



RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE OR ANY COMMISSIONER SPONSORING RESOLUTIONS, ORDINANCES AND OTHER MATTERS RELATED OR REFERRING TO AREA MEDIAN INCOME TO INCLUDE AS AN ATTACHMENT TO SAID RESOLUTIONS, ORDINANCES AND OTHER MATTERS A CHART THAT DESCRIBES AT A MINIMUM THE AREA MEDIAN INCOME FOR MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County has a number of housing and social services programs which take into account the area median incomes of families and households to determine eligibility for these programs; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor or Mayor's designee or members of this Board sponsor resolutions, ordinances, and other matters that refer to area median income; and

WHEREAS, it would be helpful to this Board that each resolution, ordinance, and other matters that are placed on the Board's agenda that relate or refer to area median income include as an attachment a chart that describes at a minimum the area median income for Miami-Dade County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee or any Commissioner sponsoring resolutions, ordinances, or other matters related or referring to area median income to include as an

attachment to said resolutions, ordinances or other matters a chart, in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, that describes at a minimum the area median income for Miami-Dade County.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Joe A. Martinez. It was offered by Commissioner **Jose "Pepe" Diaz**, who moved its adoption.



Summary

This resolution requires the Administration and Commissioners sponsoring resolutions, ordinances, or other legislative matters related to or referring to the area median income to include as an attachment a chart that sets forth and compares the median household income for Florida counties, the state and the nation; and a chart that sets forth the area median income by the number of persons in each household.

Background and Relevant Legislation

The area median income is used to determine eligibility as well as set qualifications for projects funded under housing and social services programs. In particular, area median income levels are often used to determine eligibility for loans to low and moderate-income home buyers under federal and state lending programs. The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), for instance, is required by law to set income limits that determine the eligibility of applicants for HUD's assisted housing programs. HUD uses the median income for families in metropolitan and non-metropolitan areas to calculate income limits for eligibility. The median family income calculation is adjusted by household size.

The area median income also reflects the metropolitan area patterns of economic growth.

The proposed resolution - which would require Administration-sponsored or Commission-sponsored legislation, referencing the area median income, to incorporate pertinent income statistics - would enable the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) to review and compare published income limits to determine the number or percentage of constituents eligible for state and federal housing and social programs.

Policy Change and Implication

Historically, legislation before the BCC did not track or report comparative, statistical information on the area median income unless specifically requested by the BCC. If adopted, this resolution would mandate as County policy the incorporation of charts which compare the median household income of the County versus other Florida counties, the state and the nation.
