RESOLUTION NO. R-381-09

RESOLUTION SUGGESTING SOUTH FLORIDA
WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT ACCEPT MIAMI-
DADE COUNTY'S RECOMMENDED LANGUAGE
REGARDING PERMANENT IRRIGATION
RESTRICTIONS OF NEW LANDSCAPING FOR
INCLUSION IN DISTRICT RULE

WHEREAS, the South Florida Water Management District is conducting rule-making relating to a proposed rule for Mandatory Year-Round Landscape Irrigation Conservation Measures; and

WHEREAS, the proposed rule provides the two-day restriction does not apply to irrigation of new landscaping for 60 days; and

WHEREAS, the proposed rule specifically provides that new landscaping may be irrigated six days a week during the first 30 days and four days a week during the next 30 days; and

WHEREAS, the nursery industry asserts that the 60 day limitation will adversely affect the public's decision to purchase new landscaping and will have a negative economic impact on the industry; and

WHEREAS, this Board is considering an ordinance that allows irrigation of new landscaping six days a week for the first 90 days from the date the new landscaping is purchased; and

WHEREAS, this Board believes that allowing an additional 30 days to irrigate new landscaping will address the industry’s concerns without impairing the goal of water conservation,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. Suggests the South Florida Water Management District accept and include in the District’s Rule the County’s recommended language that allows irrigation of new landscaping six days a week for 90 days from the date the new landscaping is purchased.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Board and Executive Director of the South Florida Water Management District.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Natacha Seijas. It was offered by Commissioner **Joe A. Martinez**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Jose “Pepe” Diaz** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
