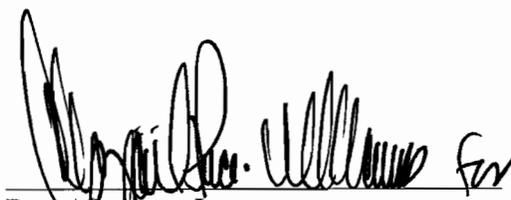

RESOLUTION NO. R-930-09

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY  
MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO PREPARE A PLAN TO ESTABLISH  
THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BANK FUND

**WHEREAS**, some CDBG funded projects are ready to go to construction and need additional funding support while other projects are not ready to go to construction, but have CDBG funds committed; and

**WHEREAS**, there is a need to be able to utilize the committed (granted) CDBG funds for a construction ready project, while providing an available funding guarantee to the project that is not construction ready, and allows its grant funding to be used for the construction ready project; and

**WHEREAS**, general revenue funded projects that are CDBG eligible can use CDBG funds to complete the project and then have the general fund dollars for that CDBG project transferred to a community development bank fund solely for a pool of funding available to provide additional funding to those projects that are still feasible but are not construction ready, and agree to allow their committed or granted funding to be used for a construction ready project with a guarantee that when their project is construction ready, that the project will receive funding either through regular CDBG funds or funds from the community development bank "fund"; and

**WHEREAS**, the establishment of the community development bank "fund" will help the Office of Community and Economic Development (OCED) meet its 1.5 CDBG ratio requirement by enabling OCED to expend its funding in a more efficient and effective manner, by not tying up CDBG funds on projects that are still feasible but not quite construction ready,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA,** that this Board hereby directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to develop a plan to establish a Community Development Bank Fund (the "Fund") and bring the plan back to this Board for approval. In developing the plan, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee shall, at a minimum, address the following:

1. Identify all CDBG-eligible projects that are currently being funded with general fund dollars and identify the amount of general fund dollars in those projects.
2. Prepare a CDBG plan amendment that allocates CDBG funds to the projects identified pursuant to section one above and re-allocates the general fund dollars to the Fund.
3. Prepare guidelines outlining the process for award of funds from the Fund.
4. The plan shall be brought back to this Board for approval within ninety (90) days of this resolution.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Chairman Dennis C. Moss. It was offered by Commissioner **Dorrin D. Rolle**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Dennis C. Moss** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

**Summary**

The resolution directs the County Mayor to prepare a plan to establish a Community Development Bank Fund within 90 days and submit the plan to the Board of County Commissioners.

**Background and Relevant Legislation**

During the May 13, 2009, Housing and Community Development Committee meeting, the Office of Community and Economic Development (OCED) Director explained that the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (US HUD) has raised issues with the Miami-Dade County's (County) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds balance exceeding 1.5 times its annual allocation.

On June 2, 2009, the BCC adopted Resolution 679-09 approving the policies governing the planning process for amendments to the FY 2008-2012 Consolidated Plan through the preparation of the FY 2010 Action Plan. The resolution also approved the use of a request for applications process for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. The cover memorandum to the resolution stated that changes were being recommended to ensure that federal funding allocated to agencies is expended in a timely manner. The memorandum further stated that the County in 2008 had exceeded the expenditure ration requirement with a 1.64 ratio, and as a result received an audit finding from US HUD. For 2009, the County has already received \$17.9 million; therefore the County cannot have a balance of more than \$26.9 million on October 31, 2009. Any balance above \$26 million may be de-obligated and reduced from the County's entitlement. Because of this, the County will allocate funds to projects that have properly leveraged other funding can be completed in a timely manner and will achieve the national objective.

**Policy Change and Implication**

This resolution seeks to assist the County with achieving its 1.5 CDBG ratio requirement by allowing the County Mayor to develop a plan to identify projects that are CDBG-eligible projects that are currently

being funded with general fund dollars that are classified as “construction ready”. Once the projects are identified the County Mayor or his designee will prepare an amendment to the CDBG plan to fund the identified projects with CDBG dollars and re-allocates the general fund to the Community Development Bank Fund.

**Question**

On handwritten page 4 of the resolution, it states that guidelines outlining the process for award of funds from the Fund should be included in the plan; will this require applicants of CDBG awarded projects who have been deemed “feasible, but not ready to move” to participate in a separate process to receive funding from the Community Development Bank Fund?
