Recommendation

I have reviewed the Class I Permit application by the City of Miami. Based upon the applicable evaluation factors set forth in Section 24-48.3 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, I recommend that the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) approve the issuance of a Class I Permit for the reasons set forth below.

Scope

The project site is located in Miamarina at Bayside Marketplace at 401 Biscayne Boulevard, Miami, Miami-Dade County, located in Commission District 5 (Comm. Bruno Barreiro).

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Not applicable.

Track Record/Monitor

Not applicable.

Background

The subject Class I Permit application involves the annual installation of temporary floating docks, ramps, pilings and tents to create up to 125 boat slips for the annual Strictly Sail Miami Boat Show located at Miamarina. The proposed structures shall be installed and removed within a 30 day time period surrounding the boat show that will occur annually in February and last approximately 4 days. The 2009 Strictly Sail Miami Boat Show will be held on February 12th-16th, 2009. The proposed project is required to be reviewed and approved by the BCC at a public hearing because the project involves the creation of greater than 50 slips. Said work is not specifically referenced in Section 24-48.2 of the Code of Miami-Dade County as work that can be processed administratively with a short form application, and therefore requires a standard form application. In addition, the proposed work includes the installation of non-water-dependent fixed structures. Said structures are specifically referenced in Section 24-48.24 of the Code as prohibited. However, the applicant is seeking a variance from this prohibition, which may be granted by the BCC at a public hearing. Furthermore, pursuant to Section 24-48.19 of the Code, Class I permit approvals by the BCC shall only be valid for a period of three (3) years from the date of approval unless another time period is stated in the approving resolution. Due to the nature of this project, the applicant has requested that the permit for this project be valid for ten (10) years.

The subject boat show was originally held annually at Watson Island Marina, but was moved to its current location at the Miamarina in 1999. Authorization for the boat show at its current location was granted by the BCC in 1999 through Resolution R-15-99 and DERM subsequently issued Class I permit CC98-471 on January 29, 1999. The permit was extended for the maximum 10-year period allowed in Section 24-48.9 of the Code. The applicant is proposing to obtain a new authorization for the installation of floating docks, ramps, pilings and tents in order to continue operating the annual Strictly Sail Miami Boat Show.

The proposed project involves the creation of 125 sailboat slips for a public boat show, which exceeds the 50-slip maximum expansion criteria set forth in Section 24-48.2(l) of the Code and must be processed as a standard form Class I permit application. DERM recommends approval for the temporary expansion of the marine facility be granted since the boat show is not expected to adversely affect surface water quality or create long-term environmental impacts within the proposed project site. In addition, the boat show is designed to be aesthetically compatible with the surrounding area because it is located within a marina with similar docking facilities. The boat show will be located over submerged lands owned by the City of Miami which has granted permission to use the submerged lands for the purpose of this event.

The applicant is proposing to install tents on the floating docks. The proposed tents are considered non-water-dependent fixed structures and are prohibited by Section 24-48.24 of the Code. However, the applicant is seeking a variance from this prohibition, which may be granted by the BCC. Section 24-48.25 of the Code lists several factors for consideration for such variance requests, which include: visual or physical access by the general public to Biscayne Bay and its adjacent tidal waters, historical significance, environmental impact, navigation, public safety and aesthetics. The subject boat show has been held at its current location since 1999. Since then, it has provided the general public with access to Biscayne Bay and adjacent tidal waters. The proposed tents will provide protection from the elements, increasing the public safety of attendees. Since the non-water-dependent structures are temporary in nature and no navigational impacts or cumulative environmental impact are expected, DERM recommends that the variance for the temporary installation of non-water-dependent fixed structures be granted.

The applicant is also requesting that the Class I permit be valid for a period of ten (10) years. Although standard form Class I permits are valid for 3 years, authorization for a 10-year period is consistent with the maximum timeframe allowed for extensions of standard form Class I permits. Staff recommends approval of the requested 10-year permit, subject to the applicant requesting permit modifications to provide specific dates for the boat show in subsequent years. However, pursuant to Section 24-48.13(2) of the Code of Miami-Dade County, substantial changes to a Class I permit must be approved by the BCC at a public hearing.

The project was evaluated for consistency with the Miami-Dade County Manatee Protection Plan (MDCMPP). The boat show is located in an area designated by the MDCMPP as essential habitat for the West Indian Manatee (*Trichechus manatus*). However, DERM believes that the project is consistent with the recommendations of the MDCMPP because the vessels associated with the boat show will be limited to only sailboats, which are considered to be slow moving, with minimal horsepower auxiliary motors. Furthermore, the project is temporary and will occur within an existing permitted marina with minimal benthic resources. The implementation of all applicable standard manatee protection provisions shall be required.

The project will result in minor water quality impacts typically associated with the construction, operation and demolition of a docking facility. The applicant has agreed to provide a contribution to the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund to mitigate for these minor water quality impacts in an amount equivalent to the value of 125 cubic yards of riprap at a price of \$90 per cubic yard. A contribution in the amount of \$11,250 shall be made at the time of permit issuance and shall be specifically designated for habitat creation/restoration projects in Biscayne Bay and its foreshore.

The proposed project has been designed in accordance with all relevant Miami-Dade County coastal construction criteria and is consistent with all other Miami-Dade County coastal protection provisions. Please find attached a DERM Project Report which sets forth the reasons the proposed project is recommended for approval by DERM pursuant to the applicable evaluation factors set forth in Section 24-48.3 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. The conditions, limitations, and restrictions set forth in the Project Report attached hereto are incorporated herein by references hereto.



Date: December 10, 2008

Staff's recommendation of approval for the above-referenced permit application is based on the applicable evaluation factors under Section 24-48.3 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. The following is a summary of the proposed project with respect to each applicable evaluation factor:

1. **Potential Adverse Environmental Impact** – The potential adverse environmental impacts from the installation and removal of the proposed structures and the mooring of associated vessels are minimal.
2. **Potential Cumulative Adverse Environmental Impact** – Not Applicable.
3. **Hydrology** - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect surface water drainage or retention of stormwater.
4. **Water Quality** – The proposed project will result in temporary minor water quality impacts typically associated with the construction, operation, and demolition of a temporary docking facility. These impacts include increased turbidity from standard construction and demolition activities, benthic disturbances created by deep draft vessels, improper bilge operation, debris disposal, etc. The applicant shall submit a contribution to the Biscayne Bay Environmental Enhancement Trust Fund (BBEETF) to mitigate for these minor water quality impacts in an amount equivalent to the value of 125 cubic yards of riprap at a price of \$90.00 per cubic yard. A contribution in the amount of \$11,250.00 shall be made at the time of permit issuance and shall be specifically designated for creation/restoration projects in Biscayne Bay and its foreshore. In addition, the applicant shall be required to distribute information on “Best Management Practices” to each exhibitor and sales representative to avoid and/or minimize these types of impacts.

The Class I permit shall require that a water quality monitoring plan and proper turbidity controls be implemented during construction and demolition periods to ensure turbidity levels within the surrounding waters does not exceed State and County water quality standards. Turbidity curtains shall be used to enclose work areas during pile installation and removal. If turbidity levels within the surrounding waters exceed water quality standards, construction shall cease until remedial measures have been implemented and DERM approves re-commencement of the project. In addition, the Class I permit will require the applicant to post a \$25,000.00 performance bond to ensure compliance with these and all other general and specific conditions of the permit.

5. **Wellfields** – Not applicable.
6. **Water Supply** – Not applicable.
7. **Aquifer Recharge** – Not applicable.
8. **Aesthetics** – The project is designed to be aesthetically compatible with the surrounding area. The show is located within an existing marina and is temporary in nature. The proposed structures have been associated with the previous Strictly Sail Miami Boat Shows and therefore, not reasonably expected to have negative aesthetic impacts.

9. **Navigation** – Navigation is not expected to be impacted during the construction, operation and demolition time period nor by the non-water dependent structures which will be located within the existing marina.

Significant navigation problems are not expected provided that all vessels associated with the project follow safe boating practices and that sufficient lights and reflector materials are installed on the proposed structures to provide warning at night. The proposed project shall be subject to Coast Guard approval and the applicant shall be required to comply with all State and Federal navigational lighting requirements.

10. **Public Health** - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect public health. The applicant shall provide portable sanitation facilities on the uplands for show staff, vendors and participants and no sewage will be discharged into surface waters.
11. **Historic Values** - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect historic values.
12. **Archaeological Values** - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect archaeological values
13. **Air Quality** – The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect air quality.
14. **Marine and Wildlife Habitats** – The proposed project will result in minimal temporary impacts to marine and wildlife habitats. The Strictly Sail Miami Boat Show is located within an area designated as essential West Indian Manatee (*Trichechus manatus*) habitat by the Miami-Dade County Manatee Protection Plan. In addition, vessels traveling to and from the boat show will enter areas designated as essential manatee habitat and the boat show occurs annually during manatee season. To minimize impacts during the construction, operation, and demolition of the proposed project and during the distribution of the vessels to and from the boat show, the applicant will comply with standard manatee protection provisions. In addition, all associated vessels shall travel through deep water routes, maintain adequate clearance between the draft of the vessel and any resources along the bottom substrate, and adhere to speed restrictions and manatee awareness signs.
15. **Wetland Soils Suitable for Habitat** – There are no wetland soils suitable for habitat in the footprint of the proposed work.
16. **Floral Values** – The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect marine flora.
17. **Fauna Values** - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect marine fauna provided all standard manatee provisions outlined in evaluation factor number 14 are implemented during construction, operation, demolition and vessel travel periods.

18. **Rare, Threatened and Endangered Species** – The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect any rare, threatened or endangered species. The Strictly Sail Boat Show is located within an area designated as essential West Indian Manatee (*Trichechus manatus*) habitat by the Miami-Dade County Manatee Protection Plan. In addition, vessels traveling to and from the boat show will enter areas designated as essential manatee habitat and the boat show occurs annually during manatee season. To minimize impacts during the construction, operation, and demolition of the proposed project and during the distribution of the vessels to and from the boat show the applicant will comply with standard manatee protection provisions. In addition, all associated vessels shall travel through deep water routes, maintain adequate clearance between the draft of the vessel and any resources along the bottom substrate, and adhere to speed restrictions and manatee awareness signs.
19. **Natural Flood Damage Protection** - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect surface water drainage or retention of stormwater.
20. **Wetland Values** - The proposed project does not involve dredging or filling of wetlands.
21. **Land Use Classification** – The proposed project will occur in the City of Miami, Florida. Pursuant to Section 24-48.2(II)(A)(7), of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, a substantiating letter shall be submitted stating that the proposed project does not violate any zoning laws. Said letter will be submitted pending approval by the Board of County Commissioners and prior to the issuance of the Class I Permit.
22. **Recreation** - The proposed project is consistent with the recreation element of the Miami-Dade County Comprehensive Development Master Plan and recreation element of the Biscayne Bay Management Plan recreation elements.
23. **Other Environmental Values Affecting the Public Interest** - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to adversely affect other environmental values affecting the public interest. The submerged lands on which the project will occur are owned by the City of Miami. Approval has been granted by the City of Miami for the use of submerged lands for the Strictly Sail Miami Boat Show.
24. **Conformance with Standard Construction Procedures and Practices and Design and Performance Standards** – The proposed project complies with the standard construction procedures and practices and design and performance standards of the applicable portions of the following:
 - a) Miami-Dade County Public Works Manual
 - b) Biscayne Bay Management Plan (Section 33D-1 through 33-D-4 of the Code of Miami-Dade County)
 - c) Chapter 33B of the Code of Miami-Dade County

25. **Comprehensive Environmental Impact Statement (CEIS)** – In the opinion of the Director, the proposed project will result in neither adverse environmental impacts nor cumulative adverse environmental impacts. Therefore, a CEIS was not required by DERM to evaluate the project.
26. **Conformance with All Applicable Federal, State and Local Laws and Regulations** - The proposed project is in conformance with the following applicable State, Federal and local laws and regulations:
- United States Clean Water Act (Army Corps of Engineers permit is required)
 - Federal Endangered Species Act (Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission)
 - Florida Department of Environmental Protection submerged lands approval
27. **Conformance with the Miami-Dade County Comprehensive Development Master Plan (CDMP)** - In the opinion of DERM, elements of the proposed project (i.e. tents) are not in full conformance with the CDMP. However, the applicant is requesting a variance from the Section of Miami Dade County Code relating to these non-water dependant structures as they pertain to the proposed project. The following is a summary of the proposed project as it relates to the CDMP:

LAND USE ELEMENT I:

Objective 2/Policy 2A - Level of Service. The proposed project does not involve new or significant expansion of existing urban land uses because it is temporary in nature and located within an existing docking facility.

Objective 3/Policies 3A, 3B, 3C - Protection of natural resources and systems. – The proposed project is consistent with the Conservation and Coastal Management Elements of the CDMP. The project is compatible with surrounding land uses in Biscayne Bay and does not involve development in the Big Cypress are of Critical State concern or the East Everglades.

TRANSPORTATION ELEMENT II

Aviation Subelement/Objective 9 - Aviation System Expansion - There is no aviation element to the proposed project.

Port of Miami River Subelement/Objective 3 - Minimization of impacts to estuarine water quality and marine resources. The proposed project will not take place within the tidal waters of the Miami River. The Class I Permit will include a condition that requires the applicant to use best management practices to ensure that debris and other pollutants do not enter the water. In addition, a performance bond shall be held to ensure compliance with said condition.

CONSERVATION, AQUIFER RECHARGES AND DRAINAGE ELEMENT IV:

Objective 3/Policies 3A, 3B, 3D - Wellfield protection area protection. - The proposed project is not located within a wellfield protection area.

Objective 3/Policy 3E - Limestone mining within the area bounded by the Florida Turnpike, the Miami-Dade/Broward Levee, N.W. 12 Street and Okeechobee Road. - The proposed project is not located within this area.

Objective 4/Policies 4A, 4B, 4C - Water storage, aquifer recharge potential and maintenance of natural surface water drainage. - The proposed project will not adversely affect water storage, aquifer recharge potential or natural surface water drainage. The proposed project does not involve positive drainage of wetland area and will not affect water storage or aquifer recharge potential.

Objective 5/Policies 5A, 5B, 5F - Flood protection and cut and fill criteria. – The proposed project does not compromise flood protection, involve filling for development purposes, and is not related to cut and fill activities.

Objective 6/Policy 6A - Areas of highest suitability for mineral extraction. - The proposed project is not located in an area proposed or suitable for mineral extraction.

Objective 6/Policy 6B - Guidelines for rock quarries for the re-establishment of native flora and fauna. - The proposed project is not located in a rock quarry.

Objective 6/Policy 6D - Suitable fill material for the support of development. – The proposed project does not filling for the purposes of development.

Objective 7/Policy 7A - No net loss of high quality, relatively unstressed wetlands. – The proposed project will not result in a net loss of any such wetlands.

Objective 9/Policies 9A, 9B, 9C – Protection of habitat critical to Federal State-designated threatened or endangered species - The proposed project is not reasonably expected to affect any threatened or endangered species. The Class I permit will require the applicant to implement and comply with all standard manatee protection provisions.

COASTAL MANAGEMENT ELEMENT VII:

Objective 1/Policy 1A - Tidally connected mangroves in mangrove protection areas – The project is not located within a designated “Mangrove Protection Area.”

Objective 1/ Policy 1B - Natural surface flow into and through coastal wetlands. – The project will not affect natural surface flow into and through coastal wetlands.

Objective 1/ Policy 1C - Elevated boardwalk access through mangroves. – The project does not involve access through mangroves

Objective 1/Policy 1D - Protection and maintenance of mangrove forests and related natural vegetational communities. - The proposed project does not involve work in mangrove forests, coastal hammock, or other natural vegetational communities.

Objective 1/Policy 1E - Mitigation for the degradation and destruction of coastal wetlands. Monitoring and maintenance of mitigation areas. – The proposed project does not involve the degradation and destruction of coastal wetlands and therefore does not involve monitoring of mitigation for impacts to coastal wetlands.

Objective 1/Policy 1G - Prohibition on dredging or filling of grass/algal flats, hard bottom or other viable benthic communities, except as provided for in Chapter 24 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. – The project does not involve the dredging or filling of grass/algal flats, hard bottom or other viable benthic communities.

Objective 2/Policies 2A, 2B - Beach restoration and renourishment objectives. - The proposed project does not involve beach restoration or renourishment.

Objective 3/Policy 3E, 3F - Location of new cut and spoil areas for proper stabilization and minimization of damages. - The proposed project does not involve the development or identification of new cut or spoil areas.

Objective 4/Policy 4A, 4C, 4E, 4F – Protection of endangered or threatened animal species. - The proposed work is not reasonably expected to affect endangered or threatened species. The Strictly Sail Miami Boat Show is located within an area designated as essential West Indian Manatee (*Trichechus manatus*) habitat by the Miami-Dade County Manatee Protection Plan. In addition, vessels traveling to and from the boat show will enter areas designated as essential manatee habitat and the boat show occurs annually during manatee season. To minimize impacts during the construction, operation, and demolition of the proposed project and during the distribution of the vessels to and from the boat show the applicant will comply with standard manatee protection provisions. In addition, all associated vessels shall travel through deep water routes, and adhere to speed restrictions and manatee awareness signs.

Objective 5/Policy 5B - Existing and new areas for water-dependent uses. - The proposed project will not affect existing water-dependent uses.

Objective 5/Policy 5D - Consistency with Chapter 33D of the Code of Miami-Dade County (shoreline access, environmental compatibility of shoreline development) - The proposed project does not require review by the Shoreline Development Review Committee because it is not a permanent structure.

Objective 5/Policy 5F - The siting of water dependent facilities. - The proposed project does not involve the creation of any new water dependent facilities.

28. **Conformance with Chapter 33B of the Code of Miami-Dade County** (East Everglades Zoning Overlay Ordinance) – The proposed project is not located within the East Everglades Area.

29. **Conformance with Miami-Dade County Ordinance 81-19** (Biscayne Bay Management Plan Section 33D-1 through 33D-4) - The proposed tents are not consistent with the Biscayne Bay Management Plan due to their being non-water dependent structures. However, the project is temporary in nature and the applicant is requesting a variance from this requirement.
30. **Conformance with the Miami-Dade County Manatee Protection Plan** - The project is located within essential habitat for the West Indian Manatee. In addition, vessels traveling to and from the boat show will enter areas designated as essential manatee habitat and the boat show occurs annually during manatee season. To minimize impacts during the construction, operation, and demolition of the proposed project and during the distribution of the vessels to and from the boat show the applicant will comply with standard manatee protection provisions. In addition, all associated vessels shall travel through deep water routes, and adhere to speed restrictions and manatee awareness signs. The proposed project is temporary in nature and is not reasonably expected to adversely affect any rare, threatened or endangered species.
31. **Consistency with Miami-Dade County Criteria for Lake Excavation** – The proposed project does not involve lake excavation.
32. **Municipality Recommendation** – Pursuant to Section 24-48.2(II)(A)(7), Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, a substantiating letter shall be submitted stating that the proposed project does not violate any zoning laws. Said letter will be submitted after the approval by the Board of County Commissioners and prior to the issuance of the Class I Permit.
33. **Coastal Resources Management Line** - A coastal resources management line was not required for the proposed project, pursuant to Section 24-48.2(II)(A)(10)(b) of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida.
34. **Maximum Protection of a Wetland's Hydrological and Biological Functions** – The proposed project is not expected to impact wetland hydrological and biological functions.
35. **Class I Permit Applications Proposing to Exceed the Boundaries Described in Section D-5.03(2)(a) of the Miami-Dade County Public Works Manual** – DERM has considered the following factors:
 - i. **Whether the proposed exceedance is the minimum necessary to avoid seagrasses or other valuable environmental resources** – Not applicable.
 - ii. **Whether the proposed exceedance is the minimum necessary to achieve adequate water depth for mooring of a vessel** – Not applicable.
 - iii. **Whether the applicant has provided notarized letters of consent to DERM from adjoining riparian property owners** – Not applicable.
 - iv. **Whether any letters of objection from adjoining riparian property owners were received by DERM** – Not applicable.

The proposed project was also evaluated for compliance with the standards contained in Section 24-48.3(2),(3), and (4) of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. The following is a summary of how the standards relate to the proposed project:

24-48.3 (2) Dredging and Filling for Class I Permit - The proposed project does not involve dredging and filling activities.

24-48.3 (3) Minimum Water Depth Required for Boat Slips Created by the Construction or Placement of Fixed or Floating Docks and Piers, Piles and Other Structures Requiring a Permit Under Article IV, Division 1 of Chapter 24 of the Code of Miami-Dade County - The proposed project involves the temporary installation of docks, ramps, and pilings for mooring purposes. The project area is located in an existing large vessel docking facility and has adequate water depth for the vessels that will be using the proposed slips.

24-48.3 (4) Clean Fill in Wetlands – The proposed project does not involve placing clean fill in wetlands.

The proposed project was also evaluated based upon the applicable factors set forth in Section 24-48.25 of the Code as well as the applicable evaluation factors set forth in Section 24-48.3 of the Code because of the variance request:


36. **Visual or physical access by the general public to Biscayne Bay and its adjacent tidal waters** – The subject boat show has provided the general public access to Biscayne Bay and adjacent tidal waters since 1999.
37. **Historical significance** – The subject boat show has occurred at this location annually since 1999.
38. **Need for covered vessel repair facilities** - Not applicable.
39. **Environmental impact or cumulative environmental impact** – The proposed project is located within an existing marina and is temporary in nature; therefore, it is not expected to create long-term environmental impacts.
40. **Navigation** – The proposed boat show is located within an existing marina; therefore, it is not reasonably expected to create adverse navigational impacts.
41. **Public safety** – The installation of tents, non-water-dependent structures, will provide protection from the elements, increasing the public safety of attendees.
42. **Aesthetics**- The subject boat show is located within an existing marina and is temporary in nature. The installation of tents, non-water-dependent structures, is not expected to create negative aesthetic impacts to the surrounding area.
43. **Biscayne Bay Management Plan** – In the opinion of DERM, the proposed project is in conformance with the Biscayne Bay Management Plan.
44. **Biscayne Bay Aquatic Preserve Act** - In the opinion of DERM, the proposed project is in conformance with the Biscayne Bay Aquatic Preserve Act.

45. **Rules of the Biscayne Bay Aquatic Preserve** - In the opinion of DERM, the proposed project is in conformance with the Rules of the Biscayne Bay Aquatic Preserve.

BASED UPON THE FOREGOING, IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT A CLASS I PERMIT AND A VARIANCE BE APPROVED.
