RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE CITY OF SWEETWATER'S REQUEST TO FEMA FOR FEMA FLOOD INSURANCE MAP AMENDMENTS FOR CITY OF SWEETWATER

WHEREAS, certain properties in the City of Sweetwater in District Twelve have been classified as special hazard flood zones by FEMA; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sweetwater has requested from FEMA a change in these classifications to lesser risk flood zone classifications; and

WHEREAS, expeditious review and approval by FEMA of the requested changes may result in lower flood insurance premiums for these properties in the City of Sweetwater; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sweetwater has implemented and is implementing storm water infrastructure improvements which will help to mitigate future flooding of properties in the City,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

<u>Section 1</u>. Urges FEMA to expeditiously review and approve the requested changes by the City of Sweetwater to the FEMA Flood Insurance Maps within the City of Sweetwater.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security, the Administrator of FEMA, and the members of the Miami-Dade Congressional Delegation.
