

RESOLUTION NO. R-223-09

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE MAYOR OR DESIGNEE TO QUICKLY DEVELOP AND PRIORITIZE A PROPOSED LIST OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS FOR SUBMISSION TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IN THE EVENT FEDERAL FUNDS ARE MADE AVAILABLE TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS AS PART OF A PUBLIC WORKS ECONOMIC STIMULUS PLAN

**WHEREAS**, the National Bureau of Economic Research recently officially announced that the U.S. economy has been in a recession since December, 2007; and

**WHEREAS**, the official declaration came as little surprise as the evidence of a recession, including substantial job losses, stagnant wages and slower production, has been widespread for months; and

**WHEREAS**, since the start of the recession a year ago, the U.S. has lost 2.7 million jobs, with about 10.3 million American workers now unemployed; and

**WHEREAS**, the nation's unemployment rate reached 6.7 percent in November – 1.7 percentage points higher than a year ago – and is expected to continue to rise into next year; and

**WHEREAS**, President~~[[Eleet]]~~<sup>1</sup> Barack Obama has stated a goal of creating 2.5 million jobs in the U.S. by 2011; and

**WHEREAS**, a critical part of this two-year initiative is to rebuild the nation's crumbling infrastructure; and

**WHEREAS**, investing in local government infrastructure is the quickest and most direct path to creating jobs and stimulating the businesses that can begin to reverse the current economic downturn; and

**WHEREAS**, Miami-Dade County has a long list of public infrastructure projects that could be started quickly and that could stimulate the economy and create jobs if funding is made available; and

**WHEREAS**, the U.S. Conference of Mayors under the leadership of City of Miami Mayor Manuel A. (Manny) Diaz recently presented President ~~[[Eleet]]~~ Obama an 803-page report entitled “*Main Street Economic Recovery, Ready to Go Jobs and Infrastructure Projects*” that lists almost \$180 billion in local government infrastructure projects that could be undertaken within the next two years in a wide range of areas including transportation, housing, water & wastewater, energy and public safety; and

**WHEREAS**, in the event the incoming Obama Administration makes funding available to local governments as part of a federal public works economic stimulus plan, Miami-Dade County should have a prioritized list of infrastructure projects that is ready to submit to the federal government,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that this Board:

Section 1. Directs the Mayor or Designee to quickly develop and prioritize a proposed list of Miami-Dade County infrastructure projects for submission to the federal government in the event funds are made available to local governments as part of a public works economic stimulus plan. The list of infrastructure projects should consist of County projects that can be started immediately and completed within the next two years, or that otherwise comply with the requirements identified by the federal government for funding.

Section 2. Directs the Mayor or Designee to submit the proposed, prioritized list of infrastructure projects to this Board for approval within thirty (30) days of the date of this resolution.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Audrey M. Edmonson.

It was offered by Commissioner **Jose "Pepe" Diaz**, who moved its adoption.



**This supplemental report was amended at the February 11, 2009 Transportation, Infrastructure and Roads Committee meeting to correct a scrivener's error on handwritten page 15. The amount listed under "Capital Improvement Funding Requirement" for the Water and Sewer project title "Water Efficiency Retrofit Program" was changed from \$1,500,000 to \$15,000,000. The grand total under that category changed from \$7,219,336,259 to \$7,232,836,259.**


Since the start of 2009, Miami-Dade County has been monitoring as well as gearing up for the implementation of a proposed Federal Stimulus Package. On January 13, 2009, Mayor Carlos Alvarez sent a letter (Attachment A) to the House Speaker, the Majority and Minority leaders, and the Florida Congressional Delegation urging that the federal program include direct allocations to local governments. The purpose of the letter was to illustrate the variety of projects that could be funded if federal dollars became available, as well as recommend that any stimulus bill include training and employments dollars and aid to small businesses.

Over the past month, staff has quickly developed a list of capital projects (Attachment B) that could be part of a proposed Federal Stimulus Package. The projects included are those most vital to Miami-Dade County's growth as a center for international trade, commerce and tourism, in addition to projects that would stimulate local job growth through the construction of much needed public infrastructure for public safety, housing, water and wastewater, public transit, transportation including aviation, seaport and public works categories, and energy efficiency and sustainability projects.

We continue to closely track the progress of the federal legislation. The House of Representatives passed the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act last week. The Senate has now prepared its own version of the bill which is expected be voted on Tuesday, February 10 2009. Once final details of the legislation are known, including any compromise version reconciling the House and Senate bills, the County will amend and prioritize the initial list of projects to conform to the final legislative language and federal funding guidelines.

The County must be prepared to fast-track any project that might be funded through this federal effort. Capital departments have been instructed to work with Office of Capital Improvements to develop action plans including the following: research and prepare federal contract language to be included in bid documents; identify projects that can be procured using total cost of ownership solicitations; and to dedicate the resources necessary to meet the federal timelines for receiving grant dollars. All departments are monitoring developments and reviewing existing programs, contracts and solicitation options to use these funds.

I will continue to provide updates on our efforts to participate in this important federal program and access funding for the many critically needed capital projects in Miami-Dade County.

Dear Speaker Pelosi, Majority Leader Reid, Minority Leader Boehner and Minority Leader McConnell:

On behalf of Miami-Dade County, I am writing to urge that the economic stimulus package include direct allocations to local governments to invest in projects that will immediately create new jobs and support future economic growth.

Miami-Dade County currently has \$23.46 billion in approved, programmed, multi-year capital projects and an additional \$12.6 billion of identified un-funded needs. There are over \$2 billion in projects that are ready-to-go in the current fiscal year, but the majority is dependent upon financing that has been severely restricted by the condition of the financial markets and diminishing local revenues. Clearly, the needs and capacity we have for stimulating the economy far exceed our available funding.

Federal dollars infused directly into countywide projects, including those that support our powerful economic engines, the airport and seaport, provide the greatest opportunity to boost South Florida's economy. A number of these projects have both local and regional significance vital to the area's growth as a center for trade and commerce; and support our most important industry, tourism.

The attached list is not simply a "wish list" but a blueprint for the future.

### **Infrastructure and Economic Development**

One of the most important, ready-to-go projects is the extension of Metrorail to Miami International Airport. This project, the first phase of the new Orange Line, is funded in part by a State of Florida grant. However, it requires additional funding to meet its targeted completion over the next two years.

The second phase of the Orange Line project is the extension to the Broward County line which is currently in design. This 9.5 mile segment represents an important link in expanding public transit and has regional significance. A third future extension would expand Metrorail west along one of the County's most crowded expressways.

The much discussed seaport tunnel must be on our list of critical projects. The state and local governments have committed close to a billion dollars for this project. However, financial markets have stalled the project and would benefit tremendously from federal support. Improving access to the Port of Miami has far-reaching benefits not only here but, throughout the global marketplace.

Equally important is the completion of the Miami Harbor Dredge Project. This federally authorized project would deepen the Port of Miami to 50-feet enabling the port to accommodate the world's largest container ships. This multi-phase project requires approximately \$75 million of federal appropriations over the next five years.

Among the many Florida Department of Transportation projects of critical importance to our countywide transportation system is the 25<sup>th</sup> Street Viaduct that links approximately two miles of truck cargo directly into Miami International Airport's West Cargo Area. This is another ready-to-go project that supports the region's most important economic engine.

#### **Energy/Environmental Related Initiatives**

The County's water and sewer system infrastructure provides critical economic, public health and environmental benefits to our community. There are a number of ready-to-go projects that would rehabilitate and expand these systems greatly contributing to future economic growth.

The new administration's aggressive energy-efficiency measures include implementation of a Federal Renewable Energy Portfolio Standard which would require that by 2025, a minimum of 25% of the nation's electricity be derived from renewable energy sources. Miami-Dade has numerous *green* capital projects that could soon be underway shortly with support of federal dollars. These projects include a cool roofs program, methane gas extraction and chilled water production.

Under the category of coastal zone vulnerability reduction, the County is requesting assistance to fortify our coastline to protect against flooding and address established disaster mitigation and climate change adaption strategies.

#### **Public Safety /Public Works Projects**

Miami-Dade has a severe jail overcrowding problem with potentially significant consequences to the safety of residents. A new Krome Avenue Detention Center, now on the drawing board, would provide 2,000 additional beds with the capacity to expand to 4,000 beds.

The Lightspeed Building is a ready-to-go project that would house the County's 911 and 311 systems, emergency management functions and traffic signal control operations. The County purchased the building several years ago. However, the project is awaiting funding for build out of the existing space. This facility is a critical component in our efforts to enhance our response to hurricanes and other public safety emergencies.



Also, included on the list are more than \$100 million in public works projects including roadway, bridge, drainage and sidewalk repairs. These smaller neighborhood projects are integral to maintaining the quality of life in our community and could be underway almost immediately.

**Other Economic Stimulus Measures**


When Congress considers economic stimulus legislation, we urge that the following components be included:

- A two-year increase in the Federal Match Rate Increase for Health and Entitlement Programs (FMAP) would help states fund Medicaid programs and prevent service reductions. As the County's safety net provider, Jackson Memorial Hospital (JMH) is particularly interested in ensuring additional Medicaid funding is made available to Florida. A two year FMAP increase could mean between \$600 million and \$900 million in additional money for the State of Florida, with a significant percentage of that coming to JMH, Miami-Dade County's only public hospital.
- A large component of the South Florida business community is comprised of small businesses, many struggling to survive the current economic downturn due to restrictive credit. We urge the creation of a small business assistance program to provide financing to allow these businesses to meet capital needs along with a revolving loan program for operations.
- Implementation of a comprehensive job training program to promote readiness for employment opportunities generated by infrastructure funded projects – including training focused on energy efficiency and renewable energy systems.

The above reflects some of our County's top concerns as we look for ways to boost our employment and lay the foundation for new economic growth. Please find attached, a complete list of projects totaling \$7.2 billion that we respectfully submit for your consideration as part of an economic stimulus program.

We will continue working with our Board of County Commissioners over the next several weeks to further prioritize our needs and refine the list once the formal federal guidelines and processes are established by the new administration.
