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**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board adopt the attached resolution pertaining to the Animal Services Trust Fund.

**Scope**

The scope of this item would be countywide in nature (unincorporated Miami-Dade).

**Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

The proposed amended resolution would not require any changes to the operational budget.

**Tract Record**

The use of the trust fund money for the fiscal years 2005-2006, 2006-2007 and 2007-2008 are attached.

**Background**

Animal Services became an independent department in October of 2005. In October 2006, the Hurricane Trust Fund and Animal Control Trust Fund were consolidated into the ATSF. The ATSF is maintained by the Animal Services Department and constituents may make tax deductible donations to the Trust Fund. Each grant or donation is used in accordance with the terms and conditions of the grant or donation received. However, in the event that there are no specific terms or limitations attached to the grant or donation, the department may purchase supplies, food and provided services related solely to the goals and objectives of the department which include providing services to animals kept at or adopted from the shelter or animals that have been the victims of cruelty, neglect or abuse. Expenditures from the trust fund are currently specific to improving the care of the shelter animals and the department is recommending expanding the use of the fund in an effort to offset the effects of our current economic climate. The amendments include that donations also be used for capital projects related to facilities used by the department for housing animals and for facilitating the adoption of animals in the department's care and for and spay/neuter programs for the public.

**RESOLUTION NO. R-208-09**

RESOLUTION AMENDING TERMS AND CONDITIONS  
FOR DISBURSEMENTS FROM ANIMAL SERVICES  
TRUST FUND AND SUPERSEDING RESOLUTION NO.  
R-1385-06

**WHEREAS**, humane treatment of animals is an important public policy; and

**WHEREAS**, on December 5, 2006, this Board adopted Resolution No. R-1385-06, which established the Animal Services Trust Fund for the deposit of private sector monetary and in-kind tax deductible contributions as well as public sector contributions in support of the animal services provided by the Miami-Dade County Animal Services Department (“Department”); and

**WHEREAS**, this Board wishes to specify that monies deposited in the Trust Fund may be used to fund: (i) capital projects related to facilities used by the Department for housing animals and for facilitating the adoption of animals in the Department’s care; and (ii) programs to provide low-cost or free spay-neuter services to the pets of Miami-Dade County residents,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:**

**Section 1.** The Animal Services Department (the “Department”) shall continue to administer the Animal Services Trust Fund (the “Trust Fund”) in accordance with this resolution and the County’s investment policies for the sole purpose of receiving private sector monetary and in-kind tax deductible contributions as well as public sector contributions in support of the animal services provided by the Department.

**Section 2.** The Trust Fund shall be kept and maintained in trust by the Department, and any deposits to the Trust Fund, including interest earned on such deposits, shall be used in accordance with the terms and conditions of each grant or donation, or, if there are no such specific terms or limitations, the Trust Fund shall be used: (i) to purchase supplies, food, and services related solely to the goals and objectives of the Department, which includes providing services to animals kept at or adopted from the Shelter or animals that have been the victims of cruelty or neglect; (ii) to encourage the sterilization of animals in Miami-Dade County, including funding programs to provide free or low-cost spay-neuter services to the pets of Miami-Dade County residents; or (iii) to fund capital projects related to housing facilities and adoption facilities for animals in the Department's care.

**Section 3.** The County's formal bid and purchasing procedures in Administrative Order 3-38 with respect to small purchase orders are waived for purchases by the Department in accordance with this resolution, provided that each individual purchase does not exceed \$10,000 and three quotes on the proposed purchase are obtained if practicable or economically feasible.

**Section 4.** The Department shall report at least annually to the County Manager, the Budget Department, and the Board of County Commissioners (the "BCC") as to expenditures from the Trust Fund.

**Section 5.** This resolution supersedes Resolution No. R-1385-06.

The foregoing resolution was offered by Commissioner **Katy Sorenson**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Jose "Pepe" Diaz** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
