

Background

Section 2-8.4 of the Code governs protests made by participants in competitive processes for the selection of vendors to construct public improvements, to provide supplies, materials or services, or to lease County property. In accordance with the Code, the proposed Implementing Order amendment revises current procedures to discontinue posting informal award recommendations in the Stephen P. Clark Center lobby. "Informal" contracts involve the expenditure of over \$25,000 up to \$250,000. Sealed bids are not required for these purchases.

Posting award recommendations for these purchases in the Stephen P. Clark Center lobby is no longer an effective way of communicating with vendors. All contracts awarded by the Department of Procurement Management are posted on-line.

This procedure allows for expedited contract awards and provides vendors easy access to contract awards without the need to come downtown.

BID PROTEST PROCEDURES

AUTHORITY:

Section 4.02 of the Miami-Dade County Home Rule Amendment and Charter and Section 2-8.4 of the Code of Miami-Dade County.

SUPERSEDES:

This Implementing Order supersedes previous Administrative Order No. 3-21, ordered ~~January 20, 2005~~ May 6, 2008 and effective ~~January 30, 2005~~ May 16, 2008.

Section III of Implementing Order 3021, Bid Protest Procedures, is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION III

“INFORMAL” BID PROTESTS: CONTRACTS AND PURCHASES INVOLVING THE EXPENDITURE OF OVER \$25,000 UP TO \$250,000

POSTING AWARD RECOMMENDATIONS

~~Award recommendations for contracts and purchases involving the expenditure of over \$25,000 up to and including \$250,000 shall be posted in the lobby of the Stephen P. Clark Center, 111 NW 1st Street, Miami, FL 33128 on the Department of Procurement Management website. Such recommendation shall be in writing and shall identify the bidder or proposer to whom the award is being recommended and the basis therefore.~~
