This substitute item differs from the original in that the contract measures for Items 1.3 and 1.4 have been amended to omit the word "Community"; the change is reflected on page two of the memorandum. The date field in Item 1.1 now reflects November 4, 2009. Item 3.2 of the original package has been removed and the subsequent items in that section were renumbered. The word "allocated" has been replaced with the word "allocation" in the last sentence of the "Reason for Change" in Item 3.3.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve the attached award of competitive contracts, rejection of bids, and contract modifications with authority to exercise options-to-renew.

Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on past utilization. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments and/or agencies.

Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying Award of Competitive Contracts Package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the Award of Competitive Contracts Package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the Award of Competitive Contracts Package.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, in their discretion, subsequent options-to-renew (OTR) and extend contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of the each contract.

Background

Section 1 AWARD OF COMPETITIVE BIDS

The contracts listed in this section are being recommended for award to the lowest priced, responsive, responsible bidder(s) who met the bid specifications in accordance with established policies and procedures.

Item 1.1: Purchase of Window/Wall Mount Air Conditioning Units is to award this contract to purchase window and wall mount air conditioning units for various County departments. The amount being requested is **\$207,750**. If the County chooses to exercise the five one-year OTR periods, the cumulative value will be **\$1,246,500**.

Note: The vendors not recommended for award section is amended to reflect one vendor: A & B Hardware, Inc.

Item 1.2: PC Parts, Peripherals, and Maintenance Services (Pre-qualification) is to award this contract to purchase PC parts, peripherals, and maintenance services for various County departments. The amount being requested is **\$4,200,000**. If the County chooses to exercise the two three-year OTR periods, the cumulative value will be **\$12,600,000**.

Item 1.3: Groceries is to award this contract to purchase groceries for various County departments. The amount being requested is **\$11,530,000** for one five-year term.

Note: The contract measure has been amended to remove the word Community. The Park & Recreation contract manager has been revised to Carol Kruse.

Item 1.4: Meat, Poultry, Dairy and Frozen Foods is to award this contract to purchase meat, poultry, dairy, and frozen foods for various County departments. The amount being requested is **\$15,498,000** for one five-year term.

Note: The contract measure has been amended to remove the word Community. The funding source for the Department of Human Services has been amended to reflect Federal Fund, State Funds and General Fund. The Park & Recreation contract manager has been revised to Carol Kruse.

Item 1.5: Tire Retreading and Section Repair is to award this contract to purchase tire retreading and repair services for the General Services Administration Department. The amount being requested is **\$1,465,000**. If the County chooses to exercise the four one-year OTR periods, the cumulative value will be **\$7,325,000**.

Section 2 REJECTED BIDS

A bid may be rejected when adverse conditions exist such as the proposal not conforming to the specifications and/or solicitation documents, insufficient financial

resources, technical ability, physical capacity and/or skill of the vendor, unfair and unreasonable pricing, insufficient competition and for any other cause in the best interest of the County:

Item 2.1: Cremation Services for Miami-Dade County is to reject all bids received in response to a solicitation to establish a contract to purchase cremation services for the Medical Examiner Department.

Section 3 COMPETITIVE CONTRACT MODIFICATIONS

A competitive contract modification is an award of a supplemental allocation for goods or services within the scope of the original contract award.

Item 3.1: Telecommunications Services Pool is to modify this contract for additional time and spending authority for the Enterprise Technology Services and Miami-Dade Fire Rescue departments to continue to purchase telecommunications network infrastructure support. The additional amount being requested is **\$850,000**.

Item 3.2: Law Enforcement Equipment and Supplies is to modify this contract for additional spending authority to allow the Miami-Dade Police Department to purchase law enforcement equipment and supplies. The additional amount being requested is **\$860,000**.

Item 3.3: Audio Visual Equipment & Supplies (Pre-qualification) is to modify this contract for additional spending authority and approval to use Transit Operating funds to allow the Miami-Dade Transit Department to purchase security and infrastructure upgrades. The additional amount being requested is **\$2,873,000**.

Item 3.4: Landscaping and Lawn Maintenance Services is to obtain approval for use of Transit Operating funds to allow the Miami-Dade Transit Department to continue to purchase landscaping and lawn maintenance services. No additional allocation is required.

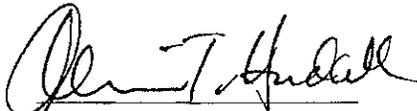
Item 3.5: Parking and Revenue Control is to modify this contract for additional spending authority to allow the Seaport Department to purchase computers, ticket splitters, gate pedestals/arms, pay-on-foot-stations, fiber optic communications, and professional services. The additional amount being requested is **\$1,082,000**.

BACKGROUND

This contract provides for purchase of energy efficient window/wall mount air conditioning units for several County departments. These units are labeled with Energy Efficient Ratings (EER) only. Energy efficient units use at least 10% less energy than conventional models. EER is measured on a scale from 1 through 13. All models being purchased have an EER rating ranging from 9 and 12. Window/wall mount or room air conditioners are labeled with EER ratings only. The Federal minimum efficiency rating varies by cooling capacity. The higher the EER rating, the more efficient the air conditioner unit.

The Water and Sewer Department uses these units to control climate in areas where electrical and electronic infrastructure equipment is located. The department operates over 1,000 sewer pumping station structures, 100 water drawing well sites and six treatment plants. All have multiple control rooms that are segregated from the main climate controlled areas and require dedicated air conditioning units.

The Miami-Dade Public Housing Agency manages approximately 9,000 public housing units with numerous types of window/wall mount air conditioning units.

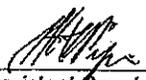
BACKGROUND

This contract will allow the County to purchase replacement PC parts, peripherals, and repair services. These include but are not limited to: optical drives, external hard drives, memory, USB flash drives, keyboards, mice, printers, sound cards, and related devices and components. The contract will be used by the Enterprise Technology Services, Miami-Dade Aviation, Miami-Dade Fire Rescue, and Miami-Dade Police departments. These departments have provided projected allocations necessary to meet their operational needs. A short term bridge contract was established for a six month term to provide continuity of services until the replacement contract is approved.

The County intends to award the contract to all responsive, responsible bidders who meet the minimum qualifications established in the solicitation for two groups:

Group 1: **PC Parts and Peripherals:** Vendors awarded in this group will be eligible to participate in future spot market quotes for storage devices, optical devices, input devices, output devices, and communication devices.

Group 2: **Maintenance and Repair Services:** Vendors awarded in this group will be eligible to participate in future spot market quotes for the repair of PCs, laptops, plotters, printers, and other peripherals at the vendor's service facility.

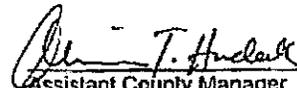

BACKGROUND

This pre-qualification contract allows all qualified bidders to participate in quarterly spot market purchases. This periodic competition yields the best current prices for groceries. Additional qualified vendors may be added at any time during the contract term further enhancing competition. The Corrections and Rehabilitation Department is the largest user serving food to approximately 6,300 inmates per day in four facilities.

The Miami-Dade Fire and Rescue Department will use the funds to purchase food for the cafeteria at Headquarters for resale. 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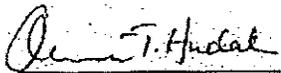

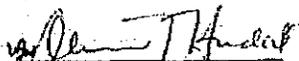

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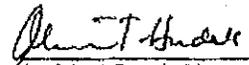

REASON FOR CHANGE
