RESOLUTION NO. R-311-10

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO
PASS SB 602 AND HB 207 OR SIMILAR LEGISLATION
EXPANDING THE REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLIC
NOTIFICATION OF THE DISCOVERY OF
ENVIRONMENTAL CONTAMINATION

WHEREAS, in 2005, the Florida Legislature determined that it is important to notify parties potentially affected by environmental contamination as soon as such contamination is discovered to be beyond property boundaries, rather than to wait until a cleanup plan was underway; and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned notification is limited to specific properties from which samples are actually collected and analyzed in a laboratory; and

WHEREAS, some individuals who may be affected by contamination may not be notified of the presence of contamination, particularly if not all parcels in the vicinity of a contaminated site are tested; and

WHEREAS, among other things, SB 607 and HB 207 expand the requirements for public notification of the discovery of environmental contamination to include property owners, presidents of any condominium associations or sole owners of condominium and lessees and tenants of record in the vicinity; and

WHEREAS, SB 607 and HB 207 also expand the public notification requirement to include certain local officials representing the affected area and the elected state and federal officials representing the area,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature to pass SB 602 and HB 207 or similar legislation expanding the public notification requirement in connection with the discovery of environmental contamination.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of this resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the issue identified in Section 1 above, and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item in the 2010 state legislative package.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner **Barbara J. Jordan**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Audrey M. Edmonson** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
