Metromover and Other Vehicle and Rail Systems / Pre-qualification of Vendors**

Description: It is recommended that the Board authorize the County Mayor, or County Mayor's designee, to exercise the three remaining Option-to-Renew (OTR) periods to purchase specialized repair services for rail vehicles and rail systems for the Miami-Dade Transit (MDT) and Miami-Dade Water and Sewer (WASD) departments. These services include, but are not limited to, track inspections and repairs, repairs to track equipment and machinery, and various specialized repair projects. The contract is in its initial term which expires on December 31, 2008. Exercising the remaining three OTRs will bring the cumulative value of the contract to **\$2 million**.
