



**SUBJECT:** Grant Application and Funding for the Crime Laboratory

### Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board approve the attached resolution, authorizing the application, receipt and expenditure of grant funds from the United States Department of Justice grant programs for projects identified for the Crime Laboratory as funds become available.

### Scope

The grants will provide countywide services.

### Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The County will receive federal funds to enhance and improve the operations of the Crime Laboratory and the discipline of forensic science. These grant funds do not require local matching dollars.


### Track Record/Monitor

The grants will be administered and monitored by the Miami-Dade Police Department.

### Background

The Miami-Dade Police Department (MDPD) Crime Laboratory is the only public crime laboratory in Miami-Dade County. The mission of the laboratory is to provide scientific and technical support to the law enforcement community and to provide forensic services to the greater unincorporated Dade County area and 35 incorporated municipalities. The MDPD Crime Laboratory assists in investigations throughout Miami-Dade County through the use of specialized personnel, equipment, materials, and training to effectively provide forensic services.

Various federal programs assist in meeting crime laboratory needs by providing funding for personnel, instrumentation, supplies, training as well as specialized projects. To date, these programs have provided more than \$5 million for investment in the Crime Laboratory. With the support of the federal programs combined with County support, the MDPD Crime Laboratory has made more DNA hits than any other single laboratory in the state of Florida; with regard to ballistics, the U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives ranked this laboratory as number 1 in 2008 for the most hits made in the nation. These results are possible with the help of these programs which enhance and improve the Crime Laboratory as a state of the art facility. Should it be granted, this authorization will expedite and streamline the grant process and avail the County of additional funding opportunities for critical crime laboratory needs.



RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE'S ACTION TO APPLY FOR, RECEIVE, AND EXPEND GRANT FUNDS FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE FOR PROJECTS IDENTIFIED FOR THE CRIME LABORATORY OF THE MIAMI-DADE POLICE DEPARTMENT AS FUNDS BECOME AVAILABLE FOR WHICH LOCAL MATCH DOLLARS ARE NOT REQUIRED AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO EXERCISE AND EXECUTE SUCH CONTRACTS, AGREEMENTS, MEMORANDA OF UNDERSTANDING, MODIFY OR AMEND THE APPLICATION IN ORDER TO RECEIVE ADDITIONAL FUNDS OR TO EXTEND THE PERFORMANCE PERIOD AS REQUIRED IF AWARDED

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board approves the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee's action to apply for, receive, and expend grant funds from the U.S. Department of Justice for projects identified for the Crime Laboratory of the Miami-Dade Police Department as funds become available and for which local match dollars are not required, and authorizes the County Mayor and/or County Mayor designee to receive and expend grant funds, execute such contracts, agreements, Memoranda of Understanding (MOU), and amendments as required by grant guidelines or to further the purposes described in the funding requests following approval by the County Attorney's Office; to expend any and all monies received for the purposes described in the funding request; to apply for, receive and expend future additional funds should they become available through the grant programs; to file and execute any necessary amendments to the application for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County, Florida; and to exercise and execute any amendments, modifications, renewal and
