



Subject: Resolution Waiving Formal Bid Procedures

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners waive competitive bidding procedures for the attached contracts to purchase goods and services pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Section 5.03(D) of the Home Rule Charter, in the best interest of Miami-Dade County. ***Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on utilization. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments and/or agencies.***

Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying Bid Waiver Package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board.

Track Record/Monitor

Past compliance issues involving Metro Equipment Service, Inc. is noted in Item 3.1. Each departments' contract manager is reflected in the accompanying Bid Waiver agenda item.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise in their discretion subsequent options-to-renew and extend contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contracts listed in the accompanying Bid Waiver Package.

Background

Section 3 EMERGENCY PURCHASES

An emergency purchase is an unforeseen or unanticipated urgent and immediate need for goods or services where the protection of life, health, safety or welfare of the community, or the preservation of public properties, would not be possible using other purchasing methods described in Administrative Order 3-38.

Item 3.1: Emergency Repair and Rehabilitation of Pump Station 426 is to waive formal bid procedures and ratify a competitive emergency contract established by the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department to repair and rehabilitate Pump Station 426. The amount being requested is **\$820,212**.

Section 4 NON-COMPETITIVE CONTRACT MODIFICATIONS

A non-competitive contract modification is a supplemental allocation for goods or services that exceed the scope of the original contract allocation, or a modification of an established non-competitive contract, representing a waiver of the competitive bidding process under Administrative Order 3-38.

Item 4.1: Process, Control, and Implementation Equipment (Pre-qualification Pool) is for additional spending authority to allow the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department to purchase process, control, and implementation equipment used to measure, analyze, and optimize water flow from the Biscayne Aquifer. The additional funding being requested is **\$490,000**.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING WAIVER OF FORMAL BID PROCEDURES FOR THE PURCHASE OF GOODS AND SERVICES AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR THE COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO AWARD SAME, WITH AUTHORITY TO EXERCISE OPTIONS-TO-RENEW ESTABLISHED THEREUNDER

WHEREAS, the County Mayor recommends to this Board to waive formal bid procedures for the purchase of goods and services which cannot be purchased under normal bid procedures,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board waives formal bid procedures for the purchase of goods and services and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award such contracts, with authority to exercise options-to-renew established thereunder, pursuant to Section 5.03(D) of the Home Rule Charter and Section 2-8.1 of the County Code by a two-thirds (2/3s) vote of the Board members present.

JUSTIFICATION

Seeking ratification of an emergency contract established by the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) on September 12, 2008 to Metro Equipment Services, Inc. to repair and rehabilitate Pump Station 426 located at 4001 N.W. 163rd St. An administrative review revealed that this emergency contract was inadvertently omitted from previous bid waiver packages causing a delay in presenting this action to the Board.

On August 21, 2008, WASD was informed of a sewage overflow at Pump Station 426. WASD crews excavated and discovered that one of three, 16-inch ductile influent lines ruptured. Sewage waste was leaking into the surrounding ground areas. The sewage was temporarily redirected around the affected area to allow for the replacement of all pipes and fittings in the area adjacent to the pump station.

On August 27, 2008, the Department of Procurement Management was notified that the Director of WASD had declared an emergency. WASD staff conducted an extensive review to determine the required scope of the repair work. Three firms who could perform the work were identified by WASD due to previous experience on similar projects. They were invited to attend a pre-bid jobsite inspection. The bid responses listed below were received, and an emergency competitive solicitation resulted in a contract award to perform the repairs in an expedited time frame. The work was completed on November 14, 2008.

REASON FOR CHANGE

Authorization is necessary for additional spending authority to allow the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) to purchase, maintain, inspect and repair process, control and instrumentation equipment. Typical equipment supported through this contract includes, but is not limited to, flow meters, switches, flow measuring devices, analyzers and analytical instruments, and various applications of sensing and measuring equipment and instruments.

On November 15, 2007, the South Florida Water Management District approved a 20-year Consumptive Use Permit. The permit authorizes WASD to continue drawing 347 million gallons per day from the Biscayne Aquifer from 98 production wells owned and operated by the County. To remain in compliance with the permit, new sensing flow meters will be ordered and installed for many of the production wells. These flow meters allow for real-time accurate accounting of all water withdrawn from the Biscayne Aquifer, and assist the County in planning to meet the future needs and water demands of the expanding South Florida region.

WASD has an approved multi-year capital improvement plan to upgrade the entire water and sewer infrastructure. Additional equipment purchases and replacement of parts will be required to upgrade plants and standardize operations. Required items would included, but not be limited to, additional flow meters for water and wastewater pumping stations, regulators and detectors (for various combustible gases), sensors (gas and ammonia), and analyzers (chlorine and ammonia).

Summary

This resolution waives formal bid procedures for specified purchases, authorizing the County Mayor or his designee to award such contracts, with authority to exercise subsequent options-to-renew (OTR). This Bid Waiver Package includes a total of two (2) contracts: an emergency purchase and a non-competitive contract modification.

Background and Relevant Legislation

Pursuant to § 2-8.1 of the Miami-Dade County Code and § 5.03(D) of the Home Rule Charter, the Board of County Commissioner's (BCC) approval is required to award these contracts.

Policy Change and Implication / Budgetary Impact

The two (2) contracts submitted in this **Bid Waiver Package total \$1,310,212** and include the following:

- **One (1) Emergency Purchase:**

Emergency Repair and Rehabilitation of Pump Station 426 (Item 3.1)

This item seeks ratification of an emergency contract. On September 12, 2008, the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) awarded this contract to Metro Equipment Services, Inc. to repair and rehabilitate Pump Station 426 located at 4001 N.W. 163rd Street. The work was completed on November 14, 2008.

WASD identified three firms who could perform the work and the contract was awarded to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder from three firms. There was no previous contract established.

According to the County Manager's memo this emergency contract was never ratified by the BCC due to it being inadvertently omitted from previous bid waiver packages.
