Subject: Resolution Requesting Addition of Federal Stimulus Project MDAD H024C-1 MIA
Runway 8R-26L Pavement Rehabilitation to Economic Stimulus Plan (ESP)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the accompanying resolution requesting the addition of the Miami International Airport (MIA) Runway 8R-26L Pavement Rehabilitation Project (MDAD Project Number H024C-1 MIA) to the list of approved County Economic Stimulus Plan (ESP) projects and authorize the County Mayor or the Mayor's designee to exercise any and all rights conferred therein. The addition of this project to the County's ESP list will help implement this project faster and meet Federal deadlines by allowing it to benefit from the expedited process currently in place under this program.

Scope

Miami International Airport is located within District 6.

Track Record/Monitor

The Miami-Dade Aviation Department (MDAD) is the user department, and the project manager for the project being added to the list is Pedro Hernandez, Manager of Environmental Engineering. The project manager for the grant is Sunil Harman, Division Director for Aviation Planning.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The funding source for the Runway 8R-26L Pavement Rehabilitation project is a combination of Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Airport Improvement Program (AIP) entitlement funds (\$13,900,000), ARRA funds awarded through the FAA's AIP (\$8,000,000); and Aviation revenue bonds for the balance of the project cost currently estimated at \$29,200,000.

Background


On July 17, 2008, the Board of County Commissioners approved the County's ESP Ordinance along with a corresponding list of projects totaling approximately \$625 million. To date, nearly \$300 million in projects from this original list have been expedited and the ESP Program continues to move projects forward at an accelerated pace. Feedback from the engineering, architecture and construction industries regarding the ESP have been overwhelmingly positive. On February 19, 2009, President Barack Obama signed into law the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (a.k.a. the Federal Stimulus Program).

The Federal Aviation Administration has offered MDAD \$8,000,000 in ARRA funds for this project. MDAD has also chosen to apply its Airport Improvement Program entitlement funds in the amount of \$13,900,000 to this project. The ARRA and entitlement funds comprise approximately a 75% federal share of the estimated \$29,200,000 total cost of the runway rehabilitation project. The balance of the project cost will be funded by Aviation Revenue Bonds unless additional federal funds become available.

The FAA has mandated an aggressive schedule for this project consistent with the requirements of ARRA. In order to accelerate the implementation of this project, we request that this project be added to the County's ESP Program so that it may benefit from the ESP's expedited procurement process to meet Federal deadlines. The accompanying resolution requests the addition of this project to the list of approved County ESP projects.

The Runway 8R/26L Rehabilitation project provides for the pavement rehabilitation for Runway 8R/26L, including adjacent connector taxiways and associated utility adjustments. The scope of work consists of milling one inch of existing asphalt pavement and overlaying the same with three inches of asphalt pavement, overlay of existing shoulders and taxiway connectors, isolated areas of full depth pavement reconstruction, adjustment of existing lighting, upgrade the existing runway and adjacent taxiway centerline lighting system, restoration of existing pavement markings and pavement grooving. The runway rehabilitation project will provide increased reliability and safety to the one of the most vital components of Miami International Airport. Additionally, the project will mitigate recurring pavement maintenance, and thus reduce impacts to the Airside Operations.

It is therefore recommended that the Board approve the attached resolution as it is in the best interest of the County to maximize receipt of ARRA funds for infrastructure projects.

RESOLUTION ADDING MIAMI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT
RUNWAY 8R-26L PAVEMENT REHABILITATION PROJECT
(MDAD PROJECT NUMBER H024C-1 MIA) TO LISTS OF
APPROVED AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT
AND COUNTY ECONOMIC STIMULUS PLAN PROJECTS

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference;

WHEREAS, this Board, on July 17, 2008, approved Resolution No. R-851-08 which established two lists of projects to be expedited under the County's Economic Stimulus Plan; and

WHEREAS, this Board also on July 17, 2008, approved Ordinance 08-92 which established the procedure for expediting projects under the ESP Program; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 08-92 included language specifying that the Board may, from time to time, by subsequent resolution, add or delete projects from the lists of Economic Stimulus Projects to which this section applies,
