Subject: Resolution Authorizing Award of Competitive Contracts

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve the attached award of competitive contracts, rejection of bids, and contract modifications with authority to exercise options-to-renew.

Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on past utilization. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments and/or agencies.

Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying Award of Competitive Contracts Package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board. Allocations have been rounded consistent with standard auditing practices.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the Award of Competitive Contracts Package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the Award of Competitive Contracts Package.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, in their discretion, subsequent options-to-renew (OTR) and extend contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of the each contract.

Background

Section 1 AWARD OF COMPETITIVE BIDS

The contracts listed in this section are being recommended for award to the responsive, responsible bidder(s) who met the requirements of the respective solicitation.

Item 1.1: Purchase of Recycling Services for White Goods is to award this contract for the sale of recyclable materials by the Department of Solid Waste Management. This is a revenue generating contract. The anticipated **revenue** to the County is **\$2,000,000**. No allocation is required.

Note: Local Preference language is amended to 'The Local Preference applies to spot market quotes in accordance with the Ordinance.'

Item 1.2: Annual Roadside Tractor Mowing Service is to award this contract for annual roadside tractor mowing services for the Public Works Department. The amount being requested is **\$1,050,000**. If the County chooses to exercise the four, one-year OTR periods, the cumulative value will be **\$5,250,000**.

Item 1.3: Elevator Maintenance Services and Modernization of Elevator Equipment for Various Miami-Dade County Departments is to award this contract for elevator maintenance services and modernization of elevator equipment for various County departments. The amount being requested is **\$3,474,000**. If the County chooses to exercise the five, one-year OTR periods, the cumulative value will be **\$6,376,000**.

Item 1.4: Safety Shoes and Boots for Miami-Dade County is to award this contract for safety shoes and boots for various County departments. The amount being requested is **\$4,490,000**.

Section 2 REJECTED BIDS

A bid may be rejected when adverse conditions exist such as the proposal not conforming to the specifications and/or solicitation documents, insufficient financial resources, technical ability, physical capacity and/or skill of the vendor, unfair and unreasonable pricing, insufficient competition and for any other cause in the best interest of the County.

There are no items for this section.

Section 3 COMPETITIVE CONTRACT MODIFICATIONS

A competitive contract modification is an award of a supplemental allocation for goods or services within the scope of the original contract award.

Item 3.1: Pharmaceutical Supplies is to modify this contract for additional spending authority to allow the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department to continue to purchase pharmaceutical supplies. The additional amount being requested is **\$1,170,000**.

Item 3.2: ID Cards Supplies and Accessories is to modify this contract to add an allocation funded by MDT Operating fund for ID cards and supplies. The additional amount being requested is **\$10,000**.

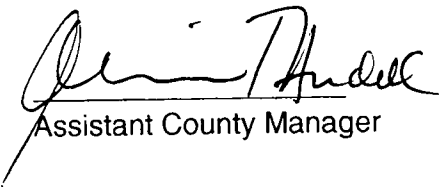
Item 3.3: Refurbishing of Passenger Loading Bridges is to modify this contract for additional spending authority to allow the Miami-Dade Aviation Department to continue to refurbish passenger loading bridges. The additional amount being requested is **\$610,000**.

Item 3.4: Electrical Power Systems Installation, Pre-qualification is to modify this contract for additional spending authority to allow the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department to service its electrical power grid systems and infrastructure components. The additional amount being requested is **\$14,760,000**.

This contract provides tractor mowing services, landscaping and litter removal for County owned lots and motorist safety shoulders adjacent to roadways. The contract is divided into seven geographical zones. The services for each zone are broken down into six categories: mowing, mowing with litter collection, mowing areas with trees, mowing lots with trees, roadside litter removal, and selective clearing and grubbing (removal of vegetation and tree stumps). A reduction of cycles from eighteen to nine, including the number of acreage and lot/sites is based on budgetary constraints, and reduction in services. This has decreased the overall contract amount from the previous contract term.

BACKGROUND

The purpose of this solicitation is to establish a contract for purchase of elevator maintenance services for six county departments and planned modernization of elevator equipment for specific sites at Aviation, General Services Administration and Library departments. The contract is divided into groups by departments as follows: Group 1 - Miami-Dade Aviation Department; Group 2 - General Services Administration (GSA); Group 3 - Miami-Dade Public Housing Agency; Group 4 - Miami-Dade Police Department; Group 5 - Miami-Dade Public Library; and Group 6 - Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department. Group 7 establishes a pool of vendors to perform future modernization of elevator equipment for all County departments using work order competitions.

The scope of this contract includes modernization work, in addition to maintenance, parts, components and emergency services. The contract also includes the purchase of several elevator components such as infrared door detectors, as well as features required for Americans with Disability Act compliance. These features include car operating panels, hall and signals fixtures, close circuit television compatible infrastructure, universal firefighter service access key, remote elevator monitoring, and compliant telephone installation.

The proposed allocation for the initial five-year period is \$3,474,000. This allocation includes monthly maintenance, replacement parts, components, and emergency services for Groups 1 through 6, and modernization of seven elevators for Group 1, Group 2 and Group 6. This allocation also includes contingency funds for modernization.

The proposed allocation requested for years six through ten is attached. This allocation includes elevator maintenance services, funds for replacement parts, components, and emergencies. In addition, year six includes an allocation to purchase two spare replacement belts for the Westmont moving walks at Miami International Airport.

If awarded, the proposed pricing will save Miami-Dade County 12.33% (approx. \$287,000) over current pricing for elevator maintenance work during the initial five year period.

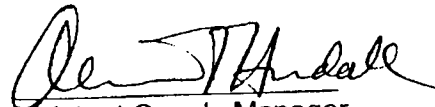

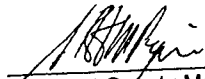

Your have asked this office if the bid of Stone Group Enterprises, Inc. ("Stone Group") is non-responsive for two issues: (1) Stone Group's qualification to add shipping costs for orders under \$1500.00; and (2) Stone Group's failure to acknowledge receipt of bid addendums one and two.

FACTS

We rely on the information provided in your e-mails regarding this subject, several meetings and the terms of the ITB itself. The purpose of the ITB is to establish a contract for the purchase of Safety Shoes and Boots to meet County needs on an as needed when needed basis. Generally, responsible bidders who offer the highest percentage discount off the manufacturers' latest price list or catalog of brands disclosed in the solicitation are awarded.

The ITB's delivery terms provide that "[u]nless otherwise specified in the Bid Solicitation, prices quoted shall be F.O.B. Destination. Freight shall be included in the proposed price." See Section 1 ¶ 1.17 of General Terms and Conditions. Stone Group's bid included notations regarding shipping costs. Specifically, Stone Group's bid provides for "FREE SHIPPING" for orders "over \$1500." Conversely, in a note in its bid Stone group also provides that "ADD SHIPPING COST FOR ORDER UNDER \$1500.00 @ \$10.00 PER UNIT."

Stone Group did not acknowledge receipt of Addendum No. 1 which amended the terms of the Small Business Enterprise (SBE) bid preference and Addendum No. 2 which replaced the bid signature sheet with a new bid signature sheet that some additional form language.

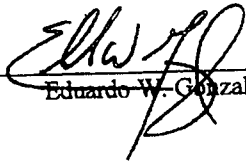
DISCUSSION

Based on the facts set forth above, the bid is nonresponsive. The bid is nonresponsive due to the bidder's conditions relating to shipping costs for orders under \$1500.00.¹ In general, a bid may be rejected or disregarded if there is a material variance between the proposal and the advertisement. A minor variance, however, will not invalidate the proposal. See Robinson Elec. Co. v. Dade County, 417 So. 2d 1032, 1034 (Fla. 3d DCA 1982).

Here the variance is material because it materially alters the price of orders under \$1500.00 by including a \$10.00 per unit cost for shipping costs. The condition also conflicts with the terms of the solicitation which provides that freight shall be included in the proposed price. The condition also undermines the common standard of competition. Stone Group's bid cannot be compared against

vendors' bids who simply submitted a percentage discount off of manufacturers' price lists without including conditions on smaller orders and shipping costs.

Your have asked this office if the bid of Aramark Uniform & Career Apparel LLC ("Aramark") is non-responsive because of Aramark's submission of an unsigned addendum with its bid that proposes revisions to the indemnification and insurance terms of the solicitation. For the reasons set forth below, it is our opinion that the inclusion of a proposed addendum does not render the bid nonresponsive.

FACTS

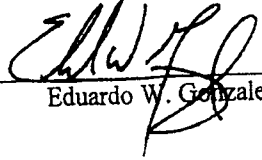
We rely on the information provided in your e-mails regarding this subject, several meetings regarding the solicitation, the terms of the ITB itself and Aramark's bid submission. The purpose of the ITB is to establish a contract for the purchase of Safety Shoes and Boots to meet County needs on an as needed when needed basis. Generally, responsible bidders who offer the highest percentage discount off the manufacturers' latest price list or catalog of brands disclosed in the solicitation are awarded.

In its bid Aramark submitted a document entitled "ADDENDUM TO INVITATION TO BID" which proposes revisions to the indemnification and insurance terms of the solicitation. The addendum includes signature lines for Miami-Dade County and Aramark. Aramark did not sign the addendum. Nowhere in its bid does Aramark explicitly object or take exceptions to any terms of the solicitation, including the indemnification and insurance terms. Nor does Aramark condition its bid on the acceptance of the addendum.

DISCUSSION

Based on the facts set forth above, Aramark's submission of a proposed addendum does *not* render Aramark's bid nonresponsive. In general, a bid may be rejected or disregarded if there is a material variance between the proposal and the advertisement. A minor variance, however, will not invalidate the proposal. See Robinson Elec. Co. v. Dade County, 417 So. 2d 1032, 1034 (Fla. 3d DCA 1982).

Here, there is no variance. Aramark does not condition its bid on the parties' approval of the addendum. Aramark does not object or take exception to any of the terms of the solicitation including the indemnification and insurance terms. The addendum is nothing more than a proposed modification to the terms of the contract – permissible under Paragraph 1.21 of the General Terms and Conditions of the solicitation – which the County may reject or approve after award of the contract.

This contract was established by the Minnesota Multi-State Contract Alliance for Pharmacy (MMCAP). MMCAP is a group purchasing organization comprised of 48 national government agencies, including the State of Florida, with a combined purchasing power over \$1.2 billion. The contract was established through an open competitive Request for Proposal process with final prices negotiated by the State of Minnesota.

The County accessed the MMCAP's pharmaceutical contract in January 2007. The contract was set to expire on December 31, 2009. Due to delays in negotiations between the State of Minnesota and Cardinal Health 110, Inc., the successor contract was not awarded until December 3, 2009. This created a compressed timeframe to formally present the contract to the Board for approval. The contract was accessed under the County Manager's delegated authority to expedite award and avoid service disruption of life-saving pharmaceutical supplies.

Miami-Dade Fire Rescue (Fire Rescue) Department projects \$75,900 in monthly expenditures. Based on projections, Fire Rescue requires a total allocation of \$1,670,000 for the initial 22 month contract term. The \$1,170,000 being requested ensures the department has the full allocation it requires for the term of the contract.

Market research was conducted to explore collaborative opportunities with Jackson Memorial Hospital (JMH) to purchase pharmaceutical supplies. The review concluded that the County cannot access contract pricing obtained by JMH. The pricing JMH receives is offered only to academic medical centers and affiliated hospitals through University Hospital Coalition membership.

REASON FOR CHANGE

This contract established a pool of pre-qualified vendors who are invited to participate in competitive spot market quotations to provide the County pricing for goods and services. Vendors meeting the criteria outlined in the solicitation may join at any time during the term of the contract.

The Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) is tasked with properly operating and maintaining the County's water and wastewater treatment systems. The associated electrical power grid systems and infrastructure components aid in avoiding wastewater backups, overflows and boil water advisories.

WASD needs to increase it's current allocation to upgrade and provide service to the existing electrical power grid systems and infrastructure components. Proposed projects include but are not limited to upgrading electrical equipment for three wastewater pump stations and replacing electrical switchgears for high service pumps at the Alexander Orr and the John Preston Water Treatment Plants; replacing electrical transformers located in ten raw water wells at the Northwest WellField; and replacing the magnetic variable speed drive systems and the slip recovery drive systems for six effluent pump stations located at the South District Wastewater Treatment Plant. Many of these electrical infrastructure components have reached or exceeded their usable life. Upgrading the existing electrical power grid systems and replacing infrastructure components will bring the equipment to normal operational capacity increasing service reliability.

Policy Change and Implication / Budgetary Impact

- **Four (4) Competitive Contracts:**

Item 1.1 – Purchase of Recycling Services for White Goods

This contract allows Namco Metals Management Inc. and Nationwide Metals Recycling & Processing, Inc. to purchase recyclable materials from the Department of Solid Waste Management (DSWM). Examples of white goods include but are not limited to large appliances such as refrigerators, air conditioning units, washers, hot water heaters and dryers. **This is a revenue generating contract; therefore, no County funds are expended.**

Questions / Comments

This contract is estimated to generate \$150,000 per year more than the previous contract.

Item 1.2 – Annual Roadside Tractor Mowing Services

This contract provides annual roadside tractor mowing service for the Public Works Department (PWD). The cumulative contract total, including subsequent options to renew (OTRs) is \$5,250,000.

Questions / Comments

According to the County Manager's memo, this item not only reduces the number of cycles by half from eighteen (18) to nine (9), but also the number of acreage and lot/sites served due to budgetary constraints. **This reduction is reflected in the contract amount which is 59% less per year than the previous contract.**

Questions / Comments

This contract includes a change from the scope under the original contract. The proposed contract includes elevator modernization for Miami-Dade Public Housing and Miami-Dade Public Library. In spite of the increase in scope, the proposed contract provides a savings to the County over the previous contract (see below).
